## USFS Renews Nestlé's San Bernardino Mountain H<sub>2</sub>O Extraction Permit

After a three decade delay, the U.S. Forest Service on Wednesday moved to conditionally renew for three years Nestlé's expired permit to draft water from the San Bernardino Mountains on terms that will likely limit the Swiss Company's extraction of water to roughly five-eighths of the combined surface and spring wa-

ter it has been diverting from ecologically fragile Strawberry Canyon in

recent years.

The water Nestlé removes from Strawberry Canyon at the approximate 5,000 foot elevation level in the San Bernardino National Forest by means of a series of boreholes, horizontal wells and pipes is bottled and marketed under the Arrowhead Spring Water brand. Based on a tangle of water rights claims that in some cases

are valid, in other cases disputed, and in yet others based on conflations or questionable interpretations of the public record and in still others demonstrably inapplicable, Nestlé and its litany of predecessors-in-interest have been capturing water at various elevations in the San Bernardino Mountains for over a century and utilizing it for commer-

cial purposes. The word "Arrowhead" was time and again associated with many of those water pumping and bottling operations, including the names used by the Arrowhead Hot Springs Company, the Arrowhead Cold Springs Company and Arrowhead Puritas.

The Arrowhead Puritas Company obtained a permit from the **See P 2**

## AV Council Denies Appeal Of Verizon Cell Tower Approval At Mendel Park

The Apple Valley Town Council this week turned down a request by a resident that it reverse the town planning commission's approval last month of Verizon's plan to place a 60-foot high cellular tower in Mendel Park.

Mendel Park is adjacent to Mariana Academy, a school which caters to kindergartners through eighth grade students, as well as to preschoolers. Town resident Linda Repp asserted it is ill-advised to place the cell tower, from which emanate radio transmissions on a constant basis, near the school site where children are present for up to seven hours on weekdays. Repp appealed the planning commission's May 16 decision to the town council, asking them to rescind Verizon's permit for the tower.

According to a summary of the matter provided to the town council by Carol Miller, the town's assistant director of community development, "The appellant contends that the commission disregarded the international precautionary [separation] standard for wireless **See P 6**

## Paul Vincent Avila, Ontario's Confused & Persistent Reform Candidate, Dead At 74

Paul Vincent Avila, whose perennial electoral efforts over the course of four decades ultimately culminated in highly and increasingly contentious tenures as an Ontario-Montclair School District board member and then as an Ontario city councilman, was found dead in his home on June 19. He had been dead for sever-

al days when police and fire officials entered into his premises to do a safety check after they had been alerted that he had not been heard from or seen for some time and there were no responses to phone calls or knocks at his door.

In a multitude of ways, Avila was out of the political mainstream and perpetually swimming

against the current. Most of the political alliances he made were short-lived ones, as minor differences he had with his school board and council colleagues had a recurrent tendency to metastasize into intense altercations that grew acrimonious and personal. In much of his approach he seemed to lack the basic interpersonal and

social skills intrinsic to most politicians. So too,

did most of the rudimentary elements of political campaigning elude him, along with an understanding of the basic protocols of governance, which as an elected official he was supposed to be so involved in but which he constantly mishandled. Nevertheless, his dogged persistence in seeking office over time provided him **See P 4**

## County Lays Out Another \$125M For Comprehensive Psych Services

Two weeks after the San Bernardino County Board of Supervisors committed to spending \$105.5 million for so-called comprehensive treatment services for children under five years of age, on Tuesday it earmarked another \$124.3 million for similar psychological care for school age children throughout the county.

According to Veronica Kelley, the director

of the San Bernardino County Department of Behavioral Health, "Comprehensive treatment services is comprised of the Student Assistance Program, the School-Aged Treatment Services and Children's Intensive Services programs. ## In Latest Desperate Gambit, Former Adelanto Councilman Wright Tries Faking His Death

Former Adelanto City Councilman Jermaine Wright, who was removed from office in January after he was arrested by the FBI in November and charged by the U.S. Attorney's Office with soliciting a bribe and attempted arson, this week sought to fake his death in an effort to get himself out from underneath his considerable legal troubles.

Wright was released on bond from federal custody late last month after being incarcerated for the better part of seven months. Represented by a federal public defender, he is scheduled to go to trial on August 14.

On Wednesday, using bundled text messages sent out to a select set of officials, community luminaries, some of his acquaintances and a handful of media out-

lets, Wright attempted to logroll a rumor that he was dead. He blasted the release, consisting of a photo of himself over which was superimposed the text "Just announce [sic] about an hour ago Jermaine Wright Sr. April 23, 1976 - June 26, 2018" suggesting the 42-year-old had died on Tuesday. The text was timed to arrive as the city council was involved in its Wednesday **See P 16**

## In Three Days, Upland Sees Councilman Set To Go, Top Planner Leave & Police Chief Hired

Inside of three days,

changes with regard to a trio of key positions in the City of Upland were made or announced this week.

The first of these came at the city council meeting held Monday night June 25, when Sid Robinson, who has been on the city council since 2016, announced he will not run in the November election. The following day, Jeff Zwack, who

has been the city's top land use official since 2011 while serving in

the capacity of director of development services, abruptly tendered his resignation. On Wednesday it was announced that Darren Goodman, a San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department captain, who serves in the capacity of Chino Hills police chief, will become Upland police chief next month.

On election night in 2016, the same night

that Donald Trump was given his mandate by the totality of the American

electorate over Hillary Clinton, with the first tally of ballots from the earliest reporting precincts in Upland and the already arrived mail-in ballots at 10 p.m., Robinson appeared to be the victor in the contest for a single position on the Upland City Council up for election that year, as he was outdistancing the other three candidates, Janice Elliott, **See P 3**



## Nestlé Given Permit To Divert SB Mountain H<sub>2</sub>O; How Much Is Yet In Question *from front page*

U.S. Forest Service to pipe water out of Strawberry Canyon several decades ago. In 1978, Arrowhead Puritas renewed that permit for transporting the harvested water from Strawberry Canyon for ten years. While still holding that permit, for which it paid \$524 per year, Arrowhead Puritas morphed into the BCI-Arrowhead Drinking Water Company. In 1987, Perrier purchased the BCI-Arrowhead Drinking Water Company, in so doing acquiring the still-active permit. Prior to the permit expiring the following year, Perrier applied to renew it. Such a renewal required a U.S. Forest Service review of the water drafting arrangement and its environmental/ecological impact, which at that point the U.S. Forest Service did not have the immediately available resources to carry out. In a gesture of compromise, Perrier

was allowed, pending the eventual Forest Service review, to continue to operate in Strawberry Canyon by simply continuing to pay the \$524-per year fee to perpetuate the water extraction under the terms of the expired permit. In 1992, when Nestlé acquired the Arrowhead brand from Perrier, it inherited the Strawberry Canyon operation and continued to pay the \$524 annual fee without renewing the permit, which at that time existed under the name of "Arrowhead Mountain Spring Water Co.," which is not a legal entity nor a name in the corporation chain of title to the claimed water rights, according to Nestlé's attorney, Rita McGuire.

Nestlé's activity was never favored by environmentalists, who for over two decades to no avail pushed the U.S. Forest Service to undertake an intensive review of Nestlé's water extraction in Strawberry Canyon. As the statewide drought which first manifested in 2011 advanced, environmentalists became more in-

sistent in their demands. In 2015, as environmental groups were gearing up to file a lawsuit claiming the U.S. Forest Service had violated protocol and harmed the ecology of the mountain by allowing Nestlé Waters North America and Perrier to continue operations in Strawberry Canyon for 27 years after the permit to do so expired, United States Department of Agriculture Secretary Thomas Vilsack, who oversaw the U.S. Forest Service, ordered a review of the expired permit through the National Environmental Policy Act process. In the meantime, Nestlé continued its water extraction, diverting, between 1992 and 2015, with the exception of 2004 where documentation shows no record of extraction, from 84 acre-feet (27,371,520 gallons) to 508 acre-feet (165,532,525 gallons) of water per year from the San Bernardino Mountains. Environmentalists, in the form of the Center for Biological Diversity, the SOS Project, and the Courage Campaign filed a federal lawsuit in 2015,

seeking to have the Forest Service halt Nestlé's use of wells and piping in the forest. The plaintiffs alleged that Nestlé's continued diversion of water after the permit had expired was illegal and that the continued water pumping was wreaking ecological damage to Strawberry Canyon. In September 2016, U.S. Judge Jesus Bernal ruled that Nestlé's water use should not be interrupted because its predecessor, Perrier, had made efforts to obtain a new permit from the Forest Service and had not gotten a response from the agency. In November 2016, the Center for Biological Diversity, the SOS Project, and the Courage Campaign appealed Bernal's ruling.

Also in 2015, the environmentalist groups lodged complaints with the water rights division of the California State Water Resources Control Board, alleging Nestlé was diverting water without rights, making unreasonable use of the water it was taking, failing to monitor the amount drawn, making inaccurate reports of

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the water drafted, and wreaking environmental damage by its action.

On December 21, 2017, the California State Water Resources Control Board staff issued its findings pertaining to the investigation the state had conducted with regard to Nestlé's San Bernardino Mountain water use. The state board's staff's conclusion was Nestlé had asserted it had water rights and was able to marshal evidence that it had the right to divert up to 26 acre-feet of water (8.47 million gallons) per year, while it had drafted an

average 192 acre-feet (62.56 million gallons) per year. Over its span of operations, Nestlé some years extracted more than it did during other years, with 1998 being its peak year of diversion, when it drafted 508 acre-feet, of which the State Water Resources Control Board staff determined "356 acre-feet or greater" was "unauthorized." Thus, according to the California Water Resources Control Board staff, Nestlé is likely taking water to which it is not entitled.

"While Nestlé may be able to claim a valid basis of right to some water in Strawberry Canyon, a significant portion of the water currently diverted by Nestlé appears to be diverted without a valid basis of right," the California Water Resources Control Board staff stated in its report of the investigation carried out over the previous two years, while further asserting that Nestlé's use of water for Arrowhead bottling "could be unreasonable if it injures public trust resources, such as instream habitat for certain species, in such a way that it outweighs the beneficial use." The California Water Resources Control Board's water rights division recommended that Nestlé immediately end its unauthorized diversions.

Earlier this month, with the U.S. Forest Service review of the operation not yet completed, Nestlé's water extraction in Strawberry Canyon under the expired permit continuing and the appeal of Bernal's ruling

with a crucial advantage scores of other would-be office holders lacked — name recognition — which he was eventually able to parlay into success at the polls. Moreover, accompanying his absolute dearth of common political skill was a corresponding inability to fit within the context of the region's intensely corrupted political ethos, rendering him as something of a political and social reformer, albeit an ineffective one.

Born in Oxnard, Avila was the son of a hard-working but illiterate farm equipment mechanic who sought to give his son the advantage of an education he did not possess. Young Avila attended Catholic schools, graduating from Santa Clara High School.

Though he had not been drafted, at the age of 24 in 1968, with the Viet Nam War at its peak of intensity, Avila enlisted in the Army, where upon the completion of basic training he was assigned to Air-Mobile Riverine Task Force 4/47, 9th Infantry Division. During his two years in Southeast Asia, Avila was awarded the Infantry Badge, Air

Medal, Bronze Star and Army Commendation w/V Devise medal for valor, among other national defense and campaign service citations. It was while he was in Viet Nam, Avila said, on one particular day in one particular spot experiencing one particular event in a singular moment that he was put on course to become a politician. In battle, a fellow serviceman was felled, mortally wounded with just minutes left to live. In that soldier's final moments, Avila said, his brother-in-arms told him that if Avila managed to make it back home, he should run for elected office every chance he got to justify what they were fighting for.

After a training and debriefing assignment at Schofield Barracks in Hawaii in 1970, Avila discharged from the military service. He subsequently found work as a pencil pusher, processor and job counselor with the California Human Resource Development Agency, remaining there until his retirement in 1996, along the way being elected job steward, then local chapter president and then district president with the California State Employees Association. From 1990 until 1995, he served, by gubernatorial appoint-

ment, on the special state project to find employment for parolees from state prison.

In 1979, he married Maryanne Margaret Dunn, a job counselor colleague.

Shortly after purchasing an old farming property in Ontario where he and Margaret raised four sons and a daughter, Avila obsessively sought elected political office, running for positions as they became available, school board, city council, mayor, assembly, state senate, Congress. Avila was inveterately unsuccessful. He had woefully little outside support. He bankrolled his campaigns with his own money, recycling his campaign signs from election cycle to election cycle. Finally, in 1993, he was elected to the Ontario-Montclair School District Board of Trustees. He stood for reelection, successfully, to that post every four years, in the meantime continuing to vie for other elected positions. Though for nearly two decades none of those other efforts panned out, it kept his name before voters and his name recognition intensified. He propounded the Avila name further, getting his wife to run for the Ontario-Montclair School Board on multiple occasions as

well as for the Chaffey College Governing Board. Ultimately Paul Vincent Avila served four-and-a-half terms on the school board.

He applied for and was selected to the San Bernardino County Grand Jury in 1999 and was named secretary of that panel. Grand jury members and the grand jury advisor considered him to be so disruptive, however, that he was removed with the acquiescence of the county's presiding judge.

With his continuing tenure in office at the school district, he became mired more and more in contretemps and controversy. Among those he tangled with while on the school board was one of his board colleagues, Debra Dorst-Porada, one of Ontario's wealthiest residents. In 2008, an effort by the school board to censure Avila failed, barely, with two of the board members hoping to avoid the negative publicity such a declaration would entail.

In 2012, Avila ran for Ontario City Council, at last successfully. With two years remaining on his term as school board member, Avila announced that he intended to remain in that post when he moved into the city council position. When it was pointed out

that city councilman and school board member were incompatible positions and that this principle had been established in previous California Attorney General findings, Avila indicated he was going to defy efforts to prevent him from serving in both capacities, as the local electorate had elected him to both. He would test the matter legally, he said. It was only at the last moment that he relented, resigning from the school board to take up the council office.

Upon ascending to the council, Avila joined his old nemesis, Dorst-Porada, on that panel. That spelled trouble from the start, putting the two on a collision course.

Following the 2012 election, Ontario Mayor Paul Leon was seeking to reestablish political relevance in Ontario, as Dorst-Porada, along with council members Alan Wapner and Jim Bowman had coalesced into a three-member voting bloc that controlled the ebb and flow of politics in the city. There were signs, nonetheless, based upon the way votes lined up on certain issues, that Dorst-Porada might be a swing vote that could move into Leon's camp, if only with regard to specific matters. Leon had welcomed Avila

onto the council, and for a time it appeared that they were forming an alliance of their own, one that would need Dorst-Porada to migrate to their side for it to succeed. Inevitably, however, when Leon failed to support Avila right down the line on all of the issues he was championing, Avila broke with Leon, loudly and brutally, calling Leon, in what could only have been a gross misinterpretation of political reality, a "puppet" whose strings were pulled by Wapner and Bowman.

At one point, both Avila and Dorst-Porada attended a conference as representatives of the City of Ontario. According to Dorst-Porada, Avila approached her in the lobby of the hotel they were staying in and asked her "Are you going to be my hooker for the night?" Dorst-Porada raised public objections to this and claimed that Avila, whose wife had passed away in 2010, sent her bare-chested photos of himself.

Openly at a council meeting, Avila denied asking Dorst-Porada the question attributed to him, saying he would rather "romance a palm tree" and that he would never proposition her. "She is a very unattract-

yet ongoing, the three environmental groups pursuing that appeal agreed to dismiss it conditional upon the Forest Service making an expedited decision with regard to the renewal or cancellation of Nestlé's permit. In the settlement, those groups – the Center for Biological Diversity, the Courage Campaign and the SOS Project – reserved the right to challenge any new Forest Service decision.

In a decision memo issued on June 27 and signed by San Bernardino National Forest District Ranger Joseph Rechsteiner, The U.S. Forest Service gave Nestlé clearance to renew its permit for three years with a potential two year extension. That continued water extraction will, however, be subject to a comprehensive and complex set of conditions and restrictions, such that it is not likely that Nestlé will be able to divert water from Strawberry Canyon in the quantities it had previously.

Rechsteiner said the conditions under which the permit is granted include those specified in the Forest Service's Land Management Plan for the San Bernardino National Forest and an adaptive management plan which will flex with the conditions in the environs in Strawberry Canyon and the adjoining areas utilizing the same water table, such that overdrafting of the aquifer will trigger a cessation of Nestlé's water diversion until the threat to the local ecology ends.

"I have decided to approve the continued occupancy and use of National Forest System lands for the extraction and transmission of water using existing improvements, subject to resource mitigation measures designed to ensure compliance with the Forest Service's Land Management Plan," Rechsteiner wrote. "My

decision to approve the continued use and occupancy of existing facilities with conditions is based on the agency objective to authorize and manage special uses of National Forest System lands in a manner which mitigates natural resources and public health and safety concerns. The resource mitigation measures are designed to ensure that the impact to natural resources will be minimal [and] may improve resource conditions when compared to the existing condition. These resource mitigation measures protect and do not infringe upon water rights for developed spring water held by Nestlé under California state water law, as described by a recent report from the California Water Resources Control Board staff. The adaptive management plan provides the permittee with operational flexibility in how those resource measures will be addressed."

The permit grants Nestlé, Rechsteiner said, access to the area within Strawberry Canyon where the water diversion is occurring, including a right-of-way occupying approximately 4.5 acres of National Forest System land along with improvements which include two water collection tunnels; ten horizontal wells located within four concrete vaults; five electronic monitoring telemetry sites and associated equipment; four helicopter landing areas; 5.7 miles of access trails, of which 4.5 miles of trail are along the water transmission lines; 4.5 miles of 4-inch steel water transmission pipe and associated valves; 2.75 miles of above-ground pipeline; 1.75 miles of buried pipeline, along Forest road I N24; and 20 pipeline support bridges. The permit also authorizes administrative use and maintenance of Forest Road I N24 on a shared basis.

Conditions of the permit include a requirement that Nestlé maintain limited operating periods at various times throughout the year, some of which overlap,

to protect threatened, endangered and sensitive species habitat. One of the limited operating periods, running from March 15 through September 15, is for the protection of the least Bell's vireo. Another runs from May 1 to August 31 to protect the southwestern willow flycatcher. Both of those are federally listed protected species, and any disturbance-related activities in Strawberry Canyon within a mile of their suitable habitat is to be limited during their breeding seasons. Nestlé must also maintain a limited operating period prohibiting activities within approximately a quarter mile of a California spotted owl nest site during its breeding season running from February 1 through August 15, unless surveys confirm that the owls are not nesting.

Nestlé is also to install, supply water to and maintain two wildlife "drinkers," one in the vicinity of its designated tunnels 2 and 3, and the other near its well 7 complex. Nestlé further must irrigate to support the survival of native special status vegetation and provide for wildlife habitat linkages if it is determined that less than 70 percent of expected aquatic life forms and communities are present based on riparian studies. Nestlé must maintain surface water flow to support macro invertebrate populations and riparian vegetation, and must cease or limit water diversion if it is determined that invertebrate populations providing a base of food chain to riparian dependent wildlife resources are not maintained to the Forest Service's standards and expectations.

Nestlé is also required, under the permit, to conduct hydrologic and riparian studies to better understand the relationship between water withdrawals, surface flows, and riparian habitat in order to ensure that water withdrawals under state law are also consistent with the standards outlined in the Land Management Plan for the forest.

"The initial studies provided by the permittee suggest that water extraction is reducing surface flow in Strawberry Creek," Rechsteiner wrote. "The effect of this flow reduction has not been thoroughly studied. The permittee will study comparison sites in adjacent unmanaged drainages to determine what conditions would exist in Strawberry Creek without water extraction in the upper watershed. Based on this analysis, the overall watershed condition for the East Twin Creek watershed (which includes Strawberry Creek) is currently "impaired function." Studies completed by Nestlé and validated by Forest Service field work have demonstrated that the current water extraction is drying up surface water resources (springs and streams) that would have normally been perennial water resources. This extraction of water under the existing permit is not in accordance with the subsequent adoption of Standard 46 of the Forest Land Management Plan. Surface water diversions and groundwater extractions, including wells and spring developments may only be authorized when it is demonstrated by the user, and/or agreed to by the Forest Service, that the water extracted is excess to the current and reasonably foreseeable future needs of forest resources as required by the Land Management Plan. Implementation of resource mitigation measures will allow for Nestlé's water extraction activities consistent with applicable state water rights and the Land Management Plan. Overall these changes will move the watershed condition up one level to "functioning at-risk" as described further in the specialists' reports. This change in watershed condition is consistent with Land Management Plan direction and will help move the watershed towards the desired condition."

Contained within the Rechsteiner's decision document is substantial reference to the Cali-

fornia Water Resources Board and its staff's investigation, carried out starting in 2015 and concluding in December 2017, of Nestlé's water use in the San Bernardino Mountains. That investigation touched on whether Nestlé had water rights in the San Bernardino Mountains and whether it was exceeding those rights.

"I recognize that the State of California regulates water rights through the State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB)," Rechsteiner stated. "The SWRCB staff offered to assist the Forest Service in our review, and the forest supervisor accepted their offer in May of 2016. The SWRCB, Division of Water Rights also received several water rights complaints against Nestlé starting on April 20, 2015, including a complaint that Nestlé was diverting water without a valid state water right. The SWRCB released their report of investigation on December 20, 2017. The State Water Resources Control Board concluded that a significant portion of the water currently diverted by Nestlé appears to be diverted without a valid basis of right, after examining a variety of water rights claims put forward by Nestlé and finding them flawed. The SWRCB concluded Nestlé's claim to a pre-1914 water right is not valid."

Rechsteiner also reiterated the California Water Resources Control Board's finding that a celebrated water rights case litigated in court between competing private entity water users early last century did not supersede requirements that water users establish their claims in accordance with the 1913 Water Commission Act, which established the exclusive means of appropriating water in California through a comprehensive permitting scheme, and which Nestlé's predecessors-in-interest bypassed. The

California Water Resources Control Board did conclude that Nestlé, through its predecessors-in-interest, has established pre-1914 water rights to 26 acre-feet (8.5million gallons) of water per year from the San Bernardino Mountains, although the rights Nestlé holds apply to Indian Springs, which is at an elevation level well below Strawberry Canyon and in a different tributary from the current water system. Nevertheless, the State Water Resources Control Board concluded those rights could be applied to the Nestlé's current operation.

The SWRCB does have the authority to prevent the wasteful and unreasonable use of all water and it can take action to ensure that water use does not dessicate surface water, but the board does not have the authority to require an entity to acquire a permit for extracting percolating water, that is, water making its way into the water table and not remaining on the surface. Thus, Nestlé's diversion of groundwater may continue, but only with the permission of the overlying landowner, in this case the U.S. Forest Service.

According to the California Water Resources Control Board's December 2017 report, Nestlé can theoretically make a valid claim to that portion of the water it has collected that percolates, or would have percolated, into the water table. Nestlé cannot, however, according to the California Water Resources Control Board, make a valid claim to water it has been collecting that would have flowed into the creeks, rivulets or other surface water manifestations.

The State Water Resources Control Board staff's report of its investigation, released on December 20, 2017, stated on page 33, "Some amount of the water be-

telecommunication of 1,500 feet from schools and playgrounds. The proposed tower is approximately thirty-six feet from the school property to the north. Although the project required deviations to some requirements, this thirty-six foot setback to the northerly property line exceeds the minimum setback requirement of twenty-two-and-one-half-feet. Wireless telecommunication proposals are governed by regulations of the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) and are required to transmit

signals on frequencies that will not interfere with other electronic equipment (e.g., fire, police, emergency radio frequencies, etc.). The Telecommunications Act determined that electromagnetic fields associated with wireless telecommunication facilities do not pose a health risk and are required to conform with the standards established by the American National Standard Institute for safe human exposure to electromagnetic fields and radio frequencies.”

Accordingly, Miller, speaking on behalf of town staff, recommended that the town council deny Repp’s appeal.

Repp cited data to indicate that cellular towers present a health risk to those who live

or spend a significant amount of time near one, including elevating in children rates of autism and cancer, particularly cancer of the blood such as leukemia. She cited the Los Angeles Unified School District’s banning of cell towers at its schools in making her appeal.

Karen Mendel, whose parents donated the Mendel Park property to the town, had sought to appeal the planning commission approval as well, but was unable to do so because she did not meet the town’s requirement that the appeal be filed within 10 calendar days of the project approval.

At Tuesday night’s hearing of the appeal, councilwoman Barb Stanton noted that the

fire department has cell towers at its fire stations.

“If it’s good enough for our firemen who live in those stations day and night, then it’s good enough for our park,” she said.

Councilman Curt Emick cited the consideration that Verizon provides the communication link to the in-car computers used by the sheriff’s department to assert that the cell tower will improve general public safety.

Councilman Larry Cusack, who is the owner of Apple Valley Communications and deals in electronic devices using wireless technology such as cell phones, summarized the favorable attitude on the council toward Verizon and letting the project proceed. He

said, “[With] the service in Apple Valley there is not very good coverage. The more and more devices and the more and more equipment that goes on these services, the less service we get unless we add services. I know we’ve got quite a few of these facilities in our parks already and our Town Hall just to try to service the community and not have them in the back yards of residents and those things, but I know that the state wants to deregulate it and put ‘em everywhere, you know, small towers in all locations on telephone poles everywhere through the valley, so this is going to be an ongoing thing that goes on forever because we are going to be a wireless community for every-

thing that we do. Being a radio person, I know the frequencies that go on and stuff, and these are actually lower frequencies, not microwave frequencies that are or can be harmful. When I was working on towers, you had to be away from it, but these are the lower frequencies, which are not as [dangerous]. And it’s low power, too. These are not high power, high wattage facilities. We do have these at a lot of the parks and there are probably going to be a lot of applications for more areas in our community. I don’t know how many are still out there, but north Apple Valley is having all kinds of trouble and I know down by Apple Valley Road and

ive woman,” he said.

Eventually, the council moved to sanction Avila, a rebuke more powerful than a symbolic censure. Sanctioning him removed him from all of the internal city committees he was a member of and any outside adjunct governmental boards or joint powers authorities he had previously been posted to, and banned him from officially participating in groundbreakings and ribbon cuttings as a city official. The sanction also meant that he was to no longer be eligible to attend conferences as a city representative.

True to his form of constantly running for office and building upon his newfound enmity with his erstwhile ally Leon, Avila opposed Leon in the November 2014 Ontario mayor’s race, joining with another former councilman, Rudy Favila, in challenging the incumbent. Leon, capturing 11,139 votes or 69.53 percent, trounced Avila, who managed to place second, with 2,578 votes or 16.09 percent. Favila was a close third with 2,304 votes or 14.38 percent.

In the face of his loss to Leon, Avila challenged the mayor physically, offering to avenge his second place showing at the ballot box with Leon’s choice of a foot race, a push-up or sit-up contest, or a fistfight. Leon declined.

Avila did manage to carry off what earlier seemed a political impossibility: pushing Leon closer to both Wapner and Bowman, indeed to the point that in 2014 and 2015 the three almost appeared to be allies. This was in large measure because Leon, a preacher by profession who finds going on political attacks to be somewhat distasteful, was able to sit back and let Wapner, for the most part, and Bowman, to a lesser extent, cross swords with Avila. Wapner, an alpha male, a-type personality with a constant need to dominate the circumstances he finds himself in, was completely within his element in taking on Avila. A former detective with the Ontario Police Department and former member of the Ontario-Montclair School Board himself, Wapner was able to utilize Avila’s multiple faux pas to promote himself by comparison, making high profile attacks on his council colleague, bemoaning

what he insisted was Avila’s unsuitability for public office. Avila, nevertheless, did not back down from the intimidating and domineering Wapner, referring to him as “old camel-gut over there” and telling anyone who would listen that Wapner was morally dishonest, on the take and a psychopathic liar.

Essentially by default, Avila found himself cast in the role of the perpetual political dissident, one who was on the outs with the political establishment. As a consequence, to the extent that those he was up against were entrenched and entangled in a culture of corruption and corrosive influences, Avila became a voice for reform. Ontario, with the largest municipal budget of San Bernardino County’s 24 municipalities, one that had grown to running two-thirds of a billion dollars through all of its funds – general, enterprise, redevelopment, augmentation, special and reserve – just as the economic downturn of 2007-2013 hit, is again approaching that dimension of financial intensity as the fifth year of economic recovery unfolds. Ontario boasts municipal budget activity twice that of the next largest city in the county. The sheer magnitude of

the city’s operations and the money to be made by vendors, service providers, contractors, consultants and the like, not to mention development efforts by the private sector in the 49.93-square mile, 174,000 population city, has created an atmosphere of pay-to-play that is palpable. Avila, because of his elected position, had a close-up window on the manifestations of that ethos. In many cases he had a sense that something or several things were not quite on the up and up, though he was not always capable of understanding exactly what the various gifts and grafts were. On occasions he made specific public references to the payoffs and kickbacks – both direct ones involving money going into the pockets of his council colleagues or other high ranking officials and staff members or indirect inducements which were laundered in the form of donations to the political funds of the city’s office holders. One needed look no further than the city’s various franchises – for taxicabs, ambulances, tow trucks and trash hauling, he said. Yet Avila’s lack of sophistication and social skills, his shallow understanding of the political game he was so

deeply involved in and his inability to marshal the evidence to back up his charges doomed his crusades to ignominious failure. Still, the vehemence and virulence with which his rivals on the council attacked him offered testimony to the importance they attached to demonizing and discrediting him, lest a sizable portion of the public begin to pay attention to him and do its own examination of the irregularities Avila was able to glimpse, however imperfectly he was able to understand or articulate what he saw.

In 2016, when he had to stand for reelection, the constant attacks he had sustained, the negative publicity that had constantly attended his own misstatements and social gaffes, doomed his campaign to failure, and he was unable to garner the voter support required for him to stay in office. In a race that featured ten candidates running for two council positions, he could do no better than place fourth in the balloting, with 11.5 percent of the vote. Dorst-Porada, who placed second, was re-elected. Avila was replaced by the first place finisher, Ruben Valencia.

That political defeat was not enough to keep

Avila out of the political fray. The same man who had run for one position or another in every even-year political season at least since 1990 and in nearly all of the odd-year elections as well, who had run unsuccessfully for the State Board of Equalization in 2010, the Assembly in the 2012 Primary, in special elections for Assembly and State Senate in 2013, for Congress during the primary election in 2014, and for Assembly in the June Primary in 2016, ran again for State Senate earlier this month.

Mayor Leon this morning sized Avila up this way: “He’s the quintessential example of the adage ‘If at first you don’t succeed, try try again.’ In politics, like everything else, you can’t succeed if you don’t try. He kept trying. If you keep trying, one day lightning strikes and the stars align perfectly and you get elected. That’s the American way. In my book, once he was in office he did what he thought was right. He might not have had the most sophisticated understanding of what being in office meant, but I believe he was honestly attempting to do what he thought was best, even if he was a bit confused.”

year, offering the electorate a choice between her heterodox approach and Robinson's conformist philosophy.

On Monday night during the portion of the council meeting reserved for direct statements from the council members referred to as "council communications," Robinson dashed the prospect of a head-to-head contest between him and Elliott, which once held the promise of demonstrating, at least within the confines of the Second Ward, whether the voters wanted the status quo orthodoxy Robinson represented or the a more nonconformist ethos embodied by Elliott to prevail at City Hall.

"When I first ran for city council two years ago it was because I've been involved in my various communities in a wide variety of ways, just, gosh, before I even moved here to Upland 30 years ago, so I felt like the next step was to run for city council and where I could make a positive difference," Robinson said. "I feel like I have, along with the majority of this council. As a team, we've been able to make our city more financially stable and pointed in the right direction, despite an avalanche of both internal and external obstacles. But I feel this is probably not the best forum where I can be the most productive and effective, and I feel like I can do more good serving the community in other ways, and as such I do not intend to run for city council this November. I've seen the hard work that they have done to advance Upland in a very positive way and I wish Carol [Timm] and Gino [Filippi] the very best in their respective upcoming campaigns this fall. And in the meantime, I'll work hard for Upland through the rest of my term and well

into the future."

Robinson's exit from the upcoming race sets up a likely contest between Elliott and Planning Commissioner Yvette Walker, a Second District resident who indicated she would run for council this fall. Walker was chosen to fill the gap created when Robinson left the planning commission upon his elevation to the city council.

Present at Monday night's council meeting was Development Services Director Jeff Zwack. Perhaps of significance was that while Zwack was present in the front row to the left of the meeting chambers traditionally reserved for city staff during council meetings, he was not called upon to come forward at any point during the proceedings to involve himself in presentations or field questions from the council with regard to the items on the agenda. In the light of the succeeding event of his departure, it is unclear whether this was because there were no items which fell under the purview of the Development Services Division scheduled for discussion that night or because of some tension with Zwack. One matter on the agenda, Item 11F, which was originally on the consent calendar, was pulled by Elliott for closer examination before it was voted upon. Item 11F pertained to approving the city's homeless outreach, prevention and education program policies. That item called for utilizing federal Housing and Urban Development Community Development Block Grant money administered through the Development Services Department's housing division to bankroll programs involving the city's Community Restoration Team and its so-called U-HOPE program by providing those who have been legitimately established as homeless within the city with up to \$2,500 in purchase tickets or vouchers for financial rental assistance such as rental security deposits and utility payments, travel fare assis-

tance to connect the participants with resources or family that can provide additional aid, as well as bridge housing, that is, providing eligible U-HOPE participants who are a couple of weeks away from obtaining permanent housing with temporary housing vouchers. Though Zwack had authored the staff report that accompanied consent calendar Item 11F, questions put forth by Elliot and the other members of the council were fielded instead by the staff member directly under Zwack, Development Services Manager Liz Chavez.

The next day in an email sent out to much of city staff, the members of the council and planning commission members, City Manager Bill Manis announced that Zwack had retired, stating somewhat tersely that Zwack's retirement was "effective immediately" and that the city wished him well in his new endeavors.

Zwack's departure was abrupt. Despite his considerable tenure with the city and his occupancy of an important position as the head of a city department of intensifying consequence as the economy continues to recover and development in the city is increasing, there was no forewarning of Zwack's leaving, nor any indication that a search for his replacement had been initiated. The *Sentinel* has learned that at least three of the council's members had not been briefed ahead of time about Zwack's retirement.

The circumstances of Zwack's departure have led to the recurrent inference that Zwack was forced out of his post.

Reliable sources told the *Sentinel* there was indication that Zwack was either under pressure at City Hall or had foreknowledge of his pending exit. "Jeff had been noticeably short-tempered for about a week or so before he left," the *Sentinel* was told. "During that time he was in his office early in the morning, well ahead of his staff."

There have been troubling issues involving Zwack in recent years, months and days.

In 2015, the City of Upland, in large measure following Zwack's guidance, undertook an update of the city's general plan, which is described as a blueprint for the city's future growth and development and the maintenance of ongoing zoning restrictions. The Upland General Plan had last been comprehensively updated in 1992. A feature of the plan that many considered controversial was to consolidate residential districts into relatively compact urban areas proximate to commercial, professional, service, social, recreational and entertainment facilities very near major transportation corridors, including Foothill Boulevard and the rail line between 9th Street and 8th Street. One concept in the plan was to encourage the use of public transportation and maximize the capacity of those public transportation modes. Practically, this meant improvements to roads such as Foothill Boulevard and the eventual addition of a second line along the railway corridor, along with the location of high density residential projects in close proximity to those transportation corridors. At council meetings prior to the general plan's approval when its provisions were being discussed, standing-room-only crowds were in attendance, with large numbers of residents registering their opposition to what they called the plan's "stack'npack" housing. In the face of this considerable resident opposition, Zwack was able to prevail in getting a majority of the city council to support the passage of the general plan update, which occurred during a contentious six-hour long council meeting, which began at 7 p.m. on Monday night, September 14, 2015 and did not conclude until nearly 1:30 a.m. on Tuesday, September 15. With then-mayor Ray Musser,

who had recently undergone heart bypass surgery, absent, the council voted 3-to-1, with then councilman Glenn Bozar dissenting, to accept the new general plan. Almost simultaneously, however, Zwack ushered before the city's planning commission and then the city council the William F. Lyon Company's The Orchards project, featuring a total of 209 923-square foot-to-1,723-square foot two-to-three bedroom and two-to-three bathroom model units consisting of 132 attached townhomes and 77 condominiums in three story structures covering 9.51 acres located at the corner of 8th Street and Sultana Avenue. In giving William F. Lyon go-ahead on the project, Zwack and other city officials allowed the development to have a footprint which encroached on the rail line right-of-way, severely compromising the likelihood that the second rail line as proposed in the updated general plan could ever come to fruition. Absolute consternation at the paradox in Zwack's action ensued, casting both himself, city management and the three members of the city council who ratified both the revamped general plan and the Orchards project – Stone, Filippi and Timm – in negative light.

Another apparent faux pas involving Zwack and the Development Services Department relates to a tenant procurement arrangement that netted the city a reduction in revenue it otherwise would have received. In August 2017 the city made a request for proposals from businesses interested in locating their operations into the historic fire station on D Street proximate to the City Hall/Library civic center on terms under which the city would be willing to rent or lease the building. Those terms included the hosting of a suitable enterprise, paying rent that met or exceeded the minimum market rate for the downtown area, fully insuring the operation and indemnifying the

city, along with making use of the property in a way that would honor the historical significance of the property. In making the request for proposals, the city committed to ensuring a competitive bid process and reviewing all submissions made in response to the request. This resulted in an overture from a Diamond Bar-based advertising agency, Dreambox, which responded to the city by first sending representatives to tour the building. The company thereafter submitted a responsive proposal which included securing the required insurance and indemnification and arranging for the requirement relating to the historical feature element outlined in the request to be met, which consisted of the proposed creation of an Upland Fire Department mini-museum in the lower floor atrium. Dreambox proposed entering into a lease for the 2,080 square feet of internal space contained in the historic original firehouse for \$4,008 a month, guaranteeing the payment of \$240,481 in rent over five years. That proposal was submitted in short order, having been hand carried to the city on August 9, 2017 by Dreambox's chief executive officer, Dan Bejmuk, an Upland resident. City officials said at that time that the Dreambox proposal was the only one submitted but that more proposals for the lease were anticipated.

Tom Aminikharrazi, a regional vice president of Primerica Financial Services, who was doing business as Statewide Promotions, Inc., responded to the city's request. Aminikharrazi offered to lease the building for \$3,684.60 per month. Aminikharrazi/Statewide's proposed lease term was for three years, thereby paying the city a guaranteed \$132,645.60 over 36 months. Aminikharrazi's proposal contained two one-year option extensions, such that he would, if Statewide Promotions remained an occupant for that duration, pay the city \$221,076 in rent over five years. Aminikharrazi made no mention of insurance or indemnification in his proposal, nor of how he intended to fulfill the historical element requirement contained in the city's solicitation of proposals.

Two months later, it was announced in the city council's October 23 meeting agenda that city staff was recommending that Aminikharrazi be awarded the lease.

Bejmuk made a public records request and inquired as to why his bid, offering the city higher rent above the market rate, was rejected and why the Statewide Promotions offer, below the market rate and unresponsive to three of the other criteria in the request for proposals, had been selected. He was told by city staff that the Dreambox proposal had not been considered because the proposal from Aminikharrazi/Statewide Promotions had been submitted first and staff made a decision to go with it. This ran counter to the earlier staff statement that no other proposals had been submitted when Bejmuk/Dreambox made its submission in August shortly after the city's request for proposals was made, as well as the terms of

the request for proposals, which stated the city would engage in a competitive bid process that would consider all proposals.

The city council ratified the staff recommendation to go with the Aminikharrazi/Statewide Promotions proposal on October 23, which ultimately was augmented with a promise to build a fire department mini-museum on the order of what Dreambox had proposed. Eight months after Aminikharrazi/Statewide Promotions were awarded the lease, no effort to create the fire department mini-museum has been undertaken, although Aminikharrazi has mounted three photos – two of vintage fire engines and one of the fire station itself – on one of the building's walls.

In the months since Upland's historic fire station has been leased, questions over the arrangement with Aminikharrazi have arisen, including the city's deviation from its own bidding protocol. This was exacerbated by a city acknowledgment that it never opened nor considered the Dreambox bid, which committed that company to remaining in place for five years and guaranteed the city \$240,480, as opposed to the Aminikharrazi/Statewide Promotions offer, which committed that entity into remaining for three years and guaranteed the city \$132,646. In this way, the city will receive at least \$19,434 less in total lease payments for the historic fire station over five years, and perhaps \$107,834 less should Aminikharrazi elect to vacate the building in 2020. Reports have abounded that Zwack acquiesced in the arrangement after it was made clear that Aminikharrazi was a personal friend of Marty Thouvenell, who was Upland's acting city manager in 2017.

Zwack's departure this week came in the immediate aftermath of a contretemps involving one of the city council majority's most vocal

allies and the city's Development Services Department. That difficulty is an outgrowth of the efforts city officials and other community members have made, over the last two-and-a-half years, to mitigate the proliferation of the persistent homeless population in the City of Gracious Living.

In one of the early stages of that effort, the city had heavily involved the police department, creating a so-called community resource division, consisting of three police officers whose function was in large measure diverted from routine police and patrol work to engage with the homeless element in the city. These community resource officers both assisted and were assisted by other community-based charities, organizations and volunteers committing themselves to resolving the homeless problem. Last year, after making a determination that devoting police officers to homeless alleviation efforts was not an efficient nor appropriate use of department personnel, the city essentially disbanded its Community Resource Division, sending those officers back to conventional police work. Simultaneously, then-acting City Manager Marty Thouvenell used his authority to make expenditures of up to \$50,000 without city council approval to hire a homeless services consultant. The city simultaneously created what was dubbed the Community Restoration Team, which was to be detailed to homelessness eradication programs in the city and was to function under the authority and supervision of the Development Services Department. To fill the city's homeless services consultant position, Thouvenell turned to Eric Gavin, a one-time candidate for city council who had vacillated between harshly criticizing the city council with regard to some issues and lionizing its members with regard to others, and who occasion-

ally advocated on behalf of the homeless. Remuneration for Gavin was set at \$3,000 per month and he was also given a berth, as Upland's representative via city council appointment, on the San Bernardino County Interagency Council on Homelessness. Gavin worked, in conjunction with the Community Restoration Team, volunteers and organizations, to find both temporary and permanent housing placement for those living on Upland's streets and its alleyways. One organization involved in the homeless alleviation effort was the Upland Community Foundation, which bankrolled to some degree these efforts. The city, in seeking to encourage

the Upland Community Foundation's participation, agreed to indemnify the foundation in the event of any legal action growing out of those efforts. Recently, Gavin, whose consultancy was renewed this year and who was given a cost-of-living adjustment to \$3,108 per month, sought, through a rental agreement, to secure a residence where several homeless individuals could live. Using donated money and under the auspices of an entity set up in his own name, Gavin paid for the first and last month's rent on the residence. He then sought, but failed, to have the Upland Community Foundation pay the security deposit on the residence. When the Upland

Community Foundation refused, Gavin made the deposit himself and then sued the Upland Community Foundation in small claims court for reimbursement.

Gavin's action miffed a significant number of Upland residents and city employees. One issue is that the city had indemnified the Upland Community Foundation with regard to legal action that grew out of the foundation's homeless assistance efforts. Thus, by extension or so it seemed, Gavin was suing the city in an action relating to what most considered to be a good faith effort at charity toward the homeless. The city council, how-

that area there’ a bunch of dead areas. So there’s going to be more of these facilities coming up, so we have to be prepared for them.”

A Verizon representative said having the cell tower would be a good thing.

Residents who weighed in on the matter, however, were against erecting the cell tower at Mendel Park.

Al Rice, who was the manager of a large cell phone company for several years, said, “I have knowledge about this technology and its technological obsolescence. Japan is ahead of the United States,” he said, “developing towers that go into the ground and make [above ground] towers non-existent, as they [the Japanese] place high value on nature and their environment. Recommend that this be returned to the planning commission for analysis and a vote by all five members, not just three. Why are there no residents in support of this

tower?”

Lawrence McCarthy told the council, “I started working with and researching the contamination of electromagnetic fields back in 1970. I may have more hands-on experience shielding sites from electromagnetic fields than anyone in this room. In 1970, I personally observed birds in cold weather that flew through an electromagnetic beam that was directed from one tower to another tower. They would turn around and fly back through the beam. These were cold days. In just a few passes they would flutter and they would be dead before they hit the ground. These are the same type of electromagnetic fields we are talking about here today, coming from radio, TV or cell towers. In 2000 it was suggested to keep these towers 300 to 400 meters away from residences or any places people tend to gather for any extended time, which is residences, hospitals, parks and schools, especially schools. 300 meters is 985 feet. That’s more than three football fields. 400 meters is eight feet less than a quarter of a mile. Several governments in California, Arizona, New Mexico, Oregon and the Los Angeles School District are

restricting these towers to one quarter mile from these occupied sites. This is a problem that cannot be ignored and in my opinion, a quarter mile restriction should never be reduced for any reason.”

A woman verbally identified by Mayor Art Bishop only as J. Valnezzi said, “I read the staff report and it said the FCC stance is there’s not harmful effects. But that’s not exactly the stance of the FCC on these radio frequency towers. In fact, if there was no harmful effects, there wouldn’t be so many organizations dedicated to regulating and issuing safety guidelines, one of which being the American National Standards Institute, which, I believed worked with the FCC to issue the verifications for Verizon. So there are guidelines, there are things that are in place because we don’t know everything about this technology, and it would be really wrong of us to just think, ‘Well, if we don’t know, let’s just go ahead and go forth with it.’ If I told you there might or might not be some contaminated water, would you drink it? No. You would err on the side of caution. Barb Stanton, you said, ‘If it’s good enough

for the firefighters, then it’s good enough for everyone else.’ The thing I have with that is the firefighters go there to work. They do that voluntarily. School children are required by law to attend school. If they are in that area, they have to go there. That’s different from people who work voluntarily.”

Valnezzi said city staff and the council were biased in favor of Verizon and against the appellant. This was demonstrable, she said, in the way the town was waiving certain requirements for Verizon, but insisting that those challenging the approval Verizon was given must strictly adhere to the city’s protocol in attempting to effectuate an appeal. She cited the municipal code section relating to deviations. “It does say it allows for minor exceptions to be made,” Valnezzi said. “It does not allow for large scale ones.” With regard to setbacks she said, “That sounds like a major deviation. You guys have allowed so many deviations for this tower to be built that you bend over backwards to make things happen for this tower, yet you won’t allow someone to present their appeal.” Valnezzi’s reference was to

insisting that the developmental code be strictly adhered to such that appeals have to be received within ten calendar days of approval.

“I don’t mind the tower being built, but you can move it somewhere else,” she said, and then cited the town’s motto. “This is Apple Valley: A better way of life. That’s for your citizens. That’s not for Verizon.”

The appellant, Linda Repp, addressed the council.

“The telecommunications tower in Mendel Park is unwanted and unneeded by the residents of Apple Valley,” she said. “The town council has the right to deny placement. This place-

ment is dangerous and reckless. The California Public Utilities Code 7901 states ‘Tower placement should not impede or obstruct public use of land.’ The tower would obstruct the full use of the park by the public. The closer you are to the towers, the more radiation you receive.”

She said the town was approving the tower and its placement “for financial gain only and would ignore the safety of its residents, especially its children. I do not understand how a dollar amount could be put on our children’s safety.”

The town council voted unanimously to deny Repp’s appeal.

ing diverted by Nestlé from the Strawberry Canyon springs and wells is developed water that would have surfaced elsewhere in the watershed and contributed to surface flow."

While the report does not specifically quantify that water, a table provided within the report summarizes approximately how much water was diverted by Nestlé under its assertion of rights in 1998, the year in which maximum annual diversions occurred. That table reflects that 126 acre-feet of groundwater was diverted by Nestlé that year, precisely 100 acre-feet more than its established pre-1914 water rights. Nestlé also diverted that year 356 acre-feet or more of surface water. By one interpretation of the complex set of restrictions to be applied to Nestlé's permit, the company will not be allowed to divert more than 126 acre-feet of water per year going forward. That 126-acre-foot figure would be further reduced if monitoring shows that water diversions are having a deleterious impact on Strawberry Canyon's ecology.

Today, two days after Rechsteiner released his decision, Kenneth Petruzelli, who is with the California Water Resources Control Board's Water Rights Division, told the *Sentinel*, "We just saw the Forest Service decision. I went over it in general but not in any great detail. We're still talking about it and in the process of considering it, so we haven't been able to assess it fully yet."

With regard to the study the California Water Resources Control Board made and released last December, Petruzelli said it is not binding. "It was a staff report and not an order from the [California Water Resources Control] Board," he said. "It offered its conclusions

and recommendations, which was that Nestlé immediately cease any unauthorized diversions and that if Nestlé wants to divert water in excess of the 26 acre-feet annually for which it likely has a valid pre-1914 claim, it should be required to determine first what the impact of those diversions are, whether there is sufficient water available for extractions without causing unreasonable injury to public trust resources, and that it must apply for and receive a water rights permit before diverting or using water."

Precisely the degree to which Nestlé will need to reduce the amount of water it is extracting from Strawberry Canyon pursuant to the renewed permit is indeterminate at this time, Petruzelli said. "That's a complicated question which will depend on the results of the various hydrologic and riparian area studies and modeling that is done as this proceeds," he said.

In reaction to Rechsteiner's decision, Alix Dunn, Nestle Waters North America spokesperson, said, "Nestlé Waters North America appreciates the time and effort the U.S. Forest Service dedicated to this decision regarding the permit renewal process at Arrowhead Springs," conflating Nestlé operations at 5,000-foot elevation Strawberry Canyon with water sources further down the mountain near the 2,000-foot level. "We will carefully review the specifics of the decision, and will continue to comply with all permit requirements. Our cooperation throughout this process includes conducting and providing the USFS with 70 separate environmental studies and reports.

"Californians are passionate about water and so are we," Dunn continued. "We take our responsibility as a California water steward seriously and Arrowhead's successful operations for more than a century point to our commitment to long-term sustainability."

The Gambel's quail, known scientifically as *Callipepla gambelii*, is a small ground-dwelling bird in the New World quail family. It inhabits the desert regions of Arizona, California, Colorado, New Mexico, Nevada, Utah, Texas, and Sonora; also the New Mexico-border, Chihuahua and the Colorado River region of Baja California. It is at home in the hot desert, below about 5,500 feet elevation, in brushy desert, canyons and where it is very dry, but nevertheless concentrates near sources of water.

This bird frequents mesquite thickets along river valleys and arroyos, shrublands and cactus, dry grasslands, and agricultural fields. It favors typical desert land, with open ground and a wide variety of shrubs, low trees, and cactus; often around mesquite thickets. Gambel's Quail is often abundant near desert streams and waterholes, with coveys walking to the water in the morning and evening, giving a variety of clucking and crowing notes. It may be present in open suburbs where some land is left undeveloped. As cities have grown in the desert southwest, these birds have adapted to life in the surrounding suburbs, coming into back yards to eat grain scattered for them. At night, coveys of Gambel's quail roost in bushes or low trees. They avoid unbroken grassland with no shrubs.

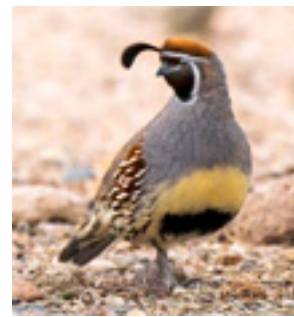
The Gambel's quail is named in honor of William Gambel, a 19th-century naturalist and explorer of the Southwestern United States.

The species is not as widely introduced as the related California quail.

## County Wildlife Corner Gambel's Quail

It was however released on San Clemente Island in 1912 by Charles T. Howland et al., where it is currently still established.

*Callipepla gambelii* birds are easily recognized by their top knots and scaly plumage on their undersides. Like other quail, Gambel's quail are plump,

volleyball-sized birds with short necks, small bills, and square tails. The wings are short and broad.

Gambel's quail have bluish-gray plumage on much of their bodies. Both genders have a comma-shaped top-knot of feathers atop their small heads, fuller in males than females, black faces, and white stripes above their eyes, and are richly patterned in gray, chestnut, and cream that can serve as excellent camouflage. Males have a bright rufous crest, chestnut flanks striped with white, and a creamy belly with a black patch. Females are grayer, lacking the strong head pattern.

The bird's average length is 11 inches with a wingspan of 14–16 inches. These birds have relatively short, rounded wings and long, featherless legs. They scratch for food under shrubs and cacti, eating grasses and cactus fruits.

Gambel's quail can be commonly confused with California quail due to similar plumage. They can usually be distinguished by range, but when this does not suffice, California quail have a more scaly appearance and the black patch on the lower breast of the male Gambel's quail is absent in the California quail. The

two species are sister taxa which diverged during the Late Pliocene or Early Pleistocene.

There are two recognized subspecies, the *C. g. fulvipectus*, the fulvous-breasted quail, which is limited primarily from southeast Arizona and southwest New Mexico to southern Sonora in Mexico, and the *C. g. gambelii*, which is present from Utah and Nevada through the Mojave Desert to Colorado, northeastern Baja California and the Tiburón Island.

These birds forage in flocks from late summer to early spring. They do most feeding on the ground, but readily go up into shrubs and low trees for berries, leaves and buds. The Gambel quail's diet consists mostly of seeds, leaves, berries. Adults are primarily vegetarians during most seasons. They



eat many fresh plant shoots, leaves, and buds, especially during spring, and cactus fruits and the berries of mistletoe, hackberry, and other plants are eaten when available. Seeds are important in the diet at all times. Adults usually eat few insects.

Gambel's quail primarily move about by walking and can move surprisingly fast through brush and undergrowth. They are a non-migratory species and are rarely seen in flight. Any flight is usually short and explosive, with many rapid wingbeats, followed by a slow glide to the ground. In the late summer, fall, and winter, the adults and immature young congregate into coveys of many birds.

In the spring, Gambel's quail pair off for mating and become very

aggressive toward other pairs. In breeding season, the male gives clear descending notes from a high perch. Mated pairs spend much time exploring territory, apparently prospecting for good nest sites. Nest sites for these birds are usually on the ground, in the shade of shrub or grass clumps; sometimes above ground on stumps or on old nests of thrashers or roadrunners. Typical ground nests are usually built by the female and are nestled in a shallow depression lined with grass, leaves and twigs.

Gambel's quail are monogamous and rarely breed in colonies. The female typically lays 10-to-12 dull white to pale buff eggs, rather heavily marked with brown in a simple scrape concealed in vegetation, often at the base of a rock or tree. Two females sometimes lay eggs in

one nest. Incubation lasts from 21-to-23 days, usually performed by the female and rarely by the male. The chicks are precocial, leaving the nest with their parents within hours of hatching. Both parents tend young and lead them to food sources, but young feed themselves. The chicks are decidedly more insectivorous than adults, gradually consuming more plant matter as they mature. Young can fly short distances at an age of 10 days but are not full grown until later.

There is an annual hunt for this bird in some places. The hunting season usually lasts from October to February.

ever, was not willing to rebuke Gavin, who in this election year has taken to local on-line social media outlets and has been highly laudatory of the council majority. Rather, the issue was resolved Monday night when with consent calendar Item 11F, which had been pulled for fuller discussion by Councilwoman Elliott, the council approved routing federal Community Development Block Grant funds to the homeless eradication effort, which incidentally included money to pay for the security deposit

on the home Gavin had rented for the homeless housing program. Unknown at this point and perhaps forever unknowable given Zwack's departure the following day is whether Zwack was resentful of the intrusion upon his authority as the director of Development Services that arose, essentially, out of Gavin dictating how some of the federal grant money Zwack's department had access to was going to be spent. When the item was discussed, Zwack did not participate in the discussion and question and answer exchange, which was instead handled by Development Services Manager Liz Chavez. On Wednesday, it was announced that Darren Goodman, who has been with the San Bernardino County Sheriff's Depart-

ment for 27 years, most recently in the capacity of the captain overseeing the Chino Hills station, will move into the police chief's position with Upland, effective July 16. Goodman will supplant interim Police Chief Doug Millmore, who has been guiding the department since November, a month after Police Chief Brian Johnson, who was brought in as Upland police chief in March 2015, was forced out of that position. Johnson was relegated to resigning in October because his relationship with the officers he was commanding had become increasingly rocky and his function as chief was no longer tenable. Goodman, 52, began his law enforcement career in 1991 as a patrol officer, serving in a fair number of assignments

and capacities, including stints in vice-narcotics, on the Special Weapons and Tactics Team, and as an instructor and commander of the sheriff's regional training center. He has a master's degree in public administration from the University of Southern California and recently achieved his doctorate at USC's Rossier School of Education. He graduated from Harvard University's Kennedy School of Government. He has served as an adjunct professor at Cal State San Bernardino. With his wife, Shana, who is a nurse practitioner, Goodman has four children. In a statement prepared for her, Upland Mayor Debbie Stone said, "Chief Goodman is a nationally-respected, results-oriented law en-

forcement professional. We're thrilled to have him lead Upland's outstanding police force, and further establish our community as a hallmark of fair, humane and effective policing." Goodman said, "I feel very fortunate to be here,

and as the new chief coming in, I'm looking forward to getting to know our officers and the community. Law enforcement, and how safe people feel in their community, is critical to the success of a city."

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
