

Barstow Getting Skittish Over Releasing Mayoral Investigation Report

Nine months after the Barstow City Council censored Mayor Paul Anthony Courtney and authorized what was termed a “third-party” investigation into what some of its members characterized as “unauthorized” action in his official capacity, that investigation is nearing completion or has been concluded.

The secrecy around the investigation itself

and what appear to be selective leaks of its contents have brought into question both the motive and validity of the probe, to say nothing of its conclusions, which have yet to be made public.

The city in pursuing the matter has made a few questionable calls along the way. One consideration is the transparency of the undertaking. So far, the city has refused to disclose who is carrying out the in-

quiry, or how much has been paid to that contractor for the work, in itself an irregular and questionable circumstance. While it is standard practice to maintain confidentiality with regard to the matters being covered and the individuals being interviewed or interrogated in such internal investigations, preventing disclosure of the company, individual, law firm or entity doing the investigating is un-

usual. Insofar as the vote to hire the investigator took place in a closed session and was not disclosed, a violation of the Brown Act, California’s open public meeting law, may have occurred. No one, however, has contested that action legally, including Courtney, who perhaps has reason to do so, nor any citizens or open government advocates. Courtney came into office in 2020 on a reasonably strong foot-

ing, winning election with 3,040 votes or 43.65 percent in a four-way race that included the eight-year incumbent Mayor Julie Hackbarth-McIntyre, who garnered 2,199 votes or 31.58 percent. Courtney then experienced relatively smooth sailing for his first six months in office, and seemed to be constructing a decent working relationship with his council colleagues.

Mistreatment Of Students Under Scrutiny In SBCUSD

Roughly a month-and-a-half into the 2022-23 academic year, the San Bernardino City Unified School District is experiencing a variable degree of success in keeping under wraps reports of faculty members abusing students.

On September 7 the district officials found themselves in the unenviable position of having national attention drawn to the fashion in which students at Arrowview Middle School were subjected to having to sit on scorching hot pavement during the unforgiving heat wave that had descended on Southern California over the week commencing on September 4.

That day, television reporter Christine Gonzales with *Fox News II* in Los Angeles came to San Bernardino, summoned by calls from parents and reports on social media indicating that students at Arrowview, dressed out for physical education class in attire that included gym shorts, were made to sit on asphalt while their P.E. teachers were taking roll and that they had been forced to remain seated on the asphalt because some among them were talking and the instructors wanted them to be silent. While she was in San Bernardino on that assignment, Gonzales learned that at Arrowview Middle School, the students were not being allowed to use the restrooms. In the report, *Fox News II* displayed a memo or document which referenced math teacher Ms. Sanchez, English teacher Ms. Villarreal, history teacher Mr. Romero and science teacher Mr. Bicondova and appeared **See P 3**

Jacobson Disputes Characterizations In Coverage Highlighting Wapner Machinations

Scott Jacobson, the associate USC athletic director who departed from that position in January 2020 just weeks after USC was revealed as one of the primary venues where the then-raging college admissions scandal was playing out, has objected to a multitude of characterizations in a September 9 *Sentinel* article that depicted the degree to which the

specter of that scandal had come to taint operations at Ontario International Airport and darkened the reputation of the airport authority’s board president, Ontario Councilman Alan Wapner.

In the same 2019-to-2020 timeframe as Jacobson left USC, senior associate athletic director Ron Orr, USC athletic department chief operating officer/chief finan-

cial officer Steve Lopes, USC soccer coaches Ali Khosroshahin and Laura Janke, athletic department administrator Donna Heinel and water polo coach Jovan Vavic also departed. This came on the heels of revelations of the abuse of discretion that occurred within the USC Athletic Department. One of those pertained to how actress Lori Loughlin and her

fashion designer husband Mossimo Giannulli obtained for their daughters, Olivia Jade Gianulli and Isabella Gianulli, admission to USC by paying \$500,000 in bribes to have them listed as members of the rowing team, though neither had ever previously participated in the sport. Likewise, Gamal Abdelaziz, a casino magnate, and Robert Zangrillo, a Mi-

ami developer, each paid the standard “fee” of \$250,000 to get their daughters admitted into USC. In Abdelaziz’s daughter’s case, she was falsely represented as a recruit to the women’s basketball team. In that of Zangrillo’s daughter, arrangements to have someone else take her SAT tests and complete the admissions process for her were **See P 4**

Electronic Signaling Boxes On Metrolink Routes Newest Target In Vandalism/Theft Spree

Commuters and the public at large are being put in danger as a result of the latest trend in vandalism and thievery targeting train signaling systems in the Southland.

Within the last week, at a multitude of stops along the Orange County and Inland Empire-Orange County lines, traffic and signaling equipment for the Metrolink

trains – primarily wire and copper-laden electrical connections – has been stolen.

This can result in the crossing gates and signals to motorists on the roads where the trains cross to fail or become dysfunctional. That could cause collisions with the trains, which can reach speeds of upwards of 40 miles per hour and as high as 50

miles per hour along the route.

Overall yesterday, precautions taken at spots where the trains intersect major roads along the Metrolink route entailed nearly an accumulated six hour delay. The trains would slow to a near stop or crawl, with Metrolink personnel jumping from a lead car to serve as traffic officers at the road

crossings, after which the trains would again pick up speed, only to slow at the next crossing.

Not all or even a majority of the electronic boxes near the intersections had been breached, but enough had been so that Metrolink officials out of an abundance of caution initiated the crossing stops or near-stops.

The thefts at what

were at least two crossings happened in the early a.m. of September 22 in Orange County along the Metrolink track that ultimately extends into Riverside and San Bernardino Counties.

An emergency crew did repairs to the electrical/electronic signal boxes between the Orange and Santa Ana stations to replace wiring that had been removed.

that he had established into the mayor pro tem position Barbara Rose, who had been elected to the council in District 3 during the 2020 election along with Courtney. Also elected to the Barstow City Council in the 23,547-population municipality's District 4 was Marilyn Dyer Kruse, who defeated eight-year incumbent Carmen Hernandez.

In the 2020 election, the infusion of three new members onto the five member council completely transformed the political dynamic of the city, as the three-votes represented a controlling majority and the two existing members of the council – longtime Councilman Tim Silva and James Noble, who had been in place for a mere two years at that point – were potentially rendered politically neutered or irrelevant if a ruling coalition of Courtney, Rose and Kruse formed. There was a hint that things were moving in that direction when Noble was bypassed in the mayor pro tem selection. That honorific is generally rotated among the council members, with the proviso that whoever is entrusted with what is essentially the post of vice mayor has had at least a year's worth of experi-

ence on the council dais and will have some experience with regard to protocol and Roberts Rules of Order to be able to preside over and conduct a public meeting. Silva had already served as mayor pro tem during Hackbarth-McIntyre's tenure and before; the expectation was that Noble was due to be elevated to that position. Thus, depending upon how sensitive and nuanced of a reading one wanted to give to the circumstance, the choice of Rose over Noble might have been considered by some as a slight, though Noble did not seem to interpret it that way.

In January 2021, barely a month after Courtney had been sworn in to office along with Rose and Kruse, the newly-composed council began on what appeared to be a makeover of Barstow City Hall, with City Manager Nikki Salas being put on administrative leave and then let go entirely. Salas's suspension took place quietly on January 8, 2021, during a closed session in which the way the entirety of the council voted remains less than clear. What is known is that Salas was felled by the sentiment against her shared by a majority of the council, which counted both Mayor Courtney and Councilwoman Rose among its ranks, while Councilman Tim Silva was strongly opposed to the axing. Either or both Councilwoman Kruse or Councilman Noble supplied the remaining necessary vote or votes against Salas.

To the world at large, it appeared that Courtney and Rose were broadcasting on the same wavelength.

By late April 2021, however, the relationship between the two went south and at the first council meeting in May 2021, Courtney deposed Rose as mayor pro tem, replacing her with Noble. While there were other issues that complicated Courtney's political tenure, forcing Rose out as mayor pro tem appears to have been a turning point in his mayoralty.

Rose has become a constant Courtney critic, opposing his proposals and often interrupting him as he presides over meetings, suggesting that he often ushers the council's discussions into areas that are off-topic. And while Silva had supported the removal of Rose as mayor pro tem, in the months thereafter he joined forces with Rose to form a line on the council that sharply opposes the mayor, seemingly at every turn.

With Courtney weakened, an official committee to remove him from office formed, and on October 4, 2021, a notice of intention to circulate a recall petition against him was served on him.

According to those seeking his ouster, Courtney violated the Brown Act by discussing closed session meeting agendas on a radio show, he initiated the removal of Salas as city manager and other city employees without due process, he has cost the city money, he allegedly cooked up

charges and false evidence against one of his opponents in the 2020 election, he filed a false police report that a city employee illegally forged the signature of the former city manager, he overstepped his authority as mayor, he used city resources while misrepresenting that he was engaged in official city business when he was not, he hired his campaign manager as the city's public information officer and he again violated the Brown Act by having serial meetings with his council colleagues in an effort to line up votes in favor of the Marriott hotel project, which entailed \$2.4 million in tax subsidies.

The recall proponents, despite having the advantage of working within a city where there were roughly 11,000 registered voters, such that they needed to gather the valid signatures of only about 2,200 of the city's voters to qualify a recall question against Courtney, were unable to meet that burden within the 120-day deadline. The recall effort thus failed.

In December 2021, the city council, driven by Silva and Rose, who were being importuned by the recall proponents to assist them, leveled accusations of misconduct against Courtney. They alleged Courtney, in response to the recall effort against him, designed and distributed a flier touting the accomplishments of his mayoral administration and in so doing improperly utilized the city's logo. Combining that

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faux pas, which Courtney acknowledged and apologized for, with accusations that the mayor had exceeded his authority and had pressed city staff to take action that had not been duly authorized by the city council through a formalized vote, the council considered censuring Courtney. At the December 20, 2021 council meeting, the four members ratified the censure, which was intended as an official reprimand, and then went a step further, supporting Silva's motion for an investigation into the mayor's conduct.

An unidentified investigator – or unidentified investigative team – was commissioned to carry out that inquiry. After more than eight months, a preliminary report on the investigation's findings was delivered to the city council on September 12, which then reviewed the document in a closed session without Courtney being present. Based on the contents of the report, the council

then, in closed session, voted to ban him from City Hall, restricting his coming and going there to being able to merely attend and officiate over council meetings. He was informed he could no longer access City Hall at all on days other than those when meetings are to be held, that he was being prevented from going into the mayor's office within City Hall, and that he could not contact any city staff other than the city manager, police chief and city attorney. Despite taking that action, the city council and city insisted that the contents of the report of the investigation conducted by a person or parties unidentified would not be released.

In short order, however, selected elements of the investigation were promptly being leaked, including details that were calculated to make Courtney look bad. According to those whispers, Courtney was

ronment and all departments in the city.

Her civic experience recommends her to the position of mayor, Jernigan said.

"I have served on the Needles Planning Commission," she said. "I regularly attend the council meetings and general plan meetings. I have worked with the city as a volunteer. I am a member of groups and organizations that did projects with the city."

She is a Needles native, Jernigan said.

"Needles has always been my home. I attended Needles High School and we are celebrating

or 50-year reunion in October.

Jernigan later attended San Bernardino Valley College and Skadron Business College.

She has been a Farmers Insurance Agent for 30 years, during which she attended numerous business training programs.

Jernigan said, "I have been married for 46 years to Steve. Through the years we have had businesses together. Our daughter, Stephanie, has her own successful event planning business in Orange County."

Jernigan said the opportunity to run for mayor was enlivening her. She said she was following in the footsteps of her mother and father.

"I really am excited to give back to the community if I am elected mayor. My parents taught by example and by being volunteers and supporters of Needles for over 60 years."

Jernigan pointed out that she is active in tourism events and working with the Rt66 organization to bring travelers to Needles.

to be a set of rules or protocols for the school. Among the rules was one which stated: "Students receive one bathroom pass per month to be used in emergency circumstances only."

Gonzales noted in the

report that the same policy was in place at San Bernardino High School, where the restrooms were locked.

The *Sentinel* made an inquiry into this matter.

Apparently, the restrooms in the middle schools and the high schools have turned into some order of dens of iniquity, such that drug dealing, drug use and intimidation of students is ongoing. In the grade schools, it does not appear that the restrooms

are plagued by drug use or drug dealing, but there is some intimidation going on in the restrooms at some of the elementary schools.

Consequently, faculty and administrators at some of the San Bernardino City Unified School District schools have acted to stem those problems.

One strategy is to make the restrooms off-limits for virtually the entire student body. That has apparently worked

as far as preventing untoward activity that is recognized as ongoing in the restrooms, but students are now hampered by having full bladders throughout the last portion of the school day and, in somewhat rarer cases, being unable to use a toilet when their bowels overload.

A number of students are claiming they avoid using the restrooms the entire day, making a point of using a toilet when they are in gym/P.E. class.

There is concern that denying students restroom access compromises the learning environment.

The *Sentinel* on Thursday received a report of another incident of what appears to have been student abuse.

The *Sentinel* was unable to confirm that report, which pertains to a 7-year-old student at George Brown Elementary School, presumed to be a second grader, having a physical alter-

cation with the school's principal, Dr. Christine Ramirez.

According to the information provided to the *Sentinel*, which did not include the date, Dr. Ramirez first engaged with the student in an outdoor area of the school grounds, after which the second grader was taken into a classroom.

According to a verbal narrative provided to the *Sentinel* by an individual unwilling to be identified, *Continued on Page 5*

of Education's master's program.

Strikwerda is a resident of the school district's Area 5, and therefore is running to represent that division on the board. She is the mother of six children, the youngest of whom currently attends the district's Park View Middle School.

She has two master's degrees in the educational field, one in early childhood development and another in educational leadership from California Baptist University. Strikwerda obtained a doctorate in Leadership for Educational Justice from the University of Redlands. She holds an English teaching creden-

tial, a multiple subject credential and an administrative credential.

With regard to the major issues within the field of education generally in the United States and California today, Strikwerda said, "The major challenges in education are meeting the needs of all our individual students to support them in the ways they need, so they can be successful. Especially since COVID, students have experienced high levels of trauma, reduced levels of social skills, and have disengaged academically from school. We need to work together to ensure that students' mental health needs are being met so they can excel academically."

In terms of the critical challenges to education in the Yucaipa/Calimesa district at present, Strikwerda said, "In Yucaipa we have also seen a rise in mental health issues. Bullying and depression have risen. Students and parents have expressed to me concerns of school safety, especially in the student restrooms. In addition, parents have expressed a desire to refocus on education again to ensure our students are prepared with the fundamental skills and knowledge such as math and English, to be prepared for college, career, and life."

The *Sentinel* asked if, in her view, local schools are underfunded.

Strikwerda responded, "I examined the budget and there are COVID funds that are available. There needs to be a systemic process that include certificated staff and classified staff along with students and parents to decide where these funds are spent to ensure that all

the areas of need are being addressed. Yucaipa-Calimesa will need to reexamine where their monies are spent and make sure that we keep our workers working. Wages must be competitive to keep good people working here in our community. Some things might need to be cut to achieve this."

Asked if she considered teachers in the Yucaipa/Calimesa district to be overpaid, she said, "No, not overpaid, as salaries are very similar and lower to neighboring districts. They are lower than Redlands and Beaumont."

She cited the \$53,012-to-\$113,738 salary range of teachers in Yucaipa-Calimesa as compared the \$54,693-to-\$75,376 plus fringe benefits paid to teachers in the Redlands Unified School District and the \$54,102-to-\$111,888 teachers are paid in the Beaumont Unified School District.

The teacher-to-pupil ratio in the Yucaipa/Calimesa district stands at 24:1, which is similar to Redlands of 24:1 and lower than Beaumont at 34.1.

Queried as to whether she considered that ratio acceptable, Strikwerda said, "It depends. Is this average because some elementary classes are smaller while high school classes are overcrowded? I am unsure and I need to have access to more information to desegregate the data."

The *Sentinel* asked Strikwerda if she considered the behavior and discipline of students and general classroom and schoolyard atmospherics to be a difficulty in the Yucaipa/Calimesa school district.

She responded, "What many parents have shared with me is the safety issues of the school restrooms. Students are being beat up, drugs are being used, some are having sex in there, and they are very unclean. Students are afraid to use the restrooms. To this day, there is still no systematic way of addressing this issue. Parents feel unheard and students are holding their bladders for most of the schooldays. This is unacceptable and needs to be addressed. A solution would be to post security guards near the restrooms to ensure school safety, which may call for an increase of security guards on campus.

Asked to weigh in on the trend in California

over the last decade-and-a-half toward ever earlier initiation of the school year such that what used to be a school year that ran from the second week or so of September and went on into the second week or so of June has now become one that begins in early August, Strikwerda said, "It really is a matter of preference. The teachers' union votes and decides about the school calendar. Parents should have a strong voice as well. My question would be: Were all parties represented when the school calendar was decided? This includes certificated and classified employees as well as parents. How was this done to ensure all parties had a voice?"

Pushed as to what objections she has to the way the district is currently run, she said, "I think the district has many outstanding programs that it should continue to maintain but also needs to look at current student interests and the needs of the community to support the direction of the programs it will continue to include or may look to include. I believe that we need to focus on mental health, school safety, and quality education for all students. The data we gather and analyze will provide this information if it's done in a systematic way with fidelity."

Asked what objections she has to the district's priorities, she said, *Continued on Page 5*

made.

Within three weeks of the announcement of Jacobson's parting with USC, he was able to create an advertising/promotional company – Fuse Advancement – and obtain a \$96,000 annual contract for it with the apparent assistance of Wapner and Atif Elkadi, who was then the assistant executive director of the Ontario International Airport Authority.

Both Wapner and Elkadi are USC alums as is Jacobson.

The *Sentinel* article related how the advent of Fuse Development as a contractor coincided, essentially, with the discontinuation of a ten-year contract that the airport authority had entered into in 2017 with a national corporation, Lamar Advertising, for both promoting the airport and posting or operating signs, billboards, electronic video and audio displays on the airport grounds, including within the terminal and its passageways and ramps. The *Sentinel* reported how by May 2021, Fuse Advancement had displaced Lamar, requiring that the airport authority buy out the then-remaining six years of its contract with Lamar, and the airport authority's contract with Fuse Advancement was increased to \$240,500 per year.

The *Sentinel* article noted that Wapner had been extended the extremely rare opportunity to travel aboard the USC Trojans' football team plane to Austin, Texas for its September 15, 2018 game against Texas as well as with the team to South Bend, Indiana for its October 12, 2019 game against Notre Dame. The *Sentinel* attributed Wapner having been given this privilege because of his connection with Jacobson.

This week, on September 21, Michael E. Adler, an attorney and himself a USC graduate, wrote a letter to the *Sentinel* on behalf of Jacobson,

demanding a retraction of elements of the September 9 article.

While the USC Newspaper *Daily Trojan* in January 2020 published an article representing the dismissals of Lopes, Orr and Jacobson as firings and relating those actions to the admission's scandal and though similar accounts were published in or broadcast by the *Los Angeles Times*, *CBS News*, *The Daily Mail*, *Breitbart*, *the San Diego Union-Tribune*, *KTLA*, *TMZ*, *Newsmax*, *the Washington Examiner*, *Reddit* and *Pro Sports Daily*, Adler objected to the *Sentinel* stating that Jacobson was "caught up in" the college admissions scandal, in particular that relating to USC.

"It is correct that Mr. Jacobson parted ways with USC in February 2020," Adler said. "However, it is incorrect that Mr. Jacobson was 'Caught up in the scandal'. There were never any allegations by USC or federal investigators that Mr. Jacobson had anything to do with Varsity Blues. This may be verified by calling Dawn Kennedy, associate general counsel at the University of Southern California [at] 213-740-7922."

Varsity Blues was the code name used by the FBI and the U.S. Attorney's Office for the investigation and eventual prosecution of those criminally implicated in the college admissions scandal. The *Sentinel* article did not use the term Varsity Blues.

Adler cited a passage in the September 9 article that stated, "Aspiring students who were not academically or athletically qualified to legitimately attend USC but who had parents wealthy enough to have the university's standards ignored on their behalf were not the only beneficiaries of Jacobson's willingness to suspend USC's protocol."

Adler wrote, "There are no allegations by USC or federal investigators that Mr. Jacobson

had anything to do with Varsity Blues. Jacobson never 'suspend[ed] USC's protocols.'"

Adler took issue with the portion of the September 9 *Sentinel* article that dwelled upon Wapner having traveled with the USC Football team to its games against Notre Dame and the University of Texas during the years Jacobson was associate athletic director.

Adler asserted, "Mr. Jacobson never arranged for any airport authority commissioner, including Mr. Wapner, to receive such alleged occasional travel. Any opportunity for commissioners for occasional travel to promote airport business was spelled out in the Ontario International Airport Authority's publicly approved sponsorship agreement with Fox Sports Properties."

Similarly, Adler found fault with a passage in the September 9 *Sentinel* article that read, "The arrangements for those flights were made by Jacobson, documents in the possession of the *Sentinel* show. Wapner flew with the team to Denver, Colorado for its October 2, 2021 game against Colorado. Wapner's ability to fly with the team in 2020 and 2021, was a carryover of the rapport he had established with the USC athletic department through Jacobson."

Adler wrote, "Mr. Jacobson never arranged for any Ontario International Airport Authority Commissioner, including Mr. Wapner to receive such occasional alleged travel. Any opportunity for Ontario International Airport Authority commissioners for occasional travel to promote airport business was spelled out in the Ontario International Airport Authority's publicly approved sponsorship agreement with Fox Sports Properties. There was no 'carryover of the rapport' between Mr. Wapner and Mr. Jacobson. Mr. Jacobson only interacted with Mr. Wapner after the Ontario International Airport Authority partnered with Fox Sports to advertise and promote the airport through USC Athletics."

Adler further found

fault in the *Sentinel* article's focus on the fashion in which the Ontario International Airport Authority had closed out its contractual relationship with Lamar Advertising, which was ultimately replaced by Fuse Advancement. He cited the passage, "In this way, what Wapner and Elkadi were contemplating was asking the other members of the board to abrogate the contract with Lamar, one which was not only raising Ontario International Airport's profile on a notional basis but generating revenue for it at the same time, in favor of hiring Jacobson, an unproven entity whose only prior experience consisted of coordinating the scheduling and promotion of college athletic competitions."

According to Adler, "Mr. Jacobson held various roles in his fifteen years at USC, including the Price School of Policy Planning and Development as the assistant director of admissions, director of Annual Giving, and director of alumni and constituent relations. In 2011, Mr. Jacobson was promoted to the role of assistant athletic director, where he coordinated fundraising activities for the Trojan Athletic Fund. In July 2013, Mr. Jacobson was promoted to associate athletic director, where he was responsible for the annual fund, major gifts, and constituency groups."

Adler continued, "In the role of associate athletic director, Mr. Jacobson:

- Raised approximately \$20 million annually for one of the largest collegiate athletics programs in the nation;
- Worked closely with Athletic Director Lynn Swann on strategic initiatives for USC Athletics;
- Worked with the Trojan Clubs from all over the state, promoting USC Athletics and increasing financial support from USC alums;
- Created the Trojan Athletic Parents Association, an organization of student-athlete parents and university parents whose mission is to sup-

port USC Athletics and increase engagement between the university and student-athlete parents;

- Oversaw the USC women's tennis program as the sports administrator;

- Played a significant role in raising \$300 million for the renovation of the LA Memorial Coliseum; and

- Oversaw five full-time staff members as well as numerous student workers.

Additionally, Mr. Jacobson conceived the 1923 Club on the upper deck of the Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum, one of the most talked about clubs in College Athletics, and secur[ed] the most significant gift in USC history by a former female student-athlete."

Adler further wrote, "Your statement that Mr. Jacobson's 'only prior experience consisted of coordinating the scheduling and promotion of college athletic competitions' is defamatory, libelous, and incorrect. Furthermore, Mr. Jacobson had nothing to do with 'coordinating the scheduling and promotion of college athletic competitions.'"

Despite the *Sentinel's* reliance upon documentation taken directly from the Ontario International Airport Authority's files indicating that as early as February 1, 2020, Wapner and Elkadi had arranged to provide Fuse Advancement – which had yet to be registered as company, corporation, limited liability company or in any other form with the State of California or the County of San Bernardino – with a \$96,000 annual contract, Adler

insisted that the airport authority did not contract with Fuse Advancement to provide advertising services until one month after the document in the possession of the *Sentinel* indicated. Adler cited this passage in the September 9 article: "Instead they [i.e., Wapner, Elkadi, then-Ontario International Airport Authority Executive Director Mark Thorpe and the airport authority board] opted to enter into a contractual relationship with Jacobson, or rather an entity that Jacobson created.

Of note is that even as Lamar was being shoved out the door, that entity – which was dubbed Fuse Advancement – had yet to come into existence. On February 1, 2021 (sic), the Ontario International Airport Authority entered into a \$96,000 annual contract with Fuse Advancement, as it was identified in the contract."

According to Adler, "The first contract between Fuse Advancement and Ontario International Airport Authority was 'made and entered into as of March 1, 2020.' Fuse Advancement, Inc., was filed with the California Secretary of State on February 18, 2020. For you to claim that 'Fuse Advancement – had yet to come into existence,' when the contract was signed almost two weeks after Fuse's formation is both defamatory and libelous. In fact, before entering into the agreement with ONT, Fuse had to provide its EIN#, proof of insurance, Ontario business license, articles of incorporation, etc."

Adler disputed the *Sentinel's* straightforward and verbatim transcription of both the May 27, 2021 agenda item passed by the Ontario International Airport Authority Board of Directors on that date, as well as the information contained in the staff report relating to that item. He cited the sentence in the *Sentinel's* September 9 article that states, "Subsequently, on May 27, 2021, the contract with Fuse Advancement was increased to \$240,500 per year."

Adler wrote, "The contract Fuse Advancement entered into with the Ontario International Airport Authority was for \$185,000, with an incentive bonus of up to \$55,000 for meeting gross revenue sales budgets. The maximum amount is \$240,000."

Another bone Adler sought to pick with the *Sentinel* consisted of his objection to the sentence in the September 9 article that read, "Wapner did not make any disclosure of the travel accommodations provided

fied, when a teacher went into the room, what was on display was that two other teachers were holding the student restrained on the floor.

The *Sentinel* was further told that several students saw what was going on, as did at least two teachers. The students and at least one of the teachers, the *Sentinel* is informed, were traumatized by what they saw.

The *Sentinel* has the name of the student but is withholding it at this time. It is unclear whether the student's one known parent knows what occurred. The parent does

not appear to be animated about what happened.

There are grounds to conclude, though not conclusively, that the district had perhaps paid the parent money to assuage her. The *Sentinel* has insufficient access or information to determine whether that is the case.

The *Sentinel* is further informed there is a video of Dr. Ramirez's interaction with the second grader. The video was reportedly turned over to the San Bernardino Police Department. As best as can be determined, the police department concluded that Dr. Ramirez had not acted improperly, and she has not been arrested or charged or relieved of her position. No formal statement to that effect has been provided by the police department.

The *Sentinel* made repeated inquiries with

Sergeant Equino Thomas, the spokesman for the San Bernardino Police Department with regard to the matter in the form of messages left on his answering machine. Thomas had not responded by the *Sentinel's* deadline today.

Maria Garcia, the communications officer for the San Bernardino City Unified School District, in response to the *Sentinel's* inquiry about bare-legged students being exposed to hot asphalt, said, "SBCUSD follows heat protocols that prohibit physical education teachers from requiring students to sit on asphalt during excessive temperatures. During the recent heatwave, we are aware of one report stating that this heat protocol was not followed and we are always concerned when we hear that a stu-

dent may have been hurt. All staff were immediately reminded of the established heat protocols, including:

– 90-95 Degrees: Provide information to staff. Encourage drinking of water, loose light-colored clothing. Optional water breaks for PE and outdoor activities should occur every 20-minutes for a 5-minute duration. Monitor staff and students carefully for signs of heat stress.

– 95-99 Degrees: Provide information to staff. Provide ample amounts of water. This means that water should always be available and staff/students should be encouraged to take in as much water as they desire. Reduce time of all outside activity. PE Classes, lunch and recesses should occur in air-conditioned environments or, at a

minimum, outdoor, shaded environments. Walking field trips should be canceled and other field trips provided with cases of water. Monitor staff and students carefully for signs of heat stress. Check and record heat index 15 minutes before scheduled outdoor activities, from a non-shaded area to adjust for changes.

–100+ Degrees: Provide information to staff. Stop all outside activities and/or play. Provide ample amounts of water. This means that water should always be available and staff/students should be encouraged to take in as much water as they desire. Monitor staff and students carefully for signs of heat stress. Check and record temperature and humidity every 60 minutes, from a non-shaded area to monitor for changes in the heat

index."

With regard to reports that students were being prevented from using the restrooms, Garcia said, "Across the country, public school restrooms pose supervision challenges for administrators, including some in San Bernardino City Unified Schools. We are aware that some campuses restricted restroom access to prevent students from engaging in prohibited behaviors. On September 9, the district directed all SBCUSD campuses to open school restrooms and find other ways to address unhealthy student behavior."

Garcia offered no statement with regard to the alleged incident involving Dr. Ramirez and a second-grade student at George Brown Elementary School.

Strikwerda Says She Will Bring Her Observations On Her Own & Her Children's Educational Experience & Her Professional Teaching Acumen To Bear In Her Role As School Trustee If Elected *from page 3*

"Making a difference in the life of each child is a very noble statement. I do object to the way the district is not responding to the parents and students' complaints regarding the high school restrooms. There are reports of bullying, fighting, drug dealing, and inappropriate conduct occurring. There needs to be a systematic approach to this and a policy that supports the monitoring of student restrooms to ensure the safety and well-being of all students. This needs to be addressed."

As to her thoughts on bullying, Strikwerda said, "Bullying is detrimental to both the one being bullied and to the bully. It also causes harm to those who witness it and the school culture. During COVID-19 we saw in 2020 an 8-percent-to-10-percent rise in mental health issues, bullying, child abuse and domestic violence, all of which can lead to suicide. Bullying expresses itself in an oppressive form, which can be a result of mental health issues, or other issues in the home. I believe that we need to edu-

cate our students and staff on bullying, the harms, effects, and why it occurs, and how we can prevent it. I also believe that we need a mental health approach to support resolving and healing all parties involved through counseling, restorative justice, and accountability."

Asked to consider her own education, and if she saw any shortcomings in the way schools were run or if there was anything about her educational experience in general or in any way that she regretted or would change, she said, "I do not believe that I received a high-quality education as a child. I was identified as gifted in 4th grade and was a very good student. I never got into any trouble, I was quiet, and I did my work. I was a straight-A student. All the way through college I was Summa Cum Laude, even in my doctorate program at the University of Redlands. Since this is who I am, I was often left alone in class. My teachers did not pay much attention to me because I did not demand it. They enjoyed having me there, but I was never chal-

lenged to reach my highest potential. I learned so much about the importance of challenging our students and engaging them in dialogue to make meaning of the learning through my doctorate in education program. We often had discussions about challenging issues and were taught to ask questions pertaining to why and how. Then we looked for the answers through research and applied it to our scholarly practice. These critical thinking skills need to be taught to our youth at a young age and continued all throughout their education in our K-12 schools."

Strikwerda grew up in Fontana and attended junior high at Southridge Middle School and attended Fontana High School.

"I went to college later in life, as a mother of many children," Strikwerda said. "I homeschooled my boys and there was a movement in 2009 about requiring parents to have a credential in order to homeschool their children. As a result, I decided to get my teaching credential because I was not going to allow the state to dictate what education was best for my children."

That launched her foray into obtaining her master's degree and doc-

torate in the educational field, which accounts now for her professional engagement as an educator, as both the principal of Excelsior Academy and as an adjunct professor at Redlands University, where she is involved in teaching "our future teachers," she said.

Strikwerda said she is qualified to hold the position she seeks on the school board.

"I am a mother of six boys, all who have learned to be successful and are successful. Some of mine are gifted and needed me to advocate for challenging educational experiences connected to their personal life goals. One of mine has special needs and needed me to advocate for services that support his learning needs. As an educator who knows education, I understand the ins and outs of the institutional system of education. I live, breathe and work in education and I have the skills and knowledge to make a difference in our community by applying what I know, and I am courageous to ask the hard questions to ensure that those who are often overlooked are seen and heard. I truly care for all of our students."

Strikwerda is vying against Teri Boon and Bob Miller for the Area 5 position on the board.

She said she is distin-

guished from her opponents in that "I am an experienced educator who has the skills and knowledge to support the outstanding programs that exist inside the Yucaipa-Calimesa Joint Unified School District, while also listening to the parents, students, teachers, and staff to ask appropriate, timely and relevant questions pertaining to policy and state and federal law to ensure that we are providing the highest quality education that our schools can provide. I am an educator who understand the K-12 educational system. As a mother, former teacher, principal, and teacher-educator at the University of Redlands, I bring both professional and personal life understanding of what quality education looks like, and what it means to provide for the individual needs of all students so they can reach their highest potential."

She said she represents a superior choice to serve on the school board because, "I will value, honor, and recognize all voices in our community and be a strong voice for our parents. I will ask questions using a critical lens and support the focus of continual improvement by using multiple data points, including both qualitative and quantitative data to identify

areas of growth and celebrate our successes and to inform and govern the school with the intention to meet the needs of all our students."

Proudly, Strikwerda said, "I have raised six boys of my own. My oldest is a sixth-grade elementary school teacher in Victorville and my youngest, 13, attends Park View Middle School here in Yucaipa. I have a son who attends Crafton Hills College, a son who is serving our county in the Navy, a son who went to Point Loma Nazarene in San Diego, and another son who is a senior this year."

Strikwerda said, "I believe that our entire nation depends on how well we work together to educate our children. I heard it once said that our children are our greatest asset. I am asking for the votes of the residents of Area 5 to ensure quality education that meets the individual needs of our children with urgency."

Strikwerda has been endorsed by educators representing all political parties. Pointing out that school board is a nonpartisan office, she vowed she will ensure collaboration of all constituents. He school board candidacy website is: <http://heidi4ycjudschoollboard.nationbuilder.com/>

Switching Barstow From A Passive To A Proactive Footing Has Resulted In A Vituperative Counterreaction From Some Of His Colleagues And An Element Of The Community, Courtney Says *from page 2*

throwing his mayoral weight around, intimidating and threatening city employees and in general exceeding his authority.

Contained in the report, according to the word on the street, was an account of how Courtney had in the late Spring/early Summer of 2021, pressed then-Barstow Parks and Recreation Director Kyle Woolley to hire Melonie Reliford, who was at that time the mayor's fiancée, into a post in the parks and recreation division. Courtney and Reliford have since wed. According to those conveying what is contained in the report, Woolley knuckled under and hired Reliford.

Also being spread around is that on occasions when City Manager Willie Hopkins Jr. and City Attorney Matthew Summers met in a private conference with the mayor which was hoped would remain low-key and would result in Courtney being persuaded to take the edge off his personality to allow for a rebuilding of relationships at City Hall on some semblance of an amicable basis, the mayor went ballistic, insisting that he was being systematically undermined by Rose and her allies, who have now come to include Silva, surprisingly since Silva deeply resented the direction Rose had adopted for the city upon first coming into office.

It appears, at least anecdotally if not scientifically, that a large number of city employees are out of sorts with the mayor. The precise reasons for that appear unclear, although there is a suggestion that Courtney's dissatisfaction with the status quo at City Hall was apparent even before his installation as mayor. Courtney is displeased with the widespread acceptance of the way Barstow, which decades ago was the county's fifth largest city, has

now slipped to being 20th among 24 county municipalities population-wise and, in the minds of many, been relegated to an equally low position in terms of prestige.

Moreover, the clash between Rose and Courtney, in particular the application of Rose's tactics during public forums, which include progressively bold displays of disrespect toward the mayor, have exacerbated the situation. Politics in general attracts participants who are alpha types who want to be in charge and try to dominate the circumstances in which they find themselves. When differences of opinion or intent emerge among such A-type personalities, things get contentious. Some politicians have mastered the technique of self-effacement and humility while seeking to convince their colleagues to take certain courses of action while others use a more forceful approach, seeking to achieve their goals through the imposition of their will on others who can be, and are, by natural inclination, every bit as willful as they are. Such appears to be the case in Barstow.

The *Sentinel* spoke with Courtney today.

Asked about the assertion that he has been too assertive and domineering in his approach and had created the contretemps he is in by overstepping his mayoral authority, Courtney said, "That's ridiculous, patently. The council is an elected body. Each member represents and speaks for a district. They are duly elected. I am the elected mayor for the entire city. They cannot prevent me from fulfilling my role nor can I instruct the council on how the members are to do their jobs. My job does not allow me to interfere in their districts."

Courtney said the council's accusation that he had gone beyond the rightful and legal limits

of his authority was the polar opposite of Barstow's current reality.

"They [the council] have way overstepped their authority in what they can do," he said, referencing the vote to ban him from the city premises. He said he had initially resisted what he called an "illegal" order that he vacate City Hall, but that he has since relented. He said he was now complying with the ban not because he considers it to be legally binding but because defying it would put City Manager Willie Hopkins in jeopardy.

"I have vacated City Hall [on all but the days when official council meetings are held, over which he still presides]," he said. "I am complying [with the order to stand down from City Hall], not because what they have done is legal, but out of respect for the city manager, who has been put in the position of where he can be terminated for dereliction if he allows me to stay. I will not do that. They have weaponized the dais. I will not do that. They have accused me of trying to dictate policy. That started before I was elected. These false accusations have been going on for two years."

Asked from whence the animus toward him has arisen, Courtney said, "There is a reluctance to change in the City of Barstow. This is a minority, not a majority who are coming after me. I was overwhelmingly elected by nearly a 3-to-2 margin over an incumbent who had been in office for 14 years.

"With all the things that have taken place, I am disappointed but not shocked," he said about the selective leaks from the investigation report. He said the resistance to his leadership is less with regard to him personally than his vision for the city and his intent to transform the community.

"Three decades ago, Barstow was the big town in the High Desert," Courtney said. "All the others were the small cities. Those other cities [Victorville, Hesperia, the Town of Apple Val-

ley and Adelanto] have been very proactive in their growth. Now, we are barely at 25,000 in the last census. Think about that."

He said his effort to get things off top dead center and fire up Barstow's economic engine is being met with resistance by those who are invested in keeping things as they currently are. That resistance, while vocal and in some cases creative, he said, is insignificant in terms of numbers. In the end, Courtney said, he will prevail, both at the ballot box and within the context of the council dais.

"It is a minority that have attempted to recall me," he said. "Where has that gone? A majority of the people have indicated they like what is going on in Barstow. If the majority doesn't want me elected mayor next time, they will let me know."

Courtney said, "As for what former Parks and Recreation Superintendent Woolley said about me forcing him to hire my fiancée, that's ludicrous. When Ms. Reliford was hired a year-and-a-half ago, she went through the same normal steps as anyone. This was just as the COVID pandemic was ending. There were nine openings in the parks division. She was hired for just one of nine jobs into a part-time position at minimum wage working concessions at the sports park. Dr. [Jim] Hart [then Barstow's city manager] looked into that at the time. He shared with me and the rest of the council his finding that there was nothing wrong with the way Melonie was hired, nothing. I was shocked when people later brought this up. Why would I use pressure to get my fiancée hired into a minimum wage spot at the sports park, selling concessions? I would encourage you to speak with Darcy [Wigington], who was the human resources director then and is still the human resources director, and anyone on the selection committee. They will tell you she went through the normal process. The superintendent of parks

and recreation had nothing to do with Melonie being hired. There is a process, and the city uses that process, and the city is not going just suspend the rules for something like what they are saying, which is absurd and crazy to think someone would need to suspend the rules so someone could get part-time minimum wage employment, which Melonie was more than fully qualified to perform."

His political opponents such as Rose are purposefully misinterpreting the facts, he said. "Feel free to reach out to Dr. Hart, as well as Willie Hawkins," Courtney said. "They will tell you the same thing that Darcy will."

The *Sentinel* asked Courtney to describe the case that had been laid out against him in the report.

"That was a closed session issue," Courtney said. "A member of the council who is being discussed is not part of the session, so I have no idea."

The *Sentinel* asked Courtney who had floated the idea of censuring him in December only to then initiate the investigation and on what grounds.

"To schedule a discussion or a vote by the council do something officially takes at least two of the council," he said. "If you do not have two members of the council that want to launch a discussion, it can't go forward." He did not name any specific sponsor of the censure resolution or the investigation.

The *Sentinel* observed that his two major antagonists appeared to be Rose and Silva.

"Of course!" he said. "Everybody knows that. Barbara Rose back in May of 2021 was my mayor pro tem. There were some issues with regard to improper contact with the city manager and staff. To make a long story short, she was replaced. James Noble became the mayor pro tem. She had a tantrum. She said that the reason the change in mayor pro tem was made was because I wanted someone who looked just like me

and who would be a yes man. You can see that for yourself and hear the statement she made during the May 3, 2021 council meeting. It was unbelievable what she did. Ever since that day she has been very intentional in wanting to get even with me."

Courtney paused.

"Tim Silva: I really can't explain his motivation," Courtney said. "He has been on council 16 years, during which Barstow has been like a sinking ship. Tim Silva was on the council while the ship has been sinking. He has decided he is not running again. He is leaving in December. He has decided he is done. That was his decision. I don't know why he is coming after me. I haven't had any personal issues with Tim or Marilyn Kruse or James Noble. I had to make the decision to let Councilwoman Rose go as mayor pro tem because of her interactions with staff. After that, a lot of anger came my way. But I haven't had any differences with Councilwoman Kruse or Councilman Noble or Councilman Silva that I know of. There is nothing that should have caused any problems that I am aware of."

The *Sentinel* inquired as to where things are going to go from this point.

"First of all, I am not quitting and I am not stepping down," Courtney said. "Make sure that's clear. They can continue to throw mud and dirt and put out their false narratives. It goes on and on. This is not the first time a leader has found himself in a situation and has to stand up alone and it won't be the last time."

Courtney continued, "The time for change in Barstow has come and it's happening. We have made dynamic changes since December of 2020. Barstow has not seen this kind of positive change and action since Lawrence Dale was mayor."

Dale was Barstow mayor from 2000 to 2008.

Queried as to his acceptance of his banish-

to him by USC and/or Jacobson when Jacobson was the associate athletic director, according to the City of Ontario.”

“Mr. Jacobson never provided travel accommodations for any Ontario International Airport Authority Commissioner,” Adler repeated. “This statement is both defamatory and libelous. Any occasional travel for Ontario International Airport Authority Commissioners to promote airport business was spelled out in the Ontario International Airport Authority’s publicly approved sponsorship agreement with Fox Sports Properties, which Mr. Jacobson has nothing to do with.”

Adler called out this 88-word sentence in the September 9 article, “The termination of the Lamar contract in favor of the arrangement with Fuse Advancement went unremarked by the public for well over a year but has now become an issue of controversy with disclosures about Wapner having been able to obtain the virtually unheard-of privilege of traveling with the USC

Football Team on the team plane to several of its away games and the apparent quid pro quo of Wapner arranging for Fuse Advancement’s contract in the aftermath of Jacobson’s downfall as a consequence of the Admissions Scandal.”

Adler again insisted that Wapner’s traveling to the Trojans’ away football games on the team plane did not come courtesy of Jacobson while the latter was serving as USC’s assistant and/or associate athletic director.

“Mr. Jacobson never provided travel accommodations for any Ontario International Airport Authority commissioner, including Mr. Wapner, so therefore, there was no ‘quid pro quo.’ Additionally, there were never any allegations by USC or federal investigators that Mr. Jacobson had anything to do with Varsity Blues,” Adler wrote.

The *Sentinel* should have dug deeper to determine why the airport authority had extended a contract to Fuse Advancement when its inquiry with Wapner in that regard produced no response from the councilman/airport commission board president, Adler maintains.

He cited a sentence in the September 9 article that reads, “Wapner

further sidestepped direct questions into what about Fuse Advancement and its potential justified entering into a contract with it to the exclusion of Lamar Advertising, why the airport authority terminated the contract with Lamar to take up with Fuse Advancement and whether he could produce empirical data to demonstrate that Ontario International Airport and the Ontario International Airport Authority have been better served by Fuse Advancement than by Lamar Advertising.”

Adler wrote, “According to a press release from the Ontario International Airport Authority, dated August 30, 2022, ‘Annual revenues generated by in-house advertising and partnership programs at Ontario International Airport doubled to \$1.6 million in the past 18 months, and the trend is expected to continue as demand for air travel in Southern California surges.’”

Adler found fault with the *Sentinel’s* description of the sentiment shared by some of Wapner’s constituents, who believe he militated on behalf of Jacobson and Fuse Advancement not because he truly believed that the contract with Jacobson’s company would benefit the airport but because he understood Jacobson was

willing to take part in the pay-to-play environment Wapner as a politician in Ontario inhabits. Jacobson’s lawyer referenced the following passage: “According to them, Wapner militated on behalf of Fuse Advancement not on the basis of that company’s superior service but simply because of his relationship with Jacobson. Viewed in this frame of reference, the prerequisites that were provided to Wapner by Jacobson when he was acting in his capacity as assistant athletic director at USC – in particular the extension of the privilege of flying on the team plane to several away games over the last several years – constituted gifts that were not prop-

erly reported and which, in the light of the favorable treatment Wapner as president of the airport authority arranged for Fuse Advancement, stand as quid pro quos – bribes in plain terms.”

Jacobson wrote, “Mr. Jacobson never provided ‘perquisites’ to any Ontario International Airport Authority commissioner, including Mr. Wapner, when he was acting in his capacity as assistant athletic director at USC. Again, any occasional tickets for Ontario International Airport Authority commissioners to promote airport business were through the well-documented publicly approved partnership with USC Athletics via Fox Sports Properties. There

were no ‘quid pro quos – bribes’ between Mr. Wapner and Fuse Advancement and/or Mr. Jacobson.”

Adler contradicted characterizations of Jacobson made by multiple employees with the airport authority and the City of Ontario as embodied in the sentence that appeared in the September 9 *Sentinel* article, “Jacobson has assumed the role as the airport’s chief publicist, promoter and head of communications.”

“Jacobson,” Adler wrote, “has never ‘assumed the role as the airport’s chief publicist, promoter and head of communications.’”

ment from City Hall, he said, “I do go to City Hall. I have been there several times. As far as my office in City Hall, I vacated it last Saturday. I did so out of respect for our chief executive. I did not want to put him in the position where the council could accuse him of dereliction. I would never want to do that. I did it out of respect for the city

manager.”

Courtney said, “My position is not based on me having an office at City Hall. My office is an impromptu office wherever I go around the city. I do not have to be there. I absolutely do not.

I don’t put any weight or validity into the city council’s decisions at this point. I don’t have to be in there to do my job. My role as mayor has not changed at all. I’m still the elected mayor. I have an office and am in office wherever I have a meeting. That’s part of being mayor. My duty has not

changed at all.”

Asked if it was his perception that City Attorney Matthew Summers is militating in conjunction with Rose, Silva and the rest of the city council against him, Courtney said, “Whether he is or isn’t, I have very few interactions with him, so I can’t say.”

He is on decent terms with Hawkins, Courtney warranted. “I can say the city manager and I get together and converse on a constant basis on how to keep things going,” he said. “I spoke with him this morning.”
