

County Jail Inmates Subjected To Psychiatric Neglect & Forced Drugging

Even as questions were emerging about the psychological abuse of prisoners within San Bernardino County's jails, the San Bernardino County Board of Supervisors last month increased by \$14.2 million the contract the Liberty Healthcare Corporation will receive for providing mental health services in the county's deten-

tion facilities.

The increase was

made despite recurrent reports of inadequate care being provided to county inmates with mental issues, evaluations that conform with the interests of the county's jailors rather than the inmates in need of psychological or psychiatric care and suggestions of kickbacks to county sheriff's personnel and county officials in exchange for sustain-

ing what has now become for Liberty a highly lucrative contractual arrangement.

San Bernardino County and its sheriff's department originally contracted with Liberty Healthcare while Orange County-based psychiatrist Thomas C. Lester M.D., who was then doing business as Liberty Healthcare of California, Inc., held the profession-

al license under which those psychiatric services were provided. Lester, however, has ended his relationship with Liberty Healthcare for reasons that have not been made publicly clear. His successor at Liberty is not a psychiatrist but rather a licensed clinical social worker.

Opposing Perspectives Articulated With Regard To SB Charter Change Initiative

In 1905, the City of San Bernardino put its municipal charter into place. Various descriptions as an operational blueprint or a constitution, the San Bernardino Charter is a 48-page document which provides the framework for municipal governance, delineating city officials and departments and their respective and

articulating lines of authority and responsibility, as well as the limitations and restrictions under which they must function.

In many respects, San Bernardino is similar to other municipalities in that it has a mayor, city council, city clerk, city attorney, city treasurer and a bevy of departments, such as the police

department, fire department, water department and city engineer's office. It is in terms of how the responsibilities and authorities are distributed and shared among the city's ruling elite that distinguishes San Bernardino from most other cities in California.

For example, in most cities, the mayor and city council wield political

power but are insulated from the responsibility of actually managing the city on a day-to-day basis. In most cities, it is the city manager who has the ultimate managerial responsibility and he delegates to a series of department heads – the police chief, the fire chief, the city engineer, the planning director, the finance director, etc.

In most cities, the mayor is the most powerful political entity on the city council, presiding over the city council meetings, controlling the ebb and flow of council discussion and debate, sometimes having control or influence over the agenda of what is to be discussed and See P 7

The Fire That Didn't Happen

DEVORE—Not quite three weeks after the devastating Blue Cut Fire scorched more than 37,020 acres and resulted in 82,000 residents being evacuated from, or prevented from returning to, their homes, what may have been another inferno in the environs of Cajon Pass appears to have been averted with the arrest last Saturday of a convicted arsonist seemingly intent on touching off similar destruction.

At 9:23 a.m. on September 3, a report of a parked vehicle trespassing on Union Pacific Railroad property near North Cajon Boulevard and Cleghorn Road came in to railroad officials. Union Pacific police were dispatched to the scene, where they encountered Larry Misirilian, of Ontario, parked, authorities said, about ten feet from "a large dry unburned area where the Blue Cut Fire had not See P 2

Colton Council Hopefuls Chastain, Mitchell & Zamora Seeking The Future In The Past

Six years after the game-changing 2010 Colton Municipal Election and two years on from the wholesale changing of the political guard in the Hub City, a move is afoot that would return to office three former elected officials and potentially reestablish a reasonable facsimile of a ruling coalition with a different vision for the city than those now in charge.

Vying to make what only a short time ago seemed to be an improbable political comeback are former mayors Kelly Chastain, Sarah Zamora and former councilman John Mitchell.

Kelly Chastain was first elected to the city council as Third District councilwoman in 1996 when she ran at the urging of councilwoman Deirdre Bennett, turning out longtime serv-

ing but scandal-plagued Abe Beltran. Almost immediately upon being elected, she formed an alliance with Bennett. A decade later Chastain would run against Bennett and accede to the position of mayor, ruling the roost for four years until she was ignominiously turned out of office as the consequence of the brief political ascendancy of David Zamora.

Indications Mounting Historic Downtown Needles Fire Station Will Go To Pot

Fire Station #31 at 633 Front Street in historic downtown Needles, built in 1959 during the heyday years of Route 66, may now become the headquarters of the newest pot "grow-op" in the county. That Rick Daniels, City of Needles manager, is seeking to have the council declare the firehouse property as surplus and put it up for sale was learned at the

Needles City Council meeting on August 23. David Buckley, who has previously demonstrated a prescience relating to Needles municipal issues, reported the new development, also stating that at least one of the existing marijuana cooperatives in the community is interested in it. Daniels informed the *Sentinel* that there have been "verbal inquiries"

with regard to the disposition of the fire house besides that of the "Needles Fire Auxiliary" but did not respond to the request for disclosure as to who that other interested party is.

Daniels stated that "When the San Bernardino County Fire District moves into the new Fire Station #32 on Highway 95 South sometime between October and

December of this year, the building [Fire Station #31] and property will be considered as surplus to the needs of the city. At that point the Council will have the policy choice as to its future use or disposition. There is no readily apparent use for city purposes, therefore it could be offered to public or private parties for sale or lease... State law requires that the of-

fer must occur through a competitive process available to any and all parties so interested. The city has received expressions of interest by parties other than the auxiliary... The council could choose to pay ongoing maintenance costs on the building and choose not to use it or let others rehabilitate it and use the property for a community beneficial See P 2

FUSD Student Test Scores Improving

FONTANA—An increasing number of Fontana Unified School District students met or exceeded standards on California's Smarter Balanced tests for English language arts (ELA) and mathematics, according to district officials and data released Wednesday by the state Department of Education.

The data from the second-year, computer-based tests – administered to students in grades three through eight, and grade 11 – show progress in student performance and achievement levels on the more rigorous California Standards, which are in their third year of implementation and challenge students to apply the knowledge and skills they are learning in the classroom to real-world problems.

The 2016 state test scores show that FUSD students improved their mathematics and English language arts/literacy performance over last year, with students meeting or exceeding state standards rising to 33 from 28 percent in ELA and to 19 percent from 17 percent in mathematics.

"We are seeing growth in student achievement levels across the board and are incredibly proud of the hard work our teachers and staff have put forward to ensure our students are receiving a high-quality education that will transfer to the real world," Fontana Unified Board President Lorena Corona said. "While we know there are areas in which we can improve, our District is confident that the positive gains this year are a reflection of what's to come."

use.” The news of the sale of Firehouse #31 came as a disappointment to the Needles Fire Auxiliary, which had sent a letter to the city on July 19, 2016 requesting to lease the old station after the county fire district moves into its new facility at the East Broadway exit of the I-40. The letter states: “Our not-for-profit local organization seeks to preserve the future viability of a locally controlled, city fire management and protection department. Our current objective now is to secure the return of all facilities and equipment that was transferred to the County Fire District as a part of the city’s action to annex its territory into a county controlled and taxed fire district... In preparation for the return of our city Fire Department, our Fire Auxiliary intends to use the fire house for fire prevention and management

training purposes, contemplatively in conjunction with Palo Verde College. We also intend to acquire, and store at the fire house, the necessary equipment needed to operate a fire department. We will use the office to begin establishing relations with professionals who are interested in hiring on once the voter initiative passes and the county annexation is dissolved.” The letter was signed by Needles Fire Auxiliary Administrator Ruth Musser-Lopez.

Fire Station #32, built by the County of San Bernardino at a cost of about \$3.5 million, is billed as “state of the art” with separate dormitory rooms, a “fitness room” and a Plymvent exhaust system to remove airborne engine exhaust toxins. The operation will include a new three-person paramedic unit housed at the new station.

Daniels informed the *Sentinel* that after review by his staff and the city’s finance director, “I will place the item on the next council agenda (Septem-

ber 13). Shortly thereafter, the site’s availability will be published. After a reasonable amount of time such as 30 days, the city staff will receive proposals and take them to the city council for their determination.”

While a groundbreaking is scheduled to take place on October 31, the new county fire station has yet to be completed and the county fire department crew has not yet vacated the city’s Firehouse #31, but Daniels appears to be moving quickly on the matter before the November election, when three of the six council seats are up for grabs as well as the county supervisor’s position. Supervisor Robert Lovingood who is credited with the project is anticipated to be at the groundbreaking.

“There is no intent to create any roadblock to the public. Local control of the fire protection services is the voter’s prerogative as specified in state and local law, and if they wish to exercise it beyond actions of the city council everything

will be done to honor that desire. The ongoing maintenance of a building in serious need of major repairs is a separate matter,” Rick Daniels said.

Fire Auxiliary Administrator Ruth Musser-Lopez opined. “We are trying to preserve the department’s infrastructure to maintain it while the matter of reestablishing a local fire department is voted on by the people and resolved. We have already secured the right to purchase our fire truck and equipment back from the county. Our request to lease the fire house from the city for \$1.00 a month, as the city has charged the county all of these years, never made it to the council’s agenda. I told Rick that declaring it surplus was not good long term planning and it certainly ignores the fact of the people’s will to return our fire department. We could get an injunction against this ill-conceived idea to sell our historic firehouse when

burned.”

Railroad officers tentatively observed in the vehicle flammable materials that appeared to be at the ready for ignition in a vulnerable spot. Upon identifying Missirilian, the railroad police determined he was on active parole and an arson registrant. One of the railroad officers contacted the San Ber-

nardino County Sheriff’s Department, which dispatched deputy L. Sandoval to the scene.

Together, the railroad police and Sandoval “conducted a vehicle search and discovered Missirilian had a 5-gallon can of gasoline, large butane torches, lighter fluid, and new cigarette lighters underneath the driver’s seat,” sheriff’s officials said in a statement Sunday. “The items appeared to be set ready for immediate use.”

Missirilian, 61, was arrested for arson and violation of his parole terms. He was booked at West Valley Detention Center.

Missirilian’s arrest came slightly less than a month after the Pilot Fire, which began on August 7 and burned more than 8,000 acres in the San Bernardino Mountains and Summit Valley until August 15, and the far more devastating Blue Cut Fire which began on August 16 and raged out of control until August 22, at which point firefighters had beaten it back to 89% containment, and then fully extinguished it the following day.

At this point it is not known whether Missirilian had a hand in touching off either the Blue Cut or Pilot conflagrations.

Some twelve hours after Missirilian was taken into custody, another fire, referred to as the Ken Fire, began further south down the I-15 corridor near Kenwood Avenue.

the county for the pass-through of psychiatric evaluation services to jurisdictions throughout the state has blinded county officials to how indigenous county inmates in the sheriff's jail system are having their psychiatric needs neglected or are the victims of both physical and psychological abuse by their jailers that is being ignored by the mental health professionals Liberty employs. In some cases it is apparent that the mental health professionals employed by Liberty have allowed their function to be compromised such that they have allowed their authority to dispense psychoactive drugs to become a tool in the panoply of methods used by deputies working the jails to perpetuate the abuse of the inmates.

The matter is exacerbated by the consideration that the county's soon-to-be-departing director of behavioral health has failed to exercise any oversight of

the mental health treatment of San Bernardino County citizens housed in the sheriff's jails and detention facilities.

When Lester and Liberty first obtained what was a relatively modest contract with the County of San Bernardino in 2010 under the auspices of an experimental "pilot program," competitive bids were bypassed. Subsequently, that contract was renewed without any competitive bidding, and the pilot program has now become an institution at the West Valley Detention Center in Rancho Cucamonga.

While the first contract Lester's company landed with the county for the three-year period between July 1, 2010 to June 30, 2013 specified a not-to-exceed \$499,977 annual cost, not including the cost of medication, in April of 2015, when that no-bid contract was renewed for the period from June 1, 2015 to May 31, 2016, it had zoomed to more than nine times the original cost, \$4,756,536.

Last month, Liberty came in for an even more substantial windfall.

On August 23, the San Bernardino County Board of Supervisors voted unanimously to ap-

prove an amended contract with Liberty "for comprehensive mental health and programming services in the county's correctional facilities."

According to a joint staff report to the board of supervisors dated August 23, 2016 from sheriff John McMahon and CaSonya Thomas, the director of the county's behavioral health department, the \$4.75 million annual contract with Liberty approved last year had been jettisoned in January, in favor of a newly configured one that did not run concurrent with the standard governmental fiscal year running from July to June but rather from the middle of the second week of January 2016 through the middle of the second week of January 2017. That contract imposed a substantial - \$1.75 million annual - reduction. But less than eight months into that arrangement, they recommended that the contract be upped.

"On January 12, 2016, the board of supervisors approved Contract No. 16-08 with Liberty Healthcare Corporation to provide comprehensive correctional mental health and programming services to supplement and enhance related services being provided by the department of behavioral health," the McMahon/Thomas report states. "The initial contract term was January 12, 2016 through January 11, 2017, and included two one-year options to extend the term for a maximum three-year period. In an ongoing effort between the sheriff and department of behavioral health to ensure the quality and effectiveness of mental health services being provided to the county's inmates, the departments mutually recommend that Liberty assume a greater responsibility for correctional mental health care while inmates are in custody. The department of behavioral health will continue to provide transitional care services for inmates upon release."

The contract amount was increased by \$14,161,308,

from \$3,047,314 to \$17,208,622, and was altered from a one-year contract term to a three-year term, for a new total contract period of January 12, 2016 to January 11, 2019. Thus, the annual value of the contract will jump from \$3,047,314 to \$5,736,207.33.

According to the report, the number of Liberty staff will increase at the jails. While there will be no change with regard to the single chief psychiatrist in place at the jails and the two mental health registered nurses employed therein, the number of psychiatrists will increase from 4.75 working full-time to 6.75 working full-time; the number of licensed clinical supervisors will jump from one to two; the seven master's level clinicians will increase to 12; an office assistant will be hired; and the sheriff's department will hire a supervising correctional nurse to augment the function. Overall, the number of mental health professionals has now seen an increase from 13 to 25.75.

There is a lack of clarity as to what Liberty's employees' function actually is and whether the team members are in the county's jails to facilitate the fulfillment of the Hippocratic Oath - the commitment by doctors and medical professionals to do no harm and help their patients - or whether they are to assist the sheriff's department and the district attorney's office in carrying out their missions, which are to obtain convictions against those who have been apprehended and charged criminally.

County and sheriff's department officials have acknowledged that a major portion of the work carried out by Lester and his employees consists of mental competency restoration services for inmates. A percentage of individuals arrested and incarcerated and slated for trial move into an area of legal limbo after a court determines they are incompetent to stand trial. Once a trial court makes such a determi-

there is a voter initiative with enough signatures to get the de-annexation on the ballot."

After the City of Needles council minus councilwoman Louise Evans, who dissented, voted to annex its territory into a taxed county fire district, essentially taxing each parcel owner \$148.00 plus per year; that body then refused to place a voter initiative on the November ballot that would have required the council to seek de-annexation from the fire district, reversing the council's earlier action and require the reestablishment of the Needles Fire Department.

The initiative measure, signed by three of the auxiliary's members - proponents Mary Stein, Ed Matthews and Ruth Musser-Lopez - was being circulated along with three other voter initiative measures authored by Ruth Musser-Lopez. The proponents assert that they have gathered sufficient signatures of registered voter in Needles, 160 or 10%, on all four voter initiatives, though not in time to have the votes counted and the measures reviewed by the city's legal council before the cut off

date on Friday August 12. The council's refusal to place the measures on the November's ballot by vote of the council as they have legal authority to do means that the voters will need to wait until the next election to see the initiative measures on the ballot.

At the request of the initiative proponents, the council had agreed to hold a special meeting on Thursday, August 11, the day prior to the cut off day for getting measures on the November 8 ballot. At that special meeting, the city attorney, John Pinkney, and city clerk Dale Jones, who also acts as election official, advised the council that the measures should be reviewed by the city attorney for any potential of litigation and suggested that the ordinances might not be "legal," also adding that the elections official should be provided time to count and verify the signatures collected. It was explained that a state rule provides the elections official 30 days to count the signatures. The council minus Tony Frazier, who was absent, unanimously refused to place the measures on the ballot without the signature count and legal review. They also dispensed with the argument by Musser-Lopez that the council could

direct the city attorney to prepare an argument for the ballot that would lay out any imagined potential for litigation and let the voters decide. Pinckney had argued that lessons learned by other cities with regard to voter initiatives has informed him that it is best to "wait until the initiatives qualify before the city determines if they are legal...if they do move forward and the study has not been done then the city gives the voters the right to challenge and the matter would have to be determined in court...then such a determination would not be achievable within the city at a lesser cost...there is a great potential that the cost of the litigation could be more than the cost of a special election...to challenge something at that late stage would harbor distrust...our opinion is that council should follow the process before placing these measures on the ballot...litigation could cost more than a special election...it could be \$20,000 for a special election.

Since a count of voter "protest" signatures taken in June by the Local Area Formation Commission's fell short of the 25% needed to stop the city's application for annexation of its territory to an already taxed fire

district, an association calling themselves the Needles Fire Auxiliary has been preparing and then circulating a voter initiative that would overturn the annexation bringing back the city owned and operated fire department. The voter initiative requires only 10% of the registered voter's signatures to get the matter on the ballot for a regular election.

Musser-Lopez told the *Sentinel* that the auxiliary will now need to decide if they want to get the 15% needed to take the vote to a special election which will be an extra expense to the city. "We don't want the expense of a special election and hope that a new council in November will reverse the course of the city's destiny by reviving the city controlled fire department. We have discussed the possibility of a local training program with Palo Verde community college located here in Needles and hope that maintaining a local fire department will provide employment opportunities for local young people who desire a career in fire prevention and management. We are very concerned about our communities vulnerability when county fire is busy with fires 40 or 60 miles away. A new council could decide to

approve the voter initiative ordinance, or similar, to bring back the fire department without the cost of a special election. A special election is said to cost \$20,000...an application to de-annex from the county is only \$10,000. If we get the 15% we need for a special election, the council may wake up to the fact that we mean business. There are a lot of unhappy campers who don't like the new tax that goes in large part to county administration."

The "fire department" ordinance initiative, if passed, would require the city to de-annex from the county fire district and return to a city staffed fire department. The initiative would reduce a property tax from over \$148.00 per parcel per year indefinitely into the future to a maximum of \$120.00 per parcel that would be limited to a two year "start-up" term. Though the necessary signatures were gathered during a course of only two weeks, the initiative was one of four initiative measures that failed to timely qualify for the November ballot, a serious set back for the proponents who must now decide whether to seek 80 more signatures (15% of the qualified voters) to force a special election. The city's staff report asserts that two of

the initiatives which are city charter amendment measures must be placed on the ballot of a regular election or an election called by the state and may not be voted on at a special election. That would mean that the two charter initiatives would not be placed on the ballot until the next primary election in 2018.

One of those charter amendments establishes a local historic commission and local register of historic places. The other charter amendment, which its author, Musser-Lopez, claims "will likely go viral statewide" would prohibit the Needles City Council from ever voting to place the territory of Needles in a taxed service district again without the affirmation of 2/3 of the registered voters.

The fourth initiative measure is a proposed ordinance which would prohibit the destruction of the historic footprint of Route 66 in Needles. The city and CalTrans intend to begin construction on a traffic light project in Needles prior to the November election, a project that would turn the intersection of Needles Highway and Broadway into a straight four-way stop with traffic lights, eliminating a historic medium and

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Glimpse Of SBC's Past

Paul Young

Born on February 17, 1900 in Portageville, Missouri, Paul Joseph Young was the son of Joseph and Emma (Hawkins) Young, one of nine children. Paul's parents were farm people, and after completing the eighth grade at the Scott School in East Portageville, Paul worked on the family farm. In Missouri he had seen his parents' farm crops destroyed on more than one occasion when water of the Mississippi River exceeded that grand river's banks and washed over the countryside. This left a lifelong impression him.

Paul Young and Willa Tyson were married on September 8, 1918, in Portageville. In 1922 they went west, first residing in Riverside where Paul found employment as an apprentice carpenter at a building construction company. In 1926 he left Riverside and moved his family to Colton, where he obtained a position with the Pacific Fruit Express Company. He later became a general construction contractor.

In 1944, Young was elected councilman in the City of Colton and was mayor from 1952 to 1954. In November of

1954 he was appointed by the governor to fill the vacancy on the San Bernardino Board of Supervisors caused by the resignation of Frank H. Mogle. Young, representing the Fourth Supervisorial District, was subsequently elected to that position and twice re-elected, serving over twelve years. He served as chairman of the board from December 1960 to

1962. He was succeeded on the board in December 1966 by Ruben S. Ayala.

As a supervisor, Mr. Young was a strong supporter of the North San Bernardino Flood Control System project. The accomplishment of this huge undertaking required a \$3,425,000 bond issue, which was done on September 15, 1956. Mr. Young's interest in flood

control was based on personal experience. In addition to his witnessing the destruction of his parents' crops as a result of the overflowing of the Mississippi during his younger years, in 1938 he and his own family were victims of the torrential flooding that year which caused extensive damage to their home in Colton, which he had only recently built.

Young has been lauded for other noteworthy accomplishments while he was supervisor, such as his leadership in establishing branch offices for government in the west of the county, his creating and founding the City-County Coordinating Committee to develop better understanding between city and county governments, his initiation of the Youth Opportunity Project to help to reduce the number of high school dropouts in the district, his leadership in the creation of the Comprehensive West End General Plan, his leadership in the development of the Prado Regional Park near Chino, the establishment of a countywide rubbish disposal program, the planning of the orderly expansion of the Chino Airport, and numerous

other accomplishments for the betterment of his Fourth District and of the County of San Bernardino. At his urging, the board of supervisors instituted the practice of a short prayer at the beginning of each day's session. This practice has continued to the present time.

As supervisor, Young served on a number of key committees and governmental bodies. He was the chairman of the Local Agency Formation Commission, chairman of the County Retirement Board, a member and director of the executive board of the Southern Regional Association of Supervisors and the Southern California area of the County Supervisors Association of California, a member and chairman of the Southern California Air Pollution Coordinating Committee, chairman of the County Health Services Committee and a member of the Dependency Prevention Commission. He was the director of the Heart Fund Campaign in 1964.

Mr. Young was a member of the Masonic Lodge #306 of Colton, a member of the Elks and the Kiwanis clubs, of the Loyal Star Lodge

and of the First Baptist Church of Colton. One of his greatest moments of pride was in arranging the relocation of a church building from San Bernardino to Grand Terrace and literally remodeling the building by himself. This church became the Grandview Baptist Church. His hobby was trying to help others whenever he could. It is said that when he joined the church he vowed to help someone each day of his life and he usually achieved what he set out to do.

Also surviving Mr. Young were three sisters: Lilian Ashford of Claremont, Oklahoma; Lennie Swaim of Riverside; and Ruth Swing of Loma Linda; a brother, Louis, of Riverside; ten grandchildren; and nine great-grandchildren.

ell served on the city council for two terms, representing Colton's Sixth District. There was a mercurial element to Mitchell's previous political trajectory. Before he was on the city council he was a close political advisor, friend and associate of councilwoman Deirdre Bennett. With Bennett, Mitchell shared an affinity for Republican, some might say right wing, politics, which was somewhat out of step with the over-

all trend in blue collar, predominantly Hispanic and Democratic Colton. But Bennett and Mitchell resided in what was and has remained as the lone bastion of Republicanism in Colton, the Fifth District, which encompasses the upper crust residential Cooley Ranch and Reche Canyon neighborhoods.

The political careers of Chastain and Mitchell revolved around that of Bennett. Paradoxically, they initially orbited Bennett as close, virtually inseparable allies; ultimately Chastain and Mitchell's relationship with Bennett would sour and they would become

Bennett's tenure on the council began under then-mayor Frank Gonzales in 1992 and advanced temporarily under the mayoralty of George Fulp, until he was removed from office in a recall vote in 1996. city's fifth district seat. At that point, Bennett and Chastain were already in lockstep. nation with regard to a defendant and orders the defendant committed to a state mental hospital for care and treatment to restore competence in order to be processed through the justice system, the state mental hospital has 90 days to make a written report to the court concerning the defendant's progress toward recovery of mental competence.

But because of chronic shortages of beds within California State Hospitals which have created lengthy waiting lists of inmates in county jails, including those in San Bernardino County, who are in need of mental competency restoration services, the state of California created economic incentives to promote the mental competency restoration concept. This has led to some questionable actions by governmental entities and psychiatric professionals in the scramble for the money. As part of an effort to clear the county's jails of

this backlog of inmates awaiting admission to the state mental hospital system, the county in 2010 hit upon the idea of bringing in a psychiatrist who would provide to those inmates in the county jail the same services those inmates would receive in a state mental hospital. It was at that point that Lester and Liberty entered the picture. In May of 2010, the California Department of Mental Health contracted with Liberty (State Agreement No. 09-79156-000) to establish a pilot program to provide restoration of mental competency services in a county jail. On June 22, 2010, the board of supervisors approved a revenue agreement with Liberty to allow West Valley Detention Center to be used as a site for a state pilot program to provide restoration of mental competency services to county inmates. The San Bernardino County Sheriff's department allocated 20 beds in a sheltered housing unit for use by Liberty and assigned a deputy to provide security for Liberty's staff.

San Bernardino County likewise has a financial interest in the program. By utilizing a psychiatrist to pro-

vide mental competency restoration services to inmates deemed to be mentally incompetent within the jail setting as opposed to transferring them to a state mental hospital, the county stood to obtain reimbursements from the state. San Bernardino upped the stakes, agreeing to accept inmates from other jurisdictions – all 57 of the state's other counties – who would be evaluated by Lester and his staff with an eye toward certifying those people to be ready to go to trial. In Fiscal 2015-16 alone, San Bernardino was angling to obtain a reimbursement of \$10,857,697.44 from the state for that use of its detention center space.

With this emphasis on monetizing Lester and Liberty's services, an arrangement that was delivering cold cash into the county's coffers and Lester and Liberty's bank accounts, concern arose that the legitimate psychological care of inmates was being overlooked.

This is because, in addition to providing the mental competency restoration treatment, Liberty is also contracted to tend to the psychological needs of the general inmate population. Many

see a potential or actual conflict of interest between those two functions. While the mental competency restoration treatment of inmates transplanted into San Bernardino County jails and detention facilities represents an influx of income to the county, the provision of psychiatric care to the county's general inmate population does not. In such an environment, when there is a shortage of psychiatric care assets they end up being apportioned overwhelmingly away from San Bernardino County citizens.

Moreover, reports have reached the *Sentinel* of the abuse of jail inmates, including what might be defined as mental and emotional abuse – intended to “psychologically break” the inmates, at least some of whom maintain they are innocent of the crimes they are charged with and form the basis of their incarceration.

In one case, that of Kristen Arthur, after Judge Charles Umeda ordered that she be granted a session with a jail psychiatrist, her jailors refused for more than six hours to bring her out of solitary confinement so she could be seen by Dr. Patricia Kirkish, a

psychiatrist who had travelled from her office in Pasadena to West Valley Detention Center to evaluate Arthur and her condition. After the interminable wait and no indication that access to Arthur would be granted, Kirkish departed without seeing her.

In this way, it appears the psychological health of certain inmates is not being tended to. This is most likely to occur, the *Sentinel* is informed, when sheriff's department or jailhouse personnel have a particular animus toward the inmate in question or the inmate has been the victim of physical or psychological abuse by sheriff's deputies which may have triggered behavioral issues with the inmate. Given the power relationship that exists between the sheriff's department, its administrators and personnel vis-à-vis Liberty and its mental health professionals, taken together with the lucrative nature of Liberty's contract, the willingness of Liberty's employees to stand up for the inmates it is their responsibility to treat has been compromised.

More troubling still is the sheriff's department's use of psychoactive drugs to render

the inmate population within the jail system manageable, and Liberty's acquiescence in this practice. Jailors dole out a host of psychoactive drugs to inmates, including sedatives, tranquilizers or anti-psychotic agents.

The inmates commonly refer to these drugs as Skittles, because of their coloration and visual similarity to the fruit-flavored candy produced by the William Wrigley, Jr. Candy Company. Not all of the inmates are amenable to being administered these drugs, which leave those taking them in a zombie-like or near catatonic state.

One former inmate at West Valley Detention facility told the *Sentinel* of his experience.

“I had been jailed after getting two driving tickets under the influence within a relatively short time,” he said. “I had been playing the fool and after my incarceration I arrived at the conclusion that I was going to get my life together. I was going to get sober and remain so. I resolved that I would use the time I was going to be in jail to get started on that. One day, something like two months after I had been in continuous custody, I awoke from a bad dream, cursing, and another inmate, who thought I was cursing at him, tried to get violent with me. Fortunately, cooler heads prevailed and no actual fight took place. Shortly after that, I was called out to talk to a psychiatrist and later that evening I was given Thorazine. That evening, a deputy, who was with a medical officer, called my name. The medical distributor, a woman, tried to hand me the medication. I declined it. At that point, the deputy told me in a loud enough projection of his voice to be overheard by all 47 inmates in the dormitory that if I did not take the Thorazine, privileges for all of us – phone access, day room, yard access, and television – would be revoked indefinitely.

working relationship with Chastain, whose ambition for higher office, such as County Supervisor, was no secret. By the summer of 2006, Nuaimi had replaced Bennett as Chastain's main adviser and confidant. If Chastain was truly intent on running for supervisor or a state office such as the Assembly, California Senate, or federal office such as Congress, it would be best that she do so from the position of mayor rather than councilwoman. And since Chastain's Third District council seat was subject to election in a four year cycle

corresponding with the presidential elections and the mayor's race occurred in those years corresponding with California's gubernatorial contests, she could challenge Bennett for the mayor's post without risking her council position. Before the mayoral election Chastain procured a \$5,000 campaign donation from a Fontana developer David Weiner and several other donors with close ties to Nuaimi. That summer, an opportunity of unparalleled political serendipity presented itself: Councilman Ramon Hernandez, who had become with Chastain and Mitchell a fairly reliable fourth vote on the council to solidify the Bennett-led coalition, was arrested for using his city credit card to pay for local mo-

tel stays and phone-sex hotlines. Chastain declared her candidacy for mayor amid the hoopla, and in the course of the campaign it was suggested by Chastain that Bennett, as mayor, had kept a lid on the scandal involving Hernandez by suppressing information about his activity and misappropriations, and keeping the lurid details from the public. Simultaneously, Mitchell sought to assist Hernandez by using his own personal funds to reimburse the city for the monetary costs of Hernandez's indiscretions. Ultimately, after the election, it would be revealed that Bennett had actually pressed then-city manager Daryl Parrish for an investigation into the Hernandez matter in the weeks and months prior

to it becoming public.

When all of the ballots were counted after the November 2006 election, Chastain had outdistanced Bennett by a mere nine votes and .14 of a percentage point, 3,235 votes or 49.93 percent to 3,226 votes or 49.79 percent.

Chastain's political career had reached its zenith; she was a Republican mayor in a Democrat city, the beneficiary of a close alliance with Nuaimi. Both were members of the county's transportation agency, San Bernardino Associated Governments, known by its acronym SAN-BAG. Both had access to donors willing to back their progress further up the political food chain and both were strong regional political contenders for either county

supervisor or state assembly. Chastain had the backing of Mitchell on the council and they were able to count on the votes of council members Vincent Yzaguirre, who replaced Chastain, and Susan Oliva.

By the end of 2007 Chastain's star had already begun to fade as a series of controversies erupted, many centering around her close personal relationship with Nuaimi, whose involvement in and influence over political developments in Colton even as he was serving as the city's second-highest staff member. Conflict of interest charges arose due to Nuaimi's dual roles in the governance of Fontana and Colton, two cities that often had competing interests. Early in 2008,

empowered to vote like all other members of the city council. In most California cities, the city attorney serves at the pleasure of the city council, although in some cities the city attorney is an elected position. Almost universally, the city attorney's function is to advise the city council on legal matters, counsel them with regard to the legality of their contemplated action and help them frame their action so that what action they take comports with the law. The city attorney is also the city council's first line of defense and offense in litigation, representing the city and the city council when it or they are sued, and initiating lawsuits when the council deems litigation necessary to achieve the city's ends or if such action is deemed, in their collective judgment, to be in the city's best interest.

In San Bernardino, however, the mayor, while charged with the duty of presiding over council meetings, is relatively politically weak. San Bernardino has seven council members other than the mayor. Under normal circumstances, he has no vote in the course of council action. In the event of a council vote when a council member or members are absent or abstaining such that the vote ends in a tie, the mayor is called upon to cast a vote to break that tie. The mayor also has veto

power, but only in a case where the vote is close – that is, 4 to 3 or 3 to 2. Despite the mayor's less than dynamic political reach, however, the position is an uncommonly strong one in terms of managerial authority. In a real sense, the mayor and city manager are co-managerial regents, such that the mayor has the authority to hire and fire, or at least have final sayso in hiring or firing, the city manager and department heads and lower city employees. In San Bernardino the city attorney is an elected post. This puts the city attorney out of reach of the mayor, city manager and city council. Moreover, though the city attorney does not have a vote on the council, the charter gives him the authority to weigh in at will on any issue that comes before the city council for discussion or any other public issue for that matter. This is qualitatively different from the governmental arrangement in nearly every other city in the state, where the city attorney speaks only when he is invited to do so by the mayor or city council.

San Bernardino's 1905 charter provides the electorate with the authority to amend the charter and in the last 111 years that has occurred several times. The basic parameters of the charter remain unchanged, however.

All of that will change if Measure L, which has been placed on the ballot in November is passed by the voters.

Charter change proponents have suggested

that the current charter, created when San Bernardino was a town of little more than 10,000 just after the turn of the 19th Century to the 20th Century, is antiquated and not in keeping with the modern standards of organization and governance for most cities in California in the Third Millennium. Those proponents' ideas and lobbying prompted the council to appoint a charter review committee to come up with a new operational blueprint for the county seat, which now boasts a population of just over 214,000. Decrying the current charter as one that leaves the city without a clearly defined demarcation of leadership, as stated in the phrase "Everyone is in charge so no one is in charge," the committee laid out a new constitution for the city. It would, its drafters maintain, establish clear lines of authority and responsibility by which the city council makes policy and major financial decisions, while the day-to-day operation of the city is delegated to the city manager. Further, the charter proposal as drafted ends the mayor's authority to appoint department heads, designates the city manager as the city's chief executive officer, keeps the mayor elected at large and retains the current number of wards in the city at seven. It changes the timing of elections from odd-numbered years to have them correspond with presidential and gubernatorial elections in even-numbered years and dispenses with the elected status of the city

clerk, the city attorney and the city treasurer, such that those positions would be hired ones, nominated by the city manager and approved by the city council. The new charter reduces or eliminates the city attorney's purview in engaging in policy considerations. The mayor would remain ineligible to vote on routine matters but would still have tie-breaking power and veto power, though such vetoes could be overridden with five votes. The city would keep its 30-day residency requirement for running for office, the current requirement and the longest permissible under California law. The new charter keeps in place each individual council member's ability to appoint committee and commission members.

The new charter provides for a water department and library that are independent from the city council's direct control and are overseen by library and water boards. The civil service department continues as the appeals forum of disciplinary action.

While the proposed new 14-page charter has its proponents who believe its simpler and more-streamlined approach to governing will prove advantageous, there are many residents who believe the existing 48-page charter is a tried and true instrument of local government that is entirely suitable for San Bernardino. They reject the idea that the existing charter, with its layers of deliberation and checks on governmental action, is needlessly cumbersome. They assert rather that the charter prevents city officials from acting rashly and without regard for the interests of those being governed.

Six of the seven existing council members and the current mayor, Carey Davis, support the adoption of the new charter. Davis has gone on record as favoring it, even though it will lessen his power and authority. They are joined by former Mayor Patrick Morris, who has said

he believes the existing charter hamstringing city government into a state of near ineffectiveness and is a model of "convoluted structure" which invites "political chaos."

The most celebrated opponents of the new charter are former mayor Judith Valles, former city attorney James Penman and Tim Prince, the son of Ralph Prince, the longest serving city attorney in San Bernardino history.

The ballot measure in support of the Measure L states, "Vote Yes on Measure L.

For many years, San Bernardino has deteriorated, unable to overcome problems that nearby cities fight more effectively. Over the years, we've chosen various leaders from different political philosophies and parties. Despite their efforts, the city has continued to decline.

After San Bernardino declared bankruptcy in 2012, a committee of citizen volunteers was formed to study how to fix our city. After two years of study and countless public meetings including the League of Women Voters, civic groups, and Cal State San Bernardino government experts, everyone agreed.

The current city charter (a constitution for local government) was adopted in 1905 when the population was less than 10,000 residents. It needs to be replaced with a new charter that reflects the needs of a modern city of more than 200,000 residents.

The new charter will: Require a balanced budget, strict financial controls, and an annual independent audit that must be shared publicly.

Save taxpayer dollars that can better be spent on reducing crime, improving parks and libraries by combining city elections with state and federal elections where turnout is higher and more residents have a say in critical, quality of life decisions.

Guarantee that our city-run police department will not be out-

sourced and our city library will remain under the authority of the library board.

Ensure the water department remains independent of the city council and give the board of water commissioners authority to repair the crumbling sewer system.



things came to a crisis as it was discovered that Nuaimi and Parrish had sent emails to Chastain referring to Colton citizens as "urban idiots", "monkeys" and "fools." When confronted in public, Chastain attempted to brass it out, continuing her stanch support of Nuaimi and Parrish. All this and more led to the 2008 recall attempt

against Chastain, which Chastain was able to overcome with the help of \$15,000 in campaign contributions from Nuaimi's Fontana connections. Meanwhile in the 2008 election, Bennett chased Mitchell from office, gathering 1,341 votes to Mitchell's 982. A third candidate, Robert Wilson, polled 202 votes. Chastain's political stock continued to plummet under the strain of her continuing miscalculations, missteps and the lingering economic

downturn that had begun in 2007. Colton is one of only two cities in San Bernardino County that owns its own electrical utility. In an effort to shore up the city financially, the Chastain-led council dramatically raised electricity rates to the point that Colton residents and businesses were paying more than 15 percent above the cost of electricity available in nearby cities from Southern California Edison. This move failed to generate further utility-based revenue for the city, as residential

customers responded by discontinuing or decreasing use of their air conditioning units during the summer and a significant number of businesses closed or moved elsewhere. As a consequence, the city saw a resultant reduction in sales tax revenue. As Colton's continued to slide toward the edge of a financial abyss, in 2009 over 100 City of Colton employees were laid off and both city libraries were closed down. City Manager Parrish left town in the midst of the turmoil and in Novem-

ber 2009 Nuaimi "laid himself off" taking a hefty severance package with him. By 2010, Colton's one-time general fund reserves had been reduced from \$4.5 million to \$55,000 and was on the verge of bankruptcy. Chastain's political demise was sealed when David Zamora ran against her in that year's mayoral contest. A Colton resident who had been hired as the city's community development director when Frank Gonzales had been mayor in the 1980s, Zamora had remained in

that key municipal post for more than a quarter of a century, surviving efforts by George Fulp to have him cashiered in the mid-1990s. But with the downsizing the city engaged in during the years following the onset of the 2007 recession, Zamora was forced into retirement by Parrish and Nuaimi early in 2009. 2010 marked Frank Gonzalez's political comeback, as well. In 2010, Zamora trounced Chastain 4,896 votes to 3,289. In the

city's second district, Gonzales outpolled Tony Morales, 810 to 747.

A seemingly new day had dawned. With the mandate he had obtained, together with his institutional knowledge of City Hall and the community garnered from 26 years overseeing the city's growth and function, Zamora appeared ready to escort Colton into a new era. Susan Oliva, who had voted pretty much in accordance with the Chastain coalition since she had been elected to the council in 2006, was narrowly returned to the council. But in the face of the political juggernaut that had swept Zamora into office, Oliva had little choice but to go along with the trends afoot. Through strength of personality, Zamora had virtually eradicated all vestiges of Chastain's political hold. But the Zamora era was short lived. In July 2011, while returning to City Hall from his lunch break at home, Zamora suffered a massive coronary attack and drove his car into a

power pole. He did not survive the crash. With him the Political Pax Colton he had forged expired. The bereaved community convulsed at the death of the mayor and in a fit of sympathy and in an effort to sustain the unifying force he embodied, appointed his widow, Sarah, who had previously served on the city council for nearly four years in the aftermath of the indictments of then-mayor Karl Gaytan, former councilman Abe Beltran, then-councilman Don Sanders and then-councilman James Grimsby, the latter of whom Sarah Zamora replaced.

With the disappearance of David Zamora as the city's unifying gravitational pull, the centripetal political force grew centrifugal, and the council's various personages – Bennett, Gonzales, Oliva, Sixth District Councilman Isaac Suchil, Vincent Yzaguirre, and Sarah Zamora immediately embarked on an effort to achieve an ascendancy none could achieve because of their individual and collective dearth of political skill. While a veneer of cordiality remained amongst the council, Sarah Zamora voted and acted in ways that were

demonstrably at odds with her late husband's approach to governance. In 2014, the council appeared hell bent on a painful reckoning; Gonzales declared his intention to run for mayor, 20 years after he had departed that position. In the face of Gonzales's challenge, Sarah Zamora opted against remaining in the mayoral position. One-time council member Richard DeLaRosa reemerged to seek the mayoralty as well. Meanwhile, Summer Zamora Jorin, the daughter of David Zamora and Sarah Zamora who had been a member of the city's parks and recreation commission, declared her candidacy for the District 2 council seat.

Jorin won but Gonzales lost.

In the immediate aftermath of both Frank Gonzales's and Sarah Zamora's departures from the Colton City Council, the newly composed council as it first order of business enacted a host of ethics reforms that included a nepotism prohibition to prevent the council from appointing family members to city commissions and likewise banning city employees from sitting on city commissions and committees. The

ethical reform package passed very narrowly, on a 4-3 vote, with councilman Frank Navarro being the most passionate advocate of the policy change. Navarro asserted that Colton had built up an "unsavory reputation" of favoritism to relatives of city officials. "We need to promote a sense of honesty, integrity and transparency," Navarro said, suggesting that the city start the reform process by preventing those with familial connections exercising undue influence at City Hall.

Almost two years later political ghosts are returning to haunt Colton. In the last three days of the filing period, Sarah Zamora, John Mitchell and Chastain resurfaced as hopefuls in the upcoming election, qualifying their candidacies.

Of note is that Bennett, due for reelection, will not run, having pulled out because of what she said are "health" reasons. But she, or at least her specter, remains as a touchstone of the election, with five of this year's candidates having a past or current connection to her. Running in her place is her husband, Bruce. Also vying for the Fifth District council position

are two of her appointees to the planning commission, Kirk Larson and Jack Woods. Also running in the Fifth District is her erstwhile advisor and ally and now dire political enemy, Mitchell. The fifth political entity in this year's race once connected to Bennett is Chastain.

The Colton Fifth District match-up makes for interesting handicapping. Bruce Bennett enjoys the advantage of the name recognition and identification he has as a consequence of his wife's incumbency. Bennett also has previous experience as a Colton Planning commissioner prior to Deirdre Bennett's ascendancy to public office. Also accruing to him is the political data at his wife's disposal and her connections. Mitchell possesses a leg up from the standpoint of his having run successfully for office in Colton in the past and having previously advised on or managed Deirdre Bennett's campaigns. Kirk Larson and Jack Woods bring to the table their respective experiences on the city commissions. Larson, who was close to Bennett and was appointed to the commission by her, was also closely associated with

Mitchell when he was on the council.

At present on the council, there is a loosely knit affiliation between council members David Toro, Frank Navarro, Dr. Luis Gonzalez (no relation to Frank Gonzales) and Deirdre Bennett, with the mayor, De La Rosa and Isaac Suchil often lining up with that coalition, depending on the issue at hand. Summer Zamora Jorin remains something of an outsider.

Yet, there is a prospect that Zamora Jorin's status as one on the outside looking in could shift if the political ambitions of her mother, Mitchell and Chastain advance.

Chastain is challenging Navarro in the Third District. Navarro has been on the council since 2012, when he ousted the incumbent, Vincent Yzaguirre, by polling 845 votes or 56.74 percent to Yzaguirre's 645 or 43.26 percent.

Navarro has gained further momentum and strength since coming into office. He is the City of Colton's representative on SANBAG, San Bernardino County's Transportation Agency, as well as the Inland Valley member on SCAG,

At that point, I would say ten or fifteen of the inmates made threats of violence toward me. Several of the others were mocking me, saying, 'Take your skittles.' So, I did."

The former inmate told the *Sentinel* that he reluctantly complied with taking the Thorazine for roughly the next two weeks.

He said the drug left "me basically in a tongue-tied, slobbering, invalid state."

As his date for release approached, he was advised by another inmate that he would be taken off the Thorazine "cold turkey," which would very likely leave him incapable of maintaining sobriety. At that point, he declined taking any more Thorazine. He said a deputy, "tried the same scare tactic of revoking the entire dormitory's privileges if I stuck with" his refusal. "I turned to the rest of the tank and told them, 'If anyone has a problem, step down right now and we will go

toe-to-toe.' The deputy, who recognized at that point he would have a major problem on his hands, moved on without forcing me to take the medication."

Later that evening, he was called out for a phone interview with a psychologist, who, he said "asked me why I was refusing to take my meds. When I told her the entire story, she looked into the situation and got back to me about a week later, saying she had looked into my psychiatric case file and she found no notes in there warranting any medication at all."

The *Sentinel* approached Dr. Lester. He was unwilling to make any statements about whether he and Liberty had facilitated the sheriff's department's use of psychoactive drugs to control inmates or what standards or protocols are in place with regard to determining if inmates should be medicated. Nor was he willing to discuss whether he considered Liberty's dual contracts for restoration of competency and psychiatric care to be in conflict with one another. Nor would he discuss if there was a strict separation of func-

tions involving different Liberty personnel to supply the evaluations and other personnel to provide the inmate psychiatric care to ward off any such conflicts.

"I don't know how they are doing things there now," he said. "I haven't been there in nine months. Liberty needs to address these things you are asking about, or the sheriff's department, or both of them."

Lester did not explain why he was no longer working for Liberty or with the San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department.

"You should talk to Kevin Rice," he said. "He's in charge of what Liberty is doing at West Valley now."

When the *Sentinel* contacted Rice, he did not dispute that the sheriff's department was utilizing tranquilizers or anti-psychotic drugs to render the jail population manageable, but said, "Medication cannot be provided to an inmate without a doctor's order. Under no circumstances would drugs be provided without a doctor's assessment. That is standard anywhere. You can't give medications to anyone without a doctor's order."

Asked whether he perceived some order of conflict in Liberty providing both the restoration of competency services and psychiatric care to the inmates in the same detention facilities and if there was some separation of duties that would ward off such a conflict, Rice said, "I can't answer specifically how the services are provided."

He gave a somewhat ambiguous response when asked if the county department of behavioral health exercised some oversight over the provision of psychological and psychiatric services provided to inmates in the county's jail system. "The sheriff's department has always been in charge of mental health programs in the jails," he said. The *Sentinel* reposed the question, asking if the department of behavioral health monitored the delivery of the services. "Ultimately, mental health services is the responsibility of and under the authority of the sheriff's department," Rice said.

Rice, a licensed clinical social worker, shied away from explaining how he was able to replace Lester, a licensed psychiatrist, in oversee-

ing Liberty's psychiatric care and restoration of competency operations at West Valley.

"Those decisions are made at a higher level, way beyond me," he said. "You need to speak to someone who is part of those decisions."

When the *Sentinel* asked whether the sheriff's department passes along to the department of behavioral health the records and authorizations relating to the dispensing of sedatives, tranquilizers and anti-psychotics to jail inmates, Rice moved to shut the interview down. "There's not a whole lot I can answer," he said. "I don't have the authority to speak on behalf of the sheriff's department regardless of which direction it is going. It is not appropriate for me to say anything. You should speak with Terry Fillman, the sheriff's department's medical services administrator."

The *Sentinel* was unable to obtain a substantive response from Fillman. When reached by phone at his office at West Valley Detention Center he declined to explain on what basis the deputies working the jails could prevent an inmate from being inter-

viewed by a psychiatrist after a judge had ordered that such a session with a psychiatrist take place. He refused to entertain any further questions, lawyering up in the process. He said the *Sentinel* should provide the questions it has in writing to sheriff's department spokeswoman Jody Miller.

"She'll give you that information once she is authorized to do so by county counsel," Fillman said.

The office of county counsel is the county's stable of in-house attorneys.

In attempting to reach CaSonya Thomas, the director of the county's behavioral services department, the *Sentinel* was diverted to both the county's main spokesman, David Wert, and the department of behavioral services' public information officer, Aimara Freeman.

Freeman asked for questions to Thomas to be submitted in writing. Accordingly, the *Sentinel* inquired as to:

- Whether Thomas sees a potential or actual conflict between Liberty's competency restoration and psychiatric care functions;

Southern California's Regional Planning Agency, on which he represents Colton, Grand Terrace, Redlands, Yucaipa and Loma Linda. The Third District's demographics favor Navarro, with nearly 80 percent of its registered voters being Hispanic. In 2006, the last election Chastain won, she failed to carry the Third District in that race for mayor against Bennett, despite the consideration that she had thrice gained electoral victory there, in 1996, 2000 and 2004. Chas-

tain, on the other hand, has won three elections in the Third District in the past and previously had the support of the city's public employee unions. Chastain is a member of the San Bernardino County Republican Central Committee. As a member of the GOP, however, she is out of step with Colton overall and the Third District in particular, where Democrats outnumber Republicans by a margin of more than two to one.

In the Fifth District, Mitchell will need to put several demons to rest if he hopes to get back into office. With the Ramon Hernandez scandal now a decade in the past, he might be able to avoid having too many of his district's voters hold him accountable for his ef-

fort to both literally and figuratively bail Hernandez out. When it became known that Hernandez had used his city issued credit card to download images from gay pornographic websites and to pay for local hotel rooms where he engaged in homosexual trysts with dozens of young men, Mitchell sought to defuse the situation by reimbursing the city on Hernandez's behalf, working behind the scenes to keep the matter under wraps and then working in league with Chastain to make it appear that it was Deirdre Bennett, who was then mayor, who was the party responsible for the cover-up. Bennett did not forget what had occurred and came after Mitchell, her former right hand

man, with a vengeance in the 2008 election, unseating him. It seems unlikely that Deirdre Bennett's husband, Bruce, who in 2008 was involved in the effort to recall Chastain as mayor, will have forgotten what occurred in 2006, either. Still the same, Bruce Bennett has never won an election on his own. Neither has Kirk Larson nor Jack Woods. Mitchell thus appears to stand a slightly better chance at regaining his former position on the council than his ally, Chastain.

In the Sixth District, Sarah Zamora is challenging incumbent Isaac Suchil, who was first elected to that position in 2004, served four years and narrowly lost reelection to Alex Perez in 2008 and then con-

vincingly defeated Perez in 2012. Her effort to unseat Suchil appears less focused on her opponent than on her effort to redeem her political reputation. While she enjoyed a honeymoon, of sorts, in the two year aftermath of her husband's untimely death, Sarah Zamora saw her political reach diminish in the last year-and-a-half she was in office. At that point, a council majority stripped her of her appointments as the city's representative on the county transportation agency and Southern California's largest and most prestigious regional planning forum, SCAG, the Southern California Association of Governments.

For many observers, Sarah Zamora's effort to

re-immers herself into Colton politics is curious in that her last political sally, riding as it were on her deceased husband's coattails, she appeared to mar her family's legacy rather than burnish it. She floated the idea, late in her tenure as mayor, to repeat Chastain's policy of enhancing the city's revenue picture by raising electrical rates, despite her husband having moved to reduce those rates after he came into office. Sarah Zamora was unable to convince the council to go along with making that increase. As her tenure in office ended, a move to curtail political dynasties in Colton was launched. The an-

- If Thomas was sensitive to the consideration that the mercenary motive of running psychiatric evaluations of inmates originating from outside the county and the revenue the county receives from the state for providing that service may have compromised the psychiatric care provided to the inmates in the county's jails;

- If Thomas was aware of the sheriff's department using sedatives, tranquilizers and anti-psychotics to render

elements of the jail population more manageable;

- If Thomas considered the practice of using sedatives, tranquilizers and anti-psychotics to render elements of the jail population more manageable appropriate;

- What sort of records are kept of medications issued to the county's jail inmates;

- What the protocol for determining whether a jail inmate should receive sedatives, tranquilizers and anti-psychotics is;

- Whether there are medical or psychiatric authorizations made by licensed medical or psychiatric professionals for the dispensing of sedatives, tranquilizers and anti-psychotics to jail

inmates;

- If the sheriff's department passes along to the department of behavioral health the records and authorizations relating to the dispensing of sedatives, tranquilizers and anti-psychotics to jail inmates;

- If the department of behavioral health had any participation in creating the protocol for determining whether a jail inmate should receive sedatives, tranquilizer and anti-psychotics;

- How many inmates in the county's jails at present are receiving sedatives, tranquilizers or anti-psychotics; and

- If Thomas has monitored Liberty's function with regard to the services it is providing in the

jail system.

Freeman was unwilling to provide substantive answers to any of the questions. She offered a curt, two sentence reply. "The department of behavioral health has no authority over the provision of jail mental health services or the contract with Liberty," she said. "Please direct your questions to the sheriff's department."

The *Sentinel* followed up with a single question, inquiring how it was that Freeman had co-authored the report to the board of supervisors relating to its August 23 vote for increasing Liberty's contract scope at the jails if she had no authority over mental health services at the

jail. Freeman did not respond.

The *Sentinel* redirected the written questions provided to Freeman to sheriff's department spokeswoman Jody Miller, who on Wednesday said she would respond if the questions were provided in that form. By press time, Miller had not responded in writing or verbally to any of those questions.

Wert told the *Sentinel*, "The department of behavioral health is recognized nationally for the extraordinarily high level of care it provides to its clients in San Bernardino County. However, to ensure client privacy, the department does not discuss the specific care it provides. Addi-

tionally, the department has no role in the management of the county's jails."

The *Sentinel* has learned that Thomas is not a licensed psychiatrist or psychologist, despite her status as the head of the county's behavioral services division. Rather, she is an administrator, with a master's degree in business administration. She does possess a certificate in health care compliance.

The board of supervisors has voted to remove Thomas as the director of the behavioral services division and "kick her upstairs" to become the county's human services director in mid-October.

argument against Measure L by a coin flip, which favored Prince's submission. Penman insists that there are nuances to his argument that should be considered by San Bernardino's voters. In order to give San Bernardino's residents the opportunity to consider the matter from all pertinent perspectives, the *Sentinel* offers both arguments against Measure L.

County Wildlife Corner Calochortus Plummerae Plummers Mariposa Lily

Calochortus plummerae, a monocot, is a perennial herb (bulb) that is an increasingly rare flower. It is not only native to California but endemic to the Golden State, as well, meaning it is not found outside of California. The lion's share of these



plants grow in Southern California; they are also present in some Transverse Ranges and Peninsular Ranges. In San Bernardino County, Plummer's mariposa lily is most often visible as a constituent of the chaparral, grasslands, and lower mon-

tane coniferous forest plant communities.

A slender-branched perennial that grows one to two feet tall from a bulb and has two to four erect, widely bell-shaped pink to rose flowers with three sepals and three sometimes irregularly-toothed and sometimes fringed petals, Plummer's mariposa lily has an interior which is covered with long yellow hairs. Calochortus plummerae produces thin, branching stems and a few long curling, mostly basal leaves which grow to 16 inches long and 1/2 inches wide and are usually withered at the time of flowering.

Atop the stem is a lily bloom, and the petals it features are pink, lavender, or white with a wide yellow band across the middle. The center contains large whitish or yellowish anthers. The fruit capsule is up to 3.2

inches long.

Strikingly beautiful, this type of mariposa lily inhabits dry, rocky slopes, brushy areas and



openings in chaparral below 5,000 feet. It may occasionally be found in coastal sage scrub to yellow pine forest from the Santa Monica Mountains to the San Jacintos, and blooms from May to July. It is described in the Jepson Manual as rare. The California Native Plant Society ranks this species in their list 1B: plants rare, threatened, or endangered

in California and elsewhere. The plants of List 1B are rare throughout their range with the majority of them endemic to California. The numbers of observed Plummer mariposa lilies have declined significantly over the last century.

The species is named in honor of American botanist Sara Plummer Lemmon.

Calochortus plummerae is distinct from the mariposa lily: calochortus leichtlinii, an-



other flower about which there was a previous article in the *Sentinel's* county wildlife column.

Less Accountability: Measure L makes city government less accountable to voters. Currently, our elected City Attorney, City Clerk and City Treasurer are directly responsible to the voters. Measure L takes power away from your directly elected mayor, and gives it to an appointed city manager. Today, the mayor is the CEO of the city, chosen by you, and responsible to you, the

voters. Measure L makes the city manager the CEO and realigns power away from the people, away from their elected mayor, to a politically appointed, non-elected, bureaucrat.

In 2009 the City of Bell was exposed for paying outrageously excessive salaries to their appointed city officials - including \$787,000 to the city manager. The cities of Beaumont and Moreno Valley have since joined Bell in being exposed for corruption - each of these cities ap-

point their city attorneys who work for those who hire them, politicians, not the people. The appointed city attorney in Bell allegedly signed off on \$900,000 in loans to city officials.

We believe that taking away voter choice reduces accountability to the people and increases exposure to mismanagement and corruption similar to that alleged in Bell, Beaumont and Moreno Valley.

ti-nepotism rules that went into the city code appeared to be aimed at both her and Frank Gonzales, who, according to legend once had 32 of his family members on the city payroll. There had been some discomfiture, as well, back in the early 2000s, when Sarah Zamora was a city councilwoman and her husband was the city's top

planning and land use official. Before leaving office, Sarah Zamora opposed the proposed ethics package. When that anti-nepotism provision came up for a vote in December 2014, Sarah and David Zamora's daughter, Summer Zamora Jorrin voted against it.

At this juncture, Sarah Zamora wants back onto the council. If she is successful, she will create a situation in which the image that has long plagued Colton - that of

a backwater hick town in which cronyism and nepotism has interfered with good governance - will be resurrected. Handicapping the race between Sara Zamora and Suchil offers some degree of delight. The most charitable way to characterize Suchil is to say that he is mercurial. His political foes call him inconsistent. Certainly there are paradoxical elements to his approach. He is well known for making statements which auger he is

leaning in one direction and he will then vote opposite of his presumed commitment. In carrying out what appears to be a sincere analysis to augment the deliberative process, he often applies a logic that is peculiarly his own. Professionally, he is a sheriff's deputy and as such is already eligible to draw an extremely generous pension upon retirement, one that will give him three percent *Continued on Page 20*


mer, with hints of transparency as well as bare arms. The boys saw a lot of legs this summer! Pretty, thin dresses were perfect in the summer

of his highest salary as a sheriff's deputy times the number of years he has been employed with the sheriff's department. This puts him squarely in the camp of public employees targeted as the villains by those engaged in an effort to effectuate public employee salary reform. Yet Suchil himself has labeled public employees, and those employed in Colton in particular, as overpaid. Some see in this an admirable frankness. Others, in particular public employees and the public employee unions, see his attitude in a less favorable light. Whether those public employee unions will seize the day and link up with Sarah

Zamora, who is a recipient of fifty percent of the generous pension allotment provided to her husband while he was still living for the rest of her life, is an open question. If Sarah Zamora can capture hefty union support, she will perhaps be able to continue the electoral pattern that Suchil has established so far: win election (2004), lose the race for reelection (2008); win election (2012). If this pattern holds, Suchil is scheduled to lose in 2016. Whether he can break that pattern will be decided by the voters in November. Even though Suchil joined with Summer Zamora Jorin in voting against the ethics reform package that contained the anti-nepotism clause, Suchil appears well-positioned to

capitalize on the crest of anti-nepotism sentiment that could assist his candidacy, in that a victory by his opponent would put a mother and daughter on the council together.

Councilman David Toro, who has the luxury of not having to stand for reelection this year, not surprisingly, is supporting the two incumbents running this year. Toro called for Frank Navarro's reelection, saying he "has made a major difference to the city." Conversely, he dismissed Chastain's mayoralty as one during which "the city and council was divided at its worst in Colton history."

Of Suchil, Toro said, he "has helped to make a lot of improvements in his district and helped bring unity and positive momentum to the

city as a whole." Sarah Zamora's tenure leading the city, Toro said, was plagued by "lack of knowledge and poor decisions." He said that at one point several Councilmembers had become so discontented with Sarah Zamora's conduct that she was "asked to resign as mayor."

Toro offered no direct endorsement of Bruce Bennett, Kirk Larson or Jack Woods, though he said Bennett would carry on in the tradition of his wife if he were elected. Toro made clear he was no supporter of John Mitchell, saying he was "part of the divisiveness" of the Chastain era.

That Toro has swung his support to his current colleagues may or may not auger well for them. Some years, Colton voters have been very supportive of in-

cumbents and the status quo. At other times, they have made radical house cleanings, and incumbency and the support of the establishment has proven more of a hindrance to the city's politicians.

In the meantime, former council member Susan Oliva appears to be working behind the scenes in an effort to further the candidacies of Chastain, Mitchell and Zamora. Word has reached the Sentinel that she has made phone calls looking to drum up support for the three challengers.

An obvious question is how active the city's public employee unions will be in this race. A major issue for those unions is keeping a relative stasis in terms of employment and the avoidance of layoffs.

Last December the city council was on the brink of declaring a fiscal emergency. This June, however, the city's voters approved Measure D, to increase the electric utility general fund transfer by an overwhelming margin with 5,161 votes in favor, or 76.2 percent.

At this point the city appears to be at relative peace, and the city's employees are not likely to be subject to layoffs and may even continue to see some modest pay raises in the future. To make a pointed stand in supporting challengers against incumbents in the upcoming council races may not be in those employees' long term interest.
