Redlands Balks Before Developing One Of Its Last Agricultural Properties

One of the last remaining patches of agriculturally-zoned land in Redlands escaped being slated for conversion into a housing tract this week, though that evasion of what appears to be the inevitable is very likely only temporary.

The city's planning staff had laid the groundwork for the Redlands Planning Commission on Tuesday night to

make a recommendation to the city council that it eliminate the agricultural zoning on 20 acres north of Lugonia Avenue and South of Pennsylvania Avenue an eighth of a mile east of Judson Street, and deem it suitable for residential development.

Such recommendations by the planning commission are routinely complied with by

the city council, which has the ultimate administrative authority in the city. Though there are Redlands residents who decry the ongoing eradication of the remaining vestiges of Redlands' once-thriving agricultural operations, as section after section, quarter section after quarter section and acre after acre give way to both commercial and resi-

dential development, the momentum toward urbanization in Redlands, as virtually everywhere else in San Bernardino County, the Inland Empire, Southern California and California in general, appears unstoppable. What temporarily saved roughly 30 acres in Redlands from the earthmovers this week was not any sentiment on the part of the planning

commission members to preserve what was once a citrus grove, but rather a concern that an archaeological study relating to the property in question and a cataloging of what might be buried beneath it was not thorough enough.

The terms of and rationale for the proposed zone change, which is intended to facilitate the development of **See P 2**

Over 100 Are Excluded From Chambers As Upland Solons Vote To Up Water Rates

Six weeks after abruptly postponing a public hearing relating to the City of Upland's move to institute a 57 percent increase in the price its residents will pay for water over the next five years, the city council held that hearing Monday night. In doing so, it received input from eleven residents who spoke on the topic while excluding over 100 others from the meeting chambers, the entrance to which was blocked by five police officers who barred those who sought to gain access to the building, and effectively thwarted the efforts of those outside City Hall to communicate with those inside. Without gathering input from the full complement of city residents wishing to weigh in on the matter, the council then voted 4-to-1 to institute the water rate hikes.

The issue of water use, availability, ownership and price is a controversial one in Upland, which lies on an alluvial expanse and watershed just below the foothills at the base of 10,064-foot elevation Mt. San Antonio, also known as Mt. Baldy, and 8,696-foot elevation Ontario Peak. A water rich environment, the community of Upland prospered historically in no small measure because of the availability of that resource and the success its settlers and succeeding generations had in tapping into the streams cascading down San Antonio Canyon as well as the constantly replenishing local aquifer. DA Pressuring Attorneys' Union President To Use PAC Money To Attack Opponent

The *Sentinel* has received a report that district attorney Mike Ramos this morning made an overture to the president of the county's public attorneys' union, requesting that the union coordinate an independent expenditure from its political action committee with his current reelection campaign, an

act which some members of the union believe constitutes a criminal conspiracy.

This year, Ramos, who was first elected district attorney in 2002 and was reelected without opposition in 2006 and handily reelected in 2010 and 2014, is facing the most serious challenge of his political career in the form of the candi-

dacy of Jason Anderson, a former prosecutor with the district attorney's office under Ramos and Ramos' predecessor as district attorney, Dennis Stout. Anderson, who has electoral experience as a one-time member of the Ontario City Council, is putting on an energetic campaign effort, having raised more money than Ramos, who

in years past used his power of incumbency to bank funds and preclude his opponents from convincing donors to back them. Anderson, however, in embarking on his current effort quietly assembled commitments of crucial support from a host of donors, many of whom represent the business community on the county's west end, in-

cluding firms, businesses and investors in Ontario, Rancho Cucamonga, Upland and Chino Hills. Meanwhile, the political machine that Ramos has relied upon throughout his career, one that is comprised primarily of business interests based in or residing in or around Redlands, has atrophied, with many of its members **See P 2**

San Bernardino Mayoral Candidate Malmuth Wants More Innovation & Less Self-Interest At City Hall

Dan Malmuth says he is running for San Bernardino mayor "in order to continue the process of innovation and implementation of the long delayed additional structural changes that were commenced by the recent revision of the city charter, and reduce the detrimental self-interests and competitiveness of senior city leaders. The recent city charter revisions shifted the balance of power from the

city council to the mayor and further structural changes are required to redistribute some of the

Malmuth contends he is qualified to hold the position of mayor "based on my work experience and education, having worked for 19 years as a municipal government management analyst for the City of Los Angeles," with both **See P 3**

Adelanto Mayor Pinning His Hopes On Jeannette To Reestablish His Ruling Coalition

Adelanto Mayor Richard Kerr's political game plan consists of keeping city manager Gabriel Elliott suspended until after the June election, at which point the mayor has hope that planning commissioner Joy Jeannette will emerge victorious in the special city council race coinciding with this year's California Primary, sources close to Kerr have told

the *Sentinel*.

Kerr has strong reason to believe that Jeannette will join with him and councilman John Woodard in helping him reestablish the ruling council coalition he used to dominate the city for nearly three years but which was lost with the demise of former councilman Jermaine Wright.

Kerr was elected mayor along with Wood-

ard and Charley Glasper in a clean sweep in the November 2014 election, which saw former mayor Cari Thomas and councilmen Steve Baisden and Charles Valvo displaced. In short order, Kerr, with the solid backing of Wright and Woodard, and the more tentative support of Glasper, set about seeking to revitalize the city economically, no small task given

that the previous council led by Thomas and then-city manager Jim Hart had in June 2013 declared the city was in a state of fiscal emergency, which was considered to be a precursor to seeking bankruptcy protection. A central element to Kerr's revitalization plans consisted of using that provision of California's 1996 Proposition 215/Compassionate

Use of Marijuana Act that would allow the city to host venues for selling and/or producing marijuana for medical use. Initially bypassing the concept of allowing dispensaries at which cannabis was to be sold to end users to set up shop, the council majority, with councilman Ed Camargo in opposition, moved toward massive scale agricultur- **See P 17**

105 single-family homes on just under 39 acres, were delineated in a report by Emily Elliott, a senior planner with the city. The 38-plus acres, according to Elliott, are comprised of four parcels, two of which are zoned agricultural and two of which bear "residential estate" zoning.

Elliott called upon the planning commission to accommodate the project applicant, Newland Homes, LLC, so that, Elliot said, "two contiguous parcels totaling approximately 19 acres (identified as Assessor's Parcel Numbers 0168-161-06-0000 and 0168-161-07-0000) will change from agricultural (A-1) zoning to planned residential development/residential estate (PRD/R-E) district zoning; two adjacent parcels (APNs 0168-161-04-0000 and 0168-161-05-0000) to-

taling approximately 19.5 acres will change from residential estate (R-E) zoning to planned residential development/residential estate (PRD/R-E) district zoning. The four parcels making up the project site are owned by multiple individuals not affiliated with the developer, and the applicant has each property in escrow or under contract. One parcel (APN 0168-161-07-0000) is a citrus grove owned and operated by the City of Redlands. The applicant has entered into an option agreement and purchase and sale agreement with the city to obtain this parcel with the intent of incorporating the citrus grove into the planned residential development where the grove would continue to be preserved. Upon recordation of the tract map, the agreement states that ownership of the parcel will be transferred back to the City of Redlands. The agreement further stipulates the ongoing maintenance of the citrus grove parcel will be funded by the project via annexation into the community facilities district."

Assessor's Parcel Number 0168-161-06-

0000 is not currently being used for agricultural purposes but has a remnant dwelling unit and accessory structures related to the prior agricultural use. Both that parcel and the active grove property are zoned for agricultural use.

There is some degree of unresolved contradiction in the planning commission's recommendation. The planning commission recommended that the city council carry out an "agricultural preserve removal" for Assessor's Parcel District 0168-161-06-0000, the dormant agricultural land. And the panel also called upon the city council to carry out a "Williamson Act removal for an approximately 10-acre parcel, Assessor's Parcel Number 0168-161-05-0000," which currently carries the residential estate zoning." Despite the zoning designation, that property is currently restricted from development by its status of inclusion under the Williamson Act, a 1965 law that was intended to preserve California farmland and to serve as a hedge against urban sprawl. The law granted

substantial tax breaks to property owners agreeing to restrict their land to agricultural uses for at least 10 years. Assessor's Parcel Number 0168-161-05-0000 is also known as the Patel property.

According to Elliott, "In order to allow for development of the project, the agricultural status of the land must be changed to allow for the proposed residential use. The first step toward designating the site for residential use is the cancellation of the existing Williamson Act contract on the Patel property (APN 0168-161-05)." Significantly, that property lies outside the property currently zoned for agricultural use.

Thus, under the planning commission's recommendation, the city will allow roughly two thirds of approximately 29 acres currently zoned or otherwise preserved for agricultural use to lose its status as agricultural property and be developed. Simultaneously, Elliott asserts that the grove will be preserved into "perpetuity." In a codicil to the staff report, Elliott stated, "Staff received an offer from Newland Homes, LLC to purchase a 9.33

acre city-owned citrus grove (APN 0168 161-07) in June 2017. Concurrently, the applicant submitted a development application to subdivide approximately 39.84 acres into 103 residential lots for future single family development. This application was later revised to 105 lots as a result of finalizing transaction negotiations. The applicant's intent is to include the citrus grove property in the tentative tract map application, thereby incorporating the grove into the project. With recordation of the map, the grove would be dedicated back to the city and the city would continue to farm the

grove in perpetuity. On November 15, 2017, the city council authorized quality of life [division] staff to prepare an option agreement and purchase and sale agreement. The option agreement provides Newland Homes with exclusive rights to purchase the property from the city."

At the December 5, 2017 Redlands City Council meeting, according to Elliott, the city approved the option agreement and the purchase and sale agreement "The option agreement grants Newland the exclusive right to purchase the property by June 1, 2018 [at a] purchase price of \$1.9 million, [a] due diligence period of 60 days [with a requirement that] the property must close prior to December 31, 2018, a farming easement granted to the city to allow continued farming operations following the purchase of the property; and [an understanding that] the property would be dedicated back to the city after the final map is approved and or if/when the tentative map were to expire," Elliott wrote in the codicil to the report. "In addition to the city council entering into the option agreement, the council also moved to authorize staff to process the development application. This is necessary to allow processing of the development application prior to Newland Homes taking ownership of the city's property."

Rather than requiring Newland to carry out a full-fledged environmental impact re-

having moved into retirement, passed on or lost interest in politics in general.

At the beginning of the year, Ramos had \$120,236 in his political coffers. Since that time, through April 21, he spent \$88,567.99, including payments to his campaign consultant Dave Ellis for his services, to do polling, and for signs. Since January 1, Ramos has raised \$28,154 in donations, and as of April 21 had \$59,822.01 on hand to move forward with the rest of his campaign.

By contrast, Anderson who had no money in his campaign account on January 1,

raised \$140,176 through April 21. In that same timeframe, he spent \$46,911.75. As of April 21, some six weeks before the election, he had \$93,264.25 remaining in

his political war chest. Additionally, credible reports are that an independent expenditure committee, Business Leaders for Fair and Ethical Government, which is active in this year's election cycle oriented against Ramos and favorable toward Anderson, has already raised \$587,000, a substantial portion of which has been spent on signs,

mailers and newspaper ads. Donors have made commitments to endow an \$860,000 budget for that committee, including the money that has already been donated.

In recent weeks, Ramos has seen growing indications of the political juggernaut he is up against, as high propensity voters throughout the county have been receiving mailers both in support of Anderson and assailing Ramos' performance in office and his character.

This morning, the *Sentinel* is informed, Ramos summoned the president of the San Bernardino County Public Attorneys Association, Doug Poston, to the district attorney's office's executive suite on the sixth floor of the county building at 303 West Third Street in Downtown San Bernardino. Using desperate terms that were both pleading

and demanding, Ramos called upon Poston to use a sizeable chunk of the \$750,000 available through the public attorneys' union's political action committee to

form an independent expenditure committee to fund an attack mailer campaign against Anderson. The request was an audacious one, since by law, independent expenditure committees are prohibited from coordinating with the candidates they support or the campaigns of the candidates they support in making such independent expenditures. In

addition to Ramos, the sixth floor suite is occupied by the district attorney's executive staff, two assistant district attorneys, the office's deputy chief district attorneys, the office's top investigator and the office's public spokesman. All of those employed there are sworn to uphold the law. A request such as the one made to Poston, who holds the position of lead deputy district attorney with the district attorney's office's consumer and environmental protection unit, could qualify as an element of a conspiracy.

The San Bernardino County Public Attorneys Association is the bargaining unit for the county's deputy district attorneys and the county's deputy public defenders.

Efforts to reach Poston and Ramos by press time were unsuccessful.

the Los Angeles Department of Water and Power and the city's aviation division, known as Los Angeles World Airports. He further cited his "23 years of employment in the advertising and feature film production industries. I worked as a television producer for many major advertising agencies and mid-sized film production companies in Los Angeles and New York, and later as a movie producer and feature film production executive in the feature film division of Columbia Pictures, Paramount Pictures, Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer, Universal Pictures, and Warner Brothers" with a slew of big name actors "on film projects with budgets well over \$100 million dollars. I have served as a commissioner on the City of San Bernardino Arts Commission and the Historical Preservation Commission."

Malmuth says "I am distinguished from my opponents for the position of San Bernardino mayor by my more directly suitable skills in municipal government analysis and management, and long term entrepreneurial experience in high budget communications media and entertainment projects. None of my opponents possess the structural understanding or desire to undertake the necessary fine tuning of the current mechanism of city government to bring about an inherently more efficient, economically

productive, and democratically participatory municipal government. I am a pro-business-development-and less-government-restrictions Democrat and I am in agreement with the latest publication of the platform positions of the Democratic Party, which I believe are more suitable to improving the future conditions of the City of San Bernardino than the Republican and Independent platforms of my opponents."

Continuing, Malmuth said, "I believe that the major issues facing the City of San Bernardino regarding dysfunctional management, leadership, wasteful spending, and ineffective revenue enhancement stem from a lack of effective resident input and participation. The current \$600-per year part-time San Bernardino City Council members are inefficient and have brought about the creation of city council member private consultancy businesses that are ethically questionable. For example, one issue involves councilman John Valdivia's publicly available Form 700 indicating a \$300 gift from Cole Burr, the CEO of Burrtec Waste Management, and Mr. Valdivia and Mr. Burr having had ongoing dealings with one another through Mr. Valdivia's outside consultancy, yet Mr. Valdivia did not seem to possess the ethical responsibility to recuse himself from the recent San Bernardino City Council vote to increase the Burrtec waste collection city rates, which would have been the proper thing to do even

though the legal limit on gifts is \$470. The city is just getting back on its feet financially and faces a delicate period, and Mr. Valdivia's past unusual voting record of consistent "no" votes on matters coming before the city council is troubling and portends stagnancy if he were to obtain the office of mayor. Mr. Valdivia's past close connections that included substantial financial campaign contributions from the San Bernardino police and fire departments, and their overdone charter-required salaries, affects his judgment to the detriment of the city, in my opinion.

"Another major issue example," Malmuth added, "involves the lack of political understanding and leadership of Mayor Davis, who has consistently failed to create innovative ideas and apply his background as an accountant accurately, as demonstrated by his failure to accurately add up the figures of the recently considered city budget and causing a wasteful duplication of the administrative passage process," Malmuth added. "I also believe that the issue of failing to completely observe the fundamental rule of the separation of church and state by Mayor Davis, and some others in the city government leadership, has harmed the city. Mayor Davis has included the words "church leader" in his campaign literature and I believe that he has not kept his personal views apart from the marijuana implementation initiative, which was endorsed by the electorate and has

been improperly stalled by some of the city leaders."

To come to terms with the challenges the city faces, Malmuth said, city leaders need to "compartmentalize each area for rectification and improvement through the creation of a number of San Bernardino resident-staffed deputy city mayor positions, as has been done in the city of Los Angeles. In addition, the various San Bernardino city commissions need to be reformulated from a currently mandated advisory role, supervised by attending respective city department heads, to an independent, qualified resident commissioner's recommended vote role request to be approved by the mayor."

Malmuth suggested the city can redress the problem of homelessness through the creation of "cargo container home conversion villages." He called for physically transporting to other cities "ex-convicts dumped in San Bernardino by prisons." He said the city needs to concentrate on street repairs and improvements, senior resident care, putting newspaper sale boxes throughout the city to promote communication, promoting business and job creation and generating revenue through selling advertising on bus shelters, and the "implementation of concession-run electric bicycles and scooters charging stations to be used by street beat-type police officers and residents." He called for utilizing the city's currently accumulated \$40 million surplus to fund pro-

grams, and ceasing the "write-off of significant uncollected debts." He recommended "reconnecting the old military railroad spur that used to attach the now-named San Bernardino International Airport to the national railroad system to bring lucrative passenger and cargo traffic to the proprietary airport and increase large amounts of spill-off revenue to the City of San Bernardino."

Furthermore, Malmuth said, "The beautiful historic buildings and colorful neighborhoods of San Bernardino are not being effectively presented to the heads of the nearby six major movie studios in Hollywood to attract more big budget feature filming and positive publicity for San Bernardino by someone with the skills of an experienced movie producer."

Outlining shortcomings he sees in city operations, Malmuth said, "The proprietary status of the San Bernardino Municipal Water Department needs to be examined, since the city of San Bernardino basically sits atop an underground lake and the water department has been filling its coffers to excess with sales of huge quantities of excess water to other nearby municipalities and entities, while at the same time raising water rates for residents and not voluntarily sharing the large amounts of revenue with the City of San Bernardino, as the proprietary City of Los Angeles Department of Water and Power has been doing with the City of Los Angeles for many decades. Also, the head

of the San Bernardino Community Development Department is not encouraging the building of airport-connected businesses on the city side of the airport fence to increase city revenue, since proprietary revenue inside the fence is not able to be shared with the City of San Bernardino under Federal Aviation Authority regulations. The head of community development is instead concentrating on a misguided high rise downtown development on 46 acres of land that sits atop the semi-liquid soil of an underground lake and directly over the San Andreas fault line."

Malmuth has lived in San Bernardino since 2010, having first moved to San Bernardino County in 2005.

Malmuth is a graduate of Wingate High School in Brooklyn, New York. He obtained a bachelor's degree in political science, psychology and English literature from the City University of New York before attending law classes at Syracuse University Law School, New York, St. John's University Law School, New York and California State University, Los Angeles. He is a screenwriter and producer.

Unmarried and without children, Malmuth said this leaves him "with the consequent available time to be a full time, dedicated mayor of the City of San Bernardino."

in Upland but the surrounding communities over the last five decades has outrun the capacity of what has become an archaic water system once utilized for both agricultural cultivation and domestic use.

The City of Upland operates the utility which supplies its

residents and businesses with their water. The city owns nine wells with a total production capacity of 8,463 gallons per minute, and is a 68 percent shareholder in the San Antonio Water Company, which operates seven wells with a total production capacity of 8,100 gallons per minute. The city also has use rights to water drawn at four wells owned by the West End Consolidated Water Company within the

boundaries of Upland, which together have a 3,075 gallon per minute production capability. For decades, Upland city officials skirted California law, which requires that revenue generated by a municipality's water operations from the sale of water to the municipality's residents, businesses and landowners be held in a sequestered account and used strictly to fund water acquisition, water ser-

vice operations and the upkeep, maintenance, improvement and expansion of the water system. Revenue generated by the city's water enterprise has been diverted to fund other elements of the city's operations and costs, including paying for increases in salaries and benefits to city employees, as well as covering the escalating cost of paying for the pensions of retired municipal employees. This diversion

of water division money has resulted in an ongoing repeated neglect of maintenance of the city's water service infrastructure. While city officials now claim water rate increases are necessary to carry out needed system upgrades and repair critically eroded and dilapidating reservoirs, cisterns, mains, pipes, and other appurtenances, a cross section of city residents feels the city council should

show greater backbone in curtailing what they perceive as overly generous salaries, benefits and pension commitments to current employees, and use that money to pay for the water system maintenance and upgrades.

In January, the city sent out with its water bills notice that the city council would hold a hearing at its regularly

Number Of Homeless In SB County Increased 13.5 Percent Since Last Year

The number of homeless in San Bernardino County, as documented in the official annual census of the dispossessed taken by a cooperative of local governmental entities and volunteers, is on the rise. According to the 2018 San Bernardino County Point-In-Time Count, which was conducted this year on January 25, there were 2,118 persons throughout the 20,105-square mile county without a permanent place to live. That represented an increase of 252, or 13.5 percent, over the 1,866 so-called “subpopulation” around the county tabulated in a similar January 2017 count.

As was the case last year, the City of San Bernardino was the single jurisdiction with the highest number of unsheltered. Redlands, which held the dubious distinction of holding second place in the homeless number sweepstakes last year, dropped to third place this year, switching with Victorville, which last year had the third largest homeless tally but this year had the county’s second most. Upland remained in fourth place. Meanwhile, Ontario which last year was tied for fifth, was surpassed by Barstow, which moved into fifth place, Ontario thus dropped into being host to the sixth largest homeless population in the county this year; and Rialto, which was tied with Ontario last year, dropped to eighth, eclipsed by Fontana, which moved up to seventh.

In descending order, the homeless populations of the county’s cities/unincorporated communities were: San Bernardino: 646; Victorville: 263; Redlands: 143; Upland: 125; Barstow: 93; Ontario: 90; Fontana: 72; Rialto: 71; Rancho Cucamonga: 64; Yucca Valley: 59; Highland: 49; Loma Linda: 46; Colton: 42; Adelanto: 30; Chino: 28; Hesperia: 27; Twentynine Palms: 20; Joshua Tree: 19; Crestline: 18; Apple Valley: 17; Needles: 11; Yucaipa: 11; Chino Hills: 10; Montclair: 8; Muscoy: 7; Bloomington: 7; Chino Hills: 6; Morongo Valley: 4; Phelan: 4; Running Springs: 3; and Grand Terrace: 1.

The federal government uses the annual point in time count to apportion federal funds intended to deal with homelessness.

According to officials with the San Bernardino County Department of Behavioral Health, which operates an outreach arm known as the office of homeless services, the county in the last year has seen a 12.6 percent increase in the number of homeless veterans, a 23 percent increase in the number of unaccompanied women and an uptick of more than 96 percent in unsheltered families.

The statistics indicated that a significant portion of the county’s homeless are recently destitute, as the survey showed that while the overall numbers increased in the county, there was an 18 percent decrease in the chronically homeless population. *-Mark Gutglueck*

scheduled March 12 meeting with regard to the water rate hikes the city was proposing. On March 8, the Thursday before that Monday night meeting, the city posted the agenda for the March 12 meeting, in which the hearing on the water rate hikes and a possible vote of the council to impose those increases was listed as Item 12B. That hearing, according to the agenda, was designated as the “time and place” for the public to weigh in on the proposed rate hikes. When a near-capacity crowd showed up on the evening of March 12, Upland Mayor Debbie Stone made a unilateral decision to cancel the hearing and put it off until April 23. As she made that announcement, however, she offered an assurance that anyone who had come to the meeting that night who would not be able to be in attendance on April 23 could provide input that night. After one resident, Steve Carvalho, took Stone up on that assurance, Stone reneged on that commitment when city attorney Jim Markman remarked that by the terms of her statement, Stone was inviting too many people to speak to the matter that evening. “If 40 other people want to get up and speak to it, it’s no longer appropriate for this time of the agenda,” Markman said. Thereafter, Stone went back on her promise to allow those present that night to provide input on the matter, and she shut off the microphone of anyone mentioning the water rate issue or water at all. City manager Bill Manis pronounced any citizens who insisted on addressing the water issue as “out of order,” and vectored acting police captain Marco Blanco to approach the speaker’s podium to effect the arrest of anyone who attempted to again broach the subject. Blanco obliged Manis and called in four patrol units from the city’s streets to City Hall, which effectively dissuaded any further members of the public from speaking with regard to the issue that city officials had invited them there that evening to discuss.

On April 23, Monday night, nearly twice as many members of the public who had attended the March 12 meeting were on hand. Most arrived in the council chambers between the hour of 6 p.m., at which time the city council had adjourned into a closed session being held in a backroom at City Hall, and 7 p.m., at which time the council’s public session was scheduled to start. By the time the council emerged from its closed session, more spectators were present within the council chambers and the City Hall foyer than are permitted under the fire code, while scores more were waiting outside the entrance to City Hall. Eight police officers were summoned and, assisted by some county fire department personnel who were on hand, they prevailed upon more than fifty people to leave the meeting chambers. Five officers were then stationed immediately outside the entrance of City Hall, tasked with turning away anyone who attempted to enter City Hall. Initially, the crowd outside the doors of City Hall milling about the civic center concrete commons containing the veterans memorial between City Hall to the north and the library to the south numbered approximately 180. By 8 o’clock, there were yet 117 people outside awaiting an opportunity to go inside. Dual lines, fanning out eastward from the east sliding door entrance to City Hall and westward from the west sliding door entrance to City Hall, formed. The police on station would allow those at the head of either line to enter the building only upon, and in correspondence to, a like number leaving the building.

The meeting, which entailed its usual ceremonial introductions, festivities and exchanges at the outset, was nearly 15 minutes late in beginning because of the need to clear the requisite number of people from the room so as to not exceed the capacity of the meeting chambers specified in the city’s fire code.

Once the proceedings advanced to the consideration of the water rate increase, the city’s public works director, Rosemary Hoerning, and Pierce Rossum, a financial analyst with the firm of Carollo Engineers Inc., which has analyzed the city’s water situation and formulated both a game plan to provide the physical improvements to the water system to meet the city’s water delivery needs as well as a financing plan to defray the cost of those improvements, told the city council that the water rate increases were necessary to defray the costs of making a number of critical infrastructure improvements, the most pressing of which is the replacement of a four-decade-old water reservoir with a 7.5 million gallon capacity located at 17th Street and Benson Avenue. The city’s water fund reserves are nearing depletion, the council was informed. Revenue based upon the rate increases implemented in 2014 is inadequate because water conservation mandates and voluntary cutbacks in water use by customers has resulted in diminished use in households city-wide and accompanying lower water bills. Moreover, the city is facing water acquisition costs that officials say run to \$2.4 million more per year than what the city was paying for water a decade ago.

Pierce Rossum iterated the need to institute the 17 percent rate increase this year, which he said will prevent the city from going \$1 million in the hole over the next year of operations, to be followed by increases in 2019 and 2020 of 9 percent each, then 5 percent in 2021 and 3 percent in 2022. Those rate increases are the maximum hikes allowed under California law. The rate structure will involve water being sold by the 100 cubic feet unit and three tiers of cost. Those on the first tier confining their water use to twenty 100 cubic feet units or less per billing cycle will be billed at the lowest rate of \$1.76 per 100 cubic feet of water unit used beginning May 1; thereafter that below-threshold unit rate will increase to \$1.91 on January 1, 2019, \$2.07 on January 1, 2020; \$2.18 on January 1, 2021; and \$2.34 on January 1, 2022. Water used beyond the 20 unit threshold and up to 50 units will move the customer to the second tier, such that water will cost \$2.32 per 100 cubic foot unit beginning May 1, 2018; \$2.52 as of January 1, 2019, \$2.73 as of January 1, 2020; \$2.87 as of January 1, 2021; and \$2.96 as of January 1, 2022. Cost on water use beyond 50 units will increase to \$2.78 per 100 cubic foot unit as of May 1, 2018; \$3.01 on January 1, 2019; \$3.26 on January 1, 2020; \$3.43 on January 1, 2021; and \$3.54 on January 1, 2022.

The rate increase includes a fixed bi-monthly charge for those using the system with 5/8s inch pipe, the type used by virtually all of Upland’s domestic water users, set at \$46.90 as of April 1, 2018; \$52.25 as of January 1, 2019; \$57.85 as of January 1, 2020; \$60.80 as of January 1, 2021; and \$62.75 as of January 1, 2022.

And Rossum said the city would also need to levy a “demand surcharge” to get the city over its current financial hump.

Roughly speaking, each household in Upland will experience a \$19 to \$20 increase on each bi-monthly bill this year and a \$10 to \$11 increase on top of that beginning in January 2019.

Rossum said that if some of the pressing issues the city is now facing with regard to water division operations are alleviated, it is possible that the rate increases in the coming years may not need to be as hefty as the ones outlined and that the council could decide then to reduce the rate increases accordingly. Rossum said he was just “trying to set the stage so you have the revenue that you need. If you don’t need it down the road, then you don’t need the second year of

port detailing what the various effects of the project will be and the ecological implication of going forward with the development proposal, Elliott called for the city through the planning commission and the city council to use what is called a “negative declaration” to provide environmental certification for the project. Without cataloging those impacts, the negative declaration preempts doing a survey of the state of the property and laying out with considerable precision what measures the developer must take to redress those impacts.

“An initial study/ mitigated negative declaration has been recommended for the project, as there are no environmental factors that cannot be mitigated to a level of less than significant,” according to Elliott. “Mitigation measures have been included in conditions of approval for the project.”

While paperwork prepared for the planning commission contains a recommendation that the approval of the Newland development proposal contain a commitment “in perpetuity” that the orange grove be preserved intact, the panel’s erasure of the Williamson Act protection and the adjacent property’s agricultural use preserve status has given rise to a belief that a future city council will abrogate that “in perpetuity” commitment and allow the property to be developed at some indefinite point.

The overall density of the proposed development would be 2.64 units per acre, including the grove property. The project would preserve 9.35 acres of the land for the continuing growing of citrus trees and a total of 11.2 acres of open space.

One Redlands resident, Amanda Frye, decried the city’s piecemeal eradication of its

once thriving agricultural districts.

“There is no replacement for valuable agriculture soil which took millions of years to make,” said Frye. “Just because a field is fallow, it does not lose agricultural value. A negative declaration on the Newland Homes project is fraudulent and misrepresentation by staff who obviously does not understand the nature or value of agriculture land. Houses can be built on already-built areas. This project is inappropriate.”

Frye said there are economic reasons to keep land traditionally used for raising food intact.

“Agriculture is a \$40 billion to \$70 billion annual business,” she said. “The land is like a bank, which with appropriate management can be very prosperous with high interest yields. Changing the zoning is against trends. If you read the Wall Street Journal or other national news, you can see top dollar is being paid for residents to live in agricultural-based communities and agricultural share areas emphasizing locally grown food. The trend toward local grown food is everywhere.”

Maintaining a modicum of agricultural property in an increasingly urban environment contributes to the overall quality of life by keeping neighborhoods and municipal district more livable, Frye said.

“Redlands is becoming an extremely unpleasant place to live, guided by bad management and inappropriate planning,” she said. “Destroying more agriculture land and replacing it with built structures is against the cutting edge trends which involve reviving local agriculture.”

Undoing the Williamson protection for the area is shortsighted, Frye said. “The U.S. Department of Agriculture just released yet another soils map, which obviously planning staff does not use,” she said. “Williamson Conservation easements must be approved by the state.

Removing this land from agriculture status is bad planning according to the California Code.”

Commissioner Steve Frasher was not in attendance at Tuesday’s meeting. Commissioner Conrad Guzkowski did not participate in the discussion with regard to the Newland proposal, saying he was purchasing a parcel across Pennsylvania Avenue near the proposed development site.

While the planning commission ultimately held off on validating the mitigated negative declaration prepared for the project, the panel’s rationale for not endorsing the project was not made in accordance with Frye’s sentiment against forsaking agricultural uses.

Commissioner Donn Grenda took issue with statements in the staff report relating to the Newland proposal that “There is a low potential for prehistoric sites to be found within the boundaries of the property” and “The archaeological field survey did not locate any cultural resources within the project area.”

Grenda countered, “This is wrong and clearly refuted by the photographs and text on the following pages.” He then quoted from the report: “Four abandoned cobblestone and lined irrigation ditches were also noted during the survey,” he quoted. “They have pictures of these resources. ‘They were generally located along the eastern boundary of all four parcels. Each ditch terminated in the southeast corner of their respective parcels at a cement and cobblestone collection box/weir.’ They go on to say ‘Previous studies have found that ditches and weirs do not qualify as historic resources under the California Environmental Quality Act and City of Redlands Register of Historic and Scenic Resources criteria.’ Again they cite the code. Not accurate. That is simply not true. I question whether they surveyed this property. They got photos. Somebody must have gone

out there, but they pretty much missed everything. These resources need to be mapped. They need to be evaluated. Neither has occurred in this study. My assessment is that the cultural resources evaluation is inadequate and needs to be completely redone. This inadequate study led to a misleading and in fact wrong assessment of no impact on cultural resources in the initial study conducted by the city.”

The city’s environmental review committee was recently disbanded by an act of the city council. As a consequence, the city hired a third party environmental consultant to compare the initial study for negative declaration with technical studies provided by Newland Homes. City staff reviewed the initial study, made edits and corrections, and sent it back to the consultant. Redrafted, It was released for public review. After input from the public was accepted, staff, led by Elliott, passed the mitigated negative declaration along to the planning commission.

Grenda said it appeared to him that those who drew up the archaeological and cultural resources survey done for the project property last year “relied on a 2005 report they never read. Since 2005 there has been a national [historical] registration application and approval of a ditch very close to the project area.”

Though commissioner Robert Botts, the most stridently pro-development member of the planning commission, did not seem convinced that Grenda’s expressions sufficed to offset Elliott’s call for the commission to certify the negative declaration of any unmitigateable impacts from the project, the two other members of the commission present, Julie Rynerson-Rock and commission chairwoman Carol Dyer, showed absolute deference to Grenda. An archaeologist practicing cultural resources management for 30 years,

Grenda has a PhD. in anthropology and archaeology and was for eight years a member of the State of California’s Historical Resources Commission. “It is shocking to me that there were that many ditches on this property that were not evaluated,” Grenda said. The ditches he referenced were ones which were likely trenched by Native Americans during the 19th Century, he said. “The cultural resources report was done very hastily and just missed virtually everything on the property,” Grenda said.

Rock said, “Information we have received invalidates the California Environmental Quality Act review. They have to start over. We cannot vote on it... One of our first findings is that this particular environmental documentation is valid and we at this point have pretty technical information that says it is not.”

“Dyer said, ‘There are certainly questions on the validity of this report. There’s been shadow of doubt cast on the cultural resources report

and I feel a continuance would be in the best interest to such time the questions Mr. Grenda raises are adequately answered. The staff report and the applicant can provide that. Depending how complex those answers are, that may retrigger the California Environmental Quality Act notification process and push the project out further.”

The applicant, through Elliott, sought to have the commission approve that night the portion of the staff recommendation pertaining to initiating the process to undo the Williamson Act protection for the approximately ten acres the Act still applies to. Dyer, however, said “I don’t feel comfortable pulling the Williamson Act portion of it unless we’re able to approve the tentative tract map. We can’t approve the tract map if the cultural resources are part of the environmental review.”

The commission continued further consideration of the matter until May 8.

al production of the substance for wholesale marketing to dispensaries outside the city, by permitting secured greenhouses to be established within the city’s industrial park. This resulted in a frenzy of land purchasing and leasing activity, as many would-be marijuana millionaires sought to anticipate, in many cases it turned out accurately, which areas of town would be zoned for marijuana growing operations, and they purchased properties there or entered into leases on existing buildings. The enthusiasm that Kerr, Wright, and Woodard, and to a lesser extent Glasper, displayed in embracing these cannabis-related entrepreneurs

and the degree to which some city officials appeared to be facilitating the marijuana growing

operations raised suspicions with regard to possible collusion or graft. That intensified when the council in 2016, in anticipation of the passage of Proposition 64/the Adult Use of Marijuana Act that was on the ballot that year, made preparations to expand the city’s tolerance of marijuana-related operations from cultivation facilities to ones engaged in end-use sale of the drug.

Throughout this time, the city council burned through a succession of city managers or inter-

im city managers starting with Hart, none of whom appeared willing to move quickly enough or with the requisite abandon to facilitate the granting of commercial marijuana permits and licenses on a pace that pleased Kerr, Wright and Woodard. The determination of Kerr, Wright and Woodard to get Adelanto in on the ground floor of the marijuana revolution and the con-

sequent intensified flood into City Hall of those seeking permits and licenses to market the drug, including applicants who were literally bearing briefcases full of cash, raised further con-

cerns that city officials were on the take. The validity of those concerns was vindicated when in

November 2017, Wright was arrested by the FBI and charged by the U.S. Attorney’s Office with having arranged for and accepting a bribe from an undercover FBI agent posing as an applicant for a marijuana distribution permit. Wright was incarcerated at once, and has remained locked up ever since. His absence in short order compromised Kerr’s ruling coalition, as Wright’s arrest severely chastened Glasper, whose support of Kerr’s agenda all along had been luke-

warm, at best. Glasper was no longer willing to support the unrestrained courting of marijuana-related businesses.

Wright’s arrest also had an impact on Gabriel Elliott, the city’s one-time director of development services who had been elevated less than three months previously to the position of city manager. Elliott had never been comfortable with the city’s aggressive

efforts to attract marijuana-related businesses and facilitate the approval of permit applications for such uses with only cursory vetting. Recognizing that Kerr and Woodward did not have

the requisite votes to push their energetic plan to load the city up with cannabis-related enterprises, Elliott began to resist them. And indeed, a standoff ensued, as the council, without Wright present, deadlocked 2-to-2 on a whole host of issues, with Camargo and Glasper on one side and Kerr and Woodard on the other. In December, Kerr orchestrated the filing of a set of sexual harassment complaints by city employees and an intern against Elliott. That triggered a mirroring sexual harassment complaint against Kerr from another intern with the city. The investigation into the allegations against Elliott was used as grounds to put him on paid administrative leave.

While that investigation was pending, Wright’s prolonged absence from his council duties triggered the

provisions of a state law which resulted in Wright's mandatory removal from the council position he held. To fill that void, Kerr sought to appoint planning commission chairman Chris Waggener, who has steadily supported converting Adelanto to a cannabis-based economy. But Glasper and Camargo, recognizing that if Waggener were to be installed as Wright's replacement they would be giving Kerr carte blanche

to continue with the marijuanaification of Adelanto as well as the crucial third vote needed to fire Elliott, refused to confirm Waggener. Rather, against Kerr and Woodard's wishes, the council was forced, because no consensus could be reached on an appointment, to let the matter be decided by the city's voters in the upcoming June Primary. Waggener, for whatever reason, did not throw his hat in the ring for the June 5 race. One of his planning commission colleagues, Joy Jeannette, did, however, as did Diana Esmeralda Holte and Ronald Beard.

During the last week of February and the first week of March, the dual investigations into the sexual harassment charges against Kerr and Elliott were completed, with the investigator concluding that there was insufficient evidence to sustain the complaints against either the mayor or the city manager.

Despite the investigator's determination that the accusation against Elliott did not provide grounds to either discipline or remove him, Kerr has used Elliott's suspended status to keep him at bay. Since a majority vote of the

council is required to rescind Elliott's suspension, the city manager has remained, since December, on paid administrative leave, pulling \$18,000 per month while remaining off work, forbidden from returning to his office.

On seven separate occasions, Kerr has scheduled a closed door discussion of disciplining or firing Elliott. Though he has Woodard's support in terminating Elliott, he has been unable to get Glasper or Camargo to support doing so.

When Elliott was placed on leave in December, the council sum-

moned Mike Milhiser, who was the interim city manager in the seven months prior to Elliott's hiring, to return to the city manager's post in a caretaker role. Milhiser is slated to leave effective May 1, next Wednesday. In recent weeks, Kerr has resisted calls to simply reinstate Elliott as city manager. Instead, he has been angling to have the city's director of development services, Charles Rangel, move into the post, at least on a temporary basis. This week, at the Wednesday April 25 council meeting, the council met in closed session to discuss

promoting Rangel into the city manager's position upon Milhiser's official departure. Though Kerr made his best pitch to Camargo and Glasper, neither would give him the necessary third vote to hand the keys of the city to Rangel on a temporary basis.

According to one well-placed source with a close spection of the goings-on at City Hall, Rangel is a mere stopgap measure that Kerr wants to use as a bridge to reasserting his political primacy in Adelanto. Ultimately, Kerr wants to reestablish a trajectory

9 (percent) or the third year of 9 (percent)." At this point, however, Rossum said, the financial outlook within the water division is such that "For the time being, that 17 percent increase you do need... from an operational standpoint."

After Stone opened the public hearing Monday night, April McCormick told the council, "My first issue would be after that gentleman [i.e., Rossum] came to you in 2013 and said we need to raise rates for five years and then comes back in 2018 and says 'I was \$40 million off. We need to raise them again by 57 percent,' why isn't he fired? You are telling the public you are raising the rates by 17, 9, 9, 5, 3 [percent]. That's just tier rate raising, I believe. I don't believe that includes the fixed rates of the water meters, which are also being raised. If I am correct, those two rate hikes together is a 57 percent increase to all these people. They don't know that because you haven't told them."

McCormick likened Hoerning and Rossum's claims of "pipes are breaking, reservoirs are busting open" to "the sky is falling." She said the city was using that as a pretext to set up impos-

ing rate increases that were impossible to procedurally contest. "The citizens have to get 9,500 protest letters that are very detailed and specific and submit those to you to stop you from doing this to us," said McCormick. "It would only take 7,700 signatures to recall our mayor and we'd have 120 days to do so. We get no special election." McCormick said the city denying the ratepayers an opportunity to vote on the increase was indistinguishable from the council's imposition of other decisions on the city's residents without giving them an opportunity to approve what she implied were unpopular policies. "The water?" she asked. "No vote. [The selling of a portion of] Memorial Park? No vote. Redistricting? No vote. [The outsourcing of the] Fire department? No vote."

Barbara Papa suggested the rate increases were excessive and represented government double dipping. "Governor [Jerry] Brown wants to tax our water," Papa said. "Government always gets what it wants. I was hoping you could split out the portion of our repairs and maintenance. We should just get taxed on our water consumption. I asked how much of our water is being sold to other municipalities. I was told that we don't do that lately, which I consider to not be an answer. How much of this fund for the

water department will be going toward underfunded pensions? Unlike government, residents do not have an unlimited source of income."

Marjorie Mikels told the council that by imposing the water rate increase it was seeking to have the city's residents pay for poor management and bad decisions by city officials.

"First, you sold off half of our assets and ordered a tax increase without a vote," she said. "You passed that illegal property tax without a vote of the people based on a fraudulent label of annexation. Now you want to increase the cost of life-giving water because we saved our water [in compliance with government-imposed conservation mandates in response to the drought]. Because we saved our water, you're deeming it necessary for us to have a water [rate] increase. We know that someone put trichloroethylene into one of the wells. If we have such a good police department, why don't they go out and find out who did that and get some money out of the corporation that's poisoning our water supply?"

Mikels then took aim at the city's depletion of the water fund reserves through diversions to other municipal operations. "We know you have been stealing, or borrowing, from the water fund for years, and we ought not to have to

pay twice for this water," she said. "First, as citizens of Upland we paid for all that water infrastructure one time. Then you decided, not you guys, the one [i.e., city council and management team] with [former city manager] Robb [Quincy] and [former assistant public works director] Acquanetta [Warren] decided we needed to put it in a different fund. Then you said we owed that money to the fund, so we had to increase the water rates to pay back the city for those costs. Did you make the improvements at that time? Someone wants to know how long these improvements have been needed. And how much are you paying this guy [i.e., Rossum] with some corporation to speak that stuff that nobody could follow? It's all just excuses for this water rate increase, which is because of the unfunded pension liability."

Sandy Brennaman said she supported the council in its decision to increase the rates. "We are where we are right now," she lamented, telling the audience the situation needed to be addressed. "If you want water, we have no other choice but let the city council approve this."

Clete Driver, a city resident who said he had a large yard needing irrigation and a pool, insisted that he was willing to pay more for water to guarantee its availability. He said the reservoir

at 17th and Benson is on the brink of bursting open, which he said he saw firsthand during a tour of that facility with Hoerning. "The reservoir... that thing is a disaster. Water is coming from the bottom, on top and sides. We need to understand the totality of the disaster," he said.

Nine individuals who were among those in the room when the meeting began were permitted to speak during the public hearing. Two members of the public, who had been outside previously but had gained entrance after the hearing had begun when some who were present inside left, arrived before the end of the public hearing. They were permitted to address the issue. Meanwhile, a crowd of more than 100 remained outside and were not permitted to take part in the proceedings. The city made no arrangements to provide the outside crowd with audio access to the proceedings taking place inside. Nor did the city arrange for a microphone hook-up to allow any of those outside wishing to address the matter to be heard.

After the public hearing was closed, the council discussed the issue of the rate increase and questioned Hoerning and Rossum with regard to some of the particulars.

Councilwoman Janice Elliott made a motion to approve the rate hike with the adjustment that

the current rates continue for those remaining on the first usage tier of twenty 100-cubic feet units per billing cycle or less. "My motion is to keep tier one rates at the same rate as at present, increase tiers two and three, increase meter rates and include the temporary demand surcharge," Elliott said in her proposal. None of her colleagues seconded that motion, and it died. Elliott then propounded an amended motion to cut all of the rate increases by 20 percent. That, too, did not advance for lack of a second.

Stone moved that the rates as outlined by Hoening and Rossum be approved. That elicited jeers from some members of the audience, which in turn brought a testy response from Stone. "We have to pay these same rates that you have to pay," she said. "I have over half an acre of property too I'm paying these rates for. I don't want to pay them." She insisted that the rate increases were needed to carry out system maintenance so "I don't... get a call at two o'clock in the morning that Euclid Avenue has a blowhole in the middle of it and it's going to be shut down for six months because we've got to repair the pipeline underneath it."

The council approved that motion by a vote of 4-to-1, with Elliott dissenting.

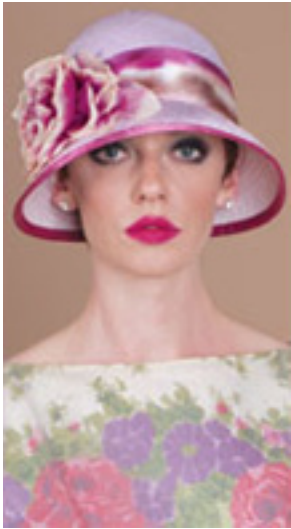

"What I know is Rich [Kerr] wants Charles [Rangel] as interim city manager," the source said. "He [Rangel] is the guy who has been filling in for Michael [Milhiser] the last few council meetings. When Gabriel [Elliott] became city manager, Charles replaced him in the planning department. Now Rich wants Charles to be interim city manager because Michael appar-

ently could only commit till May First. Charles would be the sixth city manager since 2015, just after Rich took office. Charles became close with Rich and Jesse [Flores] by fast passing the marijuana projects that have been coming into town. At the same time, there has been a lot of covering up of all the illegal operations running without proper permits and orders for

code enforcement to stand down. Rich wants the marijuana operations to be given permission to operate, no matter what, and he doesn't want what he considers to be minor code enforcement problems or issues delaying things. Charles will go along with that. Gabriel wouldn't. They will still continue to pay Gabriel 18K a month to stay home until June. At that time Rich is praying

that Joy Jeanette wins as Jermaine's replacement and will be the third vote he needs to replace Gabriel with Jesse. Rich's friends, and by friends I mean the ones who want to set up their own dispensaries or marijuana nurseries or cannabis product manufacturing concerns, are walking Joy Jeannette around town as part of her campaign and sponsoring her. They are relying on

her to win. If Joy doesn't win, Rich will have to lie, beg and maybe even steal from the other – either Ron [Beard] or Diana [Esmeralda-Holte], whichever one wins – to convince them to vote his way. Otherwise Gabriel will come back sometime in June because the vote will be 3-to-2 with Ed [Camargo], Charlie [Glasper] and the newbie calling the shots."

are those relating to "infrastructure, workforce development and safety," which he enumerated as "the core concerns in the revitalization of our city. Throughout our entire city, the streets, outdoor lighting and blight from illegal dumping in vacant lots and literally in the middle of streets promotes a negative image.

The city's Quality of Life Team initiative is something that is in place and working, so it would be great if we expanded this program. Paving of all crumbling major streets, e.g., Baseline, Mt Vernon, Mill and 5th Street, etc., will be a high priority. Throughout our city we need to focus on high-wage job creation and job training and raise the level of awareness of the job services and training available at the county's America's Job Center.

And finally, over the next five years we need to hire a hundred new police officers that will be a presence throughout our downtown core, businesses, parks and neighborhoods."

Botello said, "The Quality of Life Team initiative is funded in the current city budget. If elected, I will take a leadership role in increasing that funding. In the case of deteriorating streets and sidewalks throughout our city, I

will partner with our State Senate and Assembly team to make certain our city gets its fair share of the recently passed Senate Bill 1 transportation/gas tax and vehicle license fees increase that was touted as the answer to our state's transportation infrastructure needs. Finally, the mayor and entire council need to travel to Washington, D.C. to lobby and secure grant funding from the U.S. Justice Department for the funding of 100

new cops."
