

SBC Schools Chief Alejandro Arranged \$200,000-Plus Annual Contracts For His Wife

An official complaint submitted to Ensen Mason, the San Bernardino County Controller, Auditor, and Tax Collector, reveals a web of self-dealing, illegal meetings, and potential violations of California's laws regarding the gift of public funds by the office of the San Bernardino County Superintendent of Schools.

The complaint alleges a culture of insider dealing has flourished for over a decade, enriching friends and family while potentially violating multiple state laws. This complaint alleges to have uncovered a systematic pattern of cronyism, nepotism, and conflicts of interest that may constitute violations of California's Brown Act, constitutional prohibi-

tions on gifts of public funds, and the Political Reform Act.

The scope of misconduct spans from the superintendent's office to school district boardrooms, creating an interconnected web of self-dealing that has cost taxpayers hundreds of thousands of dollars while undermining public trust in one of California's largest educa-

tional oversight bodies.

The \$3,000-Per-Hour Consulting Empire: At the center of this web sits Sherman Garnett, a former SBCSS administrator who has transformed his government connections into a lucrative consulting empire. Since 2019, Garnett has secured consulting contracts with SBCSS paying rates exceeding \$3,000 per hour, a fig-

ure that would make him among the highest-paid consultants in public education.

The arrangement began through Garnett's mentorship of Don English, whom he hired at Chaffey West County Community School early in English's career. This relationship has proven extraordinarily profitable: English now serves as Di-

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SBC GOP's Central Committee Endorses Two Outside Legislators, Spurning Locals

California state senators Tony Strickland and Roger Niello State this week were the recipients of a significant unanticipated political benefit from what is or had been an unlikely and unanticipated source: the San Bernardino County Republican Central Committee.

Given that Strickland and Niello are two of the state's foremost members of the Golden State's

minority party, the infusion of what is likely to exceed \$100,000 from San Bernardino County's Republican Party into their electioneering funds is not surprising from a political viewpoint. What is eye-opening is that neither Strickland nor Niello represent San Bernardino County and the central committee has not yet moved to make any money in its coffers available to the four incumbent Repub-

licans currently representing San Bernardino County in the California Senate or the four incumbent Republicans representing San Bernardino County in the California Assembly.

When party higher ups were queried during the August 11 meeting as to why the county party was committing to concentrating its financial firepower on assisting politicians outside the county, no reason was

given. No answers

Central committees are allowed to raise money and support political candidates and are not subject to strict limitations as are individuals and corporations and enjoy even fewer restrictions than political action committees, which as collectives, have fewer restrictions than individual donors.

In this case the central committee, prompted to the action by its leader-

ship, is on a trajectory to provide funding to the campaigns of two particular state senators. The action taken by a majority vote of the central committee was to endorse Tony Strickland and Roger Niello, both of whom are individuals of uncommon substance and gravitas with dynamic political backgrounds that have pushed them to the front of the Republican Party in a state domi-

July 12 ruled that Immigration and Customs Enforcement's practice of engaging in "roving patrols" aimed at finding suspected illegal aliens and stopping individuals based on race, language, location and occupation violated the Fourth Amendment's protections against unreasonable searches and seizures and

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State H₂O Resources And Fish & Game Find Invasive Golden Mussel At Lake Silverwood

The Department of Water Resources (DWR), California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW), and California State Parks have confirmed presence of the invasive golden mussel at Pyramid Lake in Los Angeles County and Silverwood Lake in San Bernardino County. These lakes are the southernmost State Wa-

ter Project (SWP) reservoirs where golden mussels have been detected. The invasive species was recently discovered during a routine water test by DWR; in response, State Parks has updated Silverwood Lake's boat inspection protocols, effective immediately. Pyramid Lake, which is managed by DWR, implemented exit in-

spections following the discovery of quagga mussels in 2016.

The golden mussel, native to China and Southeast Asia, was initially detected in the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta and O'Neill Forebay in October 2024 and has subsequently spread south. This small freshwater bivalve is known for its rapid reproduction

and ability to clog water infrastructures, disrupt ecosystems, and out-compete native species. These invasive mussels can also cause significant damage to boats by attaching to hulls and clogging engines, leading to increased costs for boaters and other motorized vessel owners. Currently, there are no effective methods to treat

or eliminate the golden mussel from infested waterways, making prevention of further spread to non-infested waterways a top priority.

Through a series of coordinated actions with state and local partners, DWR has expanded its activities to protect SWP facilities against this destructive species while maintaining

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California's Top Minority Party Lawmaker Proposes Plan Like Burum's To Neutralize Newsom's Gerrymander

SACRAMENTO (September 10) —The evolving reaction of the contingent of outnumbered Republican officeholders in the state's capital to Governor Gavin Newsom's plan to gerrymander California's political map now includes a proposal to split the state in two.

The concept, to a certain extent, revives a now discarded move by San Bernardino County to break off from California, which the county's voters narrowly approved almost three years ago but which the politicians who sponsored it subsequently rejected as both politically and financially unfeasible when they examined what secession would entail.

Governor Newsom and the Democratic supermajorities in the California State Senate and California Assembly last month approved a \$283 million special election in November to have the state's voters override the map that was put in place in 2021 by the state's non-partisan redistricting commission setting the boundaries for the state's 52 Congressional seats. Already, under that map, the Democrats hold a commanding 44-to-9 lead over the Republicans among the members of the House of Representatives from California.

Earlier this summer, Texas Governor Greg Abbott and the Republican-dominated

rector of the Children Deserve Success Branch at the office of the San Bernardino County Superintendent of Schools, the very position that approves Garnett's consulting contracts.

According to internal documents reviewed in this formal complaint, Garnett's contracts contain unusual "per attendee" fee structures, with revenue splits between Garnett and English's department. Even more troubling, the contracts require San Bernardino County Superintendent of Schools employees to handle all marketing and recruitment for Garnett's private workshops – a potential violation of California Constitution Article XVI, Section 6, which prohibits gifts of public funds.

Upcoming Garnett Workshops (2025-2026) are as follows: September 25, 2025: Discipline Training, February 5, 2026: Student Records, and March 19, 2026: Discipline Training. Registration materials

show these workshops are promoted through official SBCSS channels, with public employees dedicating work time to marketing Garnett's private business.

The insider advantage extends to the next generation. Sherman Garnett Jr. secured a \$900-per-hour consulting contract with Upland Unified School District, where his father serves as a board trustee, a clear conflict of interest that raises serious ethical and legal questions. The arrangement began with a September 25, 2023, email from Garnett Jr. to Shinay Bowman, Upland's Chief Academic Officer, soliciting consulting services. In the email, Garnett Jr. explicitly references working with his father, stating: "For the last couple of years now, I have been working with my father, as we have been doing training for School Staff Administration/Teachers and School Security Officers."

Notably, Bowman's own \$250,000 salary contract had been unanimously approved by the Upland board just months earlier, with Sherman Garnett Sr. casting a supporting vote. This created

an environment where Bowman may have felt pressured to approve the consulting arrangement with the trustee's son.

On October 24, 2023, the Upland board approved Garnett Jr.'s contract during a routine meeting, with the agreement buried in "Certificated Personnel Reports." The contract details were not provided to the board or public; only a brief description of \$1,800 for two one-hour training sessions. Sherman Garnett Sr. abstained from the vote without explanation but did not properly recuse himself from the discussion, a potential violation of conflict-of-interest laws. Less than a week later, Garnett Jr. was featured as a speaker for "Upland University," the district's professional development program.

The October 24, 2023, Upland board meeting revealed another troubling pattern. From his position as board president, Sherman Garnett Sr. used the public forum to promote his private business while publicly thanking two principals who had attended his workshops. According to meeting minutes, Garnett stated, "I run a training academy for student

services administrators, and he extended an invitation for individuals to attend. He was thankful that Mr. Beeson and Mr. McCanne attended." Within months, both principals received coveted administrative promotions.

Chris Beeson was promoted to principal on special assignment/director of purchasing, and Jerry McCanne was promoted to director of human resources.

This mirrors the career trajectory of Don English, who rose to power as a San Bernardino County Superintendent of School division administrator after Garnett's mentorship, ultimately positioning him to approve Garnett's lucrative consulting contracts. The pattern suggests Garnett has systematically created a network of indebted administrators who may feel obligated to provide future favors.

Perhaps the most egregious violation of public transparency laws involves the San Bernardino Countywide Gangs & Drugs Task Force, a San Bernardino County Superintendent of Schools-affiliated entity that appears to be operating in direct

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violation of California's Brown Act. The Task Force, which has operated for over two decades, maintains a website listing only its executive team with no posted agendas, public meeting notices, or opportunities for public comment. This lack of transparency violates California Government Code 54950 et seq., which guarantees the public's right to attend and participate in meetings of local legislative bodies.

The organization's composition reveals multiple conflicts of interest and Leadership Conflicts: Don English: Executive Director (also SBCSS Director approving Garnett contracts),

Sherman Garnett, listed as "community member" with his business name prominently displayed, Dr. Gwen Dowdy-Rodgers, Chair (also President of San Bernardino County Board of Education). Brenda Dowdy, identified as Dowdy-Rodgers' relative, serves as a "citizen-at-large" representative despite being a former San Bernardino County Superintendent of Schools employee who worked for over two decades in Don English's division.

nated by Democrats.

Strickland is a prolific lobbyist and political consultant. Niello is a fabulously wealthy entrepreneur with an expertise and considerable reach in financing. Consequently, there is a perception among members of the San Bernardino County Central Committee that the so-far exclusive arrangements to have the San Bernardino County Republican Central Committee back them is part of a quid pro quo involving the central committee's chairman, Phil Cothran Sr, that might prove problematic for the central commit-

tee down the road if the actual terms of the trade-off, which are currently unknown, are revealed and become subject to wider scrutiny. Cothran in the past has utilized his control over the party apparatus to selectively fund campaigns that were not always in line with what a substantial number or, in some case, what a majority of the central committee's members, favored.

Speculation is rampant at present as to what Cothran is seeking in return for the endorsements and pledging of money to Strickland and Niello.

Some central committee members suggested that what Cothran might be up to is a stroke of political genius. One benefit of the action taken by the central committee at its September 11 meeting,

some suggested, was that Cothran might be securing the services of Strickland's political machine, which includes his Strong America organization, a super political action committee, of which he is president and CEO, to assist a whole host of San Bernardino County's Republican candidates. Cothran might also, some hoped, have been arranging for Niello, whose company, the Niello Company operates multiple dealerships that specialize in high end brands such as Audi, Acura, Jaguar and Porsche, to open his checkbook in the future to the campaigns of San Bernardino County's Republican incumbent officeholders and hopefuls.

There was a countervailing view, nonetheless, that the endorsement of two particular

candidates, in particular ones who are not voted upon by San Bernardino County voters and who do not represent San Bernardino County, was a misuse of the central committee's authority and discretion. Some suggested that the deal was one that was worked out by Cothran for his personal benefit or to advance the fortunes of an isolated set or subset of politicians, including incumbents or hopefuls, he is on good terms with but who are not necessarily favored by the central committee as a whole or officially. There was suspicion among some that the endorsement was part of a quid pro quo, the details of which Cothran and his closely-knit group of supporters were knowledgeable about but which was being kept from the committee's membership. They won-

dered out loud why the central committee was not simply endorsing all of the incumbent Republicans holding state office throughout California or, in the alternative, extending an invitation to those Republicans inclined to address the central committee to assess their positions and vote on whether to endorse them and actively support their candidacies, be they for election or reelection. Some expressed approval of both Strickland and Niello, but questioned by the committee was limiting its endorsement to just them.

A handful of those critical of the proposal by Higgins and Lopez expressed concern that the way in which the endorsement was being limited to Strickland and Niello raised a red flag, indicating that some hid-

den incentive was buried in the arrangement for the endorsement. Taken together with Strickland's long-established reputation for political horsetrading and the multiple examples of Cothran's wheeling and dealing that have proven beneficial to his enclave of political associates and to the detriment of others, including Republicans who were vying for local or state office that were denied GOP support on Cothran's say-so alone, some central committee members expressed the belief that the secrecy/lack of transparency over the motive meant there was certainly something ethically questionable about the endorsements and that the deals in question might have involved something legally questionable as well. This

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Confusion Over Grandson And Grandfather Leads To Brief Kidnapping Scare

Abject panic gave way to relief yesterday afternoon when it turned out that the disappearance of a first grader at Donald F. Bradach Elementary School was not a kidnapping but rather a case of a child mistaking a man there to pick up his grandson as his grandfather and the grandfather similarly misidentifying the 6-year-old boy as his grandson.

As students poured out from the 437-student school following the dismissal bell at 2:25 p.m. on Thursday, September 11, some headed off campus on their own or in small groups to walk homeward, while others hopped on busses. The remainder met with parents or caretakers to return home on foot.

Before 2:30 p.m., a mother who had come to the school, located at 15550 Bellflower Street, grew alarmed that her son was not at their established rendezvous point. She redoubled her efforts to find him. Unsuccessful, she informed school officials her child was gone. A 9-1-1 call was made, and was immediately patched through to the San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department, which serves as the contract law enforcement agency/police department in the City of Adelanto. The dispatch log shows the sheriff's department was called at 2:31 p.m.

The incoming call reported that a 6-year-old student had left the campus with an "unknown male," according to the dispatch log.

Unbeknownst to those at the school and the sheriff's department at that time was that a man, described in a subsequent report as elderly and the grandfather of another boy who attended the school, had come to the Bradach campus at the request of his family to retrieve his grandson that day.

Having arrived prior to the mother of the 6-year-old, the grandfather of the other boy was spotted by the child, who, mistakenly, recognized him as his grandfather. When the first grader greeted him with familiarity, the man, reciprocating the child's mistake, assumed him

employee to over see the company's day-to-day operations. McNiff began with Stater Bros. in 2019, coming in as the president of the board and being promoted by Van Helden to chief operating officer in 2022. Prior to that, he was the president of Albertson/Safeway's Portland division from 2016 until 2019 and the senior vice president of marketing and merchandizing for

Albertson's/Von's/Pavilion from March 2015 until January 2016, the vice president of marketing and merchandising for Albertson's in Southern California from 2013 to 2015 and the Senior vice president of operations of Albertson's at its Fullerton office from 2010 until 2013. He began in management as a store director with Albertsons in Southern California in 1990 after having worked his way up the ladder after starting as bagger/courtesy clerk in 1981.

Van Helden has been the chief executive officer of Stater Bros. since April 2013. He was the

executive vice president of SuperValu prior to that. He previously was employed by Albertson's.

This spring, with widespread concern in the economy about rising prices due to the federal government's levying of tariffs, Van Helden acted to lay off 63 of the company's baggers/courtesy clerks as ongoing contract negotiations with the labor union representing Stater Bros. worker's stalled. Those were the first layoffs in the company's history.

Last month Stater Bros concluded a serious round of negotiations with the United Food

and Commercial Workers, UFCW Local 324, the union that represents its 12,000 workers. On July 25, the company's workers represented by UFCW authorized going on strike, but did not actuate a work stoppage. Stater Bros. made major concessions toward reaching an agreement, and the labor action was officially ended on August 15. The company gave way major ground to the union with regard to higher wages, benefits, pension contributions and job security, all of which were represented as favoring the workers. Questions remain, nonetheless as to the sound-

the Fifth Amendment's guarantee of due process. Judge Frimpong ordered the Trump administration to halt indiscriminate immigration stops and arrests in Los Angeles, Riverside, San Bernardino, Orange, Ventura, Santa Barbara and San Luis Obispo counties.

The Trump Administration, represented by

the U.S. Attorney for the Central District of California, Bilal Essayli and Deputy Assistant Attorney General Yaakov Roth, along with Counsel to the Assistant Attorney General Sean Skedzielewski made an appeal of Judge Frimpong's ruling to the United States Court of Appeals for the 9th Circuit. A panel of three

judges with the 9th Circuit – Judges Marsha S. Berzon, Jennifer Sung and Ronald M. Gould – upheld Judge Frimpong. Thereupon the Trump Administration appealed to the Supreme Court, asking for an expedited ruling on the issue.

By a 6-to-3 margin, The Supreme Court found that Judge Frimpong's conclusion that the agents were engaged in racial profiling in conducting the sweeps was in error and overturned her ruling and that of the

9th Circuit panel that the operations had to be discontinued if the race of, language spoken by, the location of and occupation engaged in by those targeted in the enforcement action formed the basis for stopping them and questioning them with regard to their immigration status.

The American Civil Liberty Union and Public Counsel represented plaintiffs Pedro Vasquez Perdomo, Carlos Alexander Osorto, Isaac Antonio Villegas Molina, Jason

Brian Gavidia and Jorge Luis Hernandez Viramontes in the underlying case, ruled on by Judge Frimpong, which alleged their rights were being violated by conducting the roving patrols and then detaining those who appeared to fit the profile of an unregistered migrant. In seeking to convince the Supreme Court to uphold Judge Frimpong and the 9th Circuit panel, the ACLU argued that the Department of Immigration and Customs Enforcement [ICE] was

involved in a “racist deportation scheme,” which Judge Frimpong and Justices Berzon, Sung and Gould recognized. Public Counsel said striking down Judge Frimpong's order would allow for the resumption of “discriminatory raids across Los Angeles.”

The Trump Administration countered that it was hardly discriminatory that federal agents working in Southern California, where 71 percent of the illegal immi-

Texas legislature in Austin undertook to redraw the Lone Star State's political map, such that in the 2026 midterm election, the 26-to-12 advantage the Republicans hold over the Democrats will be likely to increase to 31-to-7. Abbott, a Re-

publican, and his allies were responding to requests by President Donald Trump's supporters, who are concerned that the slim majorities the GOP enjoys in both the House of Representatives and the U.S. Senate that were established in the 2024 election with President Trump's return to office four years after his 2020 defeat by Joseph Biden might be eroded or lost in 2026. The Texas Republicans

responded by redrafting their state's Congressional District Map such that five Congressional districts currently served by a Democrat had their borders changed. In making those shifts, portions of neighborhoods in those districts which are heavily populated by Democrats were moved into an adjoining district where there are already an overwhelming number of Republicans, and neighbor-

hoods from contiguous districts in which the Republicans greatly outnumber Democrats were brought within that district's borders. This was done in such a way that the strong Republican majority districts from which the Republican voters were imported into the Democratic-leaning districts retained Republican majorities. In this way, Abbott and his Republican cohorts believed the Republicans

stand a realistic chance of picking up five more Congressional seats from Texas alone.

In California, Governor Newsom, as committed to the Democratic cause as Abbott is loyal to Republicanism, is determined to deny, if he can, President Trump the luxury and advantage of having his party hold a majority in the legislative branch of government. Newsom in response to what Abbott achieved

in Texas, set about manipulating California's Congressional map in an unabashedly naked partisan manner, justifying what he and his fellow and sister Democrats in the California Assembly and State Senate were doing by saying they were “fighting fire with fire.”

In California, the Democrats faced a hurdle the Republicans in Texas did not have to

ered in San Bernardino County Superintendent of Schools' internal event scheduling system, reveal systematic violations of the Brown Act. The registration form requires advance registration through a San Bernardino County Superintendent of Schools-controlled portal, demands personal information (name, email, phone, employer/district), defaults to "I currently work for or attend a California school, district, or county office," and forces non-affiliates to select "I do not work for or attend a California school."

These restrictions directly violate Government Code Section 54953, which requires all meetings of legislative bodies to be open and accessible to the public without conditions. Willful violations of the

Brown Act constitute misdemeanor charges, and the restrictions documented here appear to be systematic and ongoing.

The California Attorney General recently held in Opinion No. 22-402 that a similar San Bernardino County Superintendent of Schools-affiliated body – the San Bernardino County District Advocates for Better Schools (SANDABS) was subject to the Brown Act. Yet the Task Force continues to operate outside these legal requirements.

The culture of nepotism begins with County Superintendent Ted Alejandro, who hired his wife, Barbara, in 2012 as "Assistant to the Superintendent." By 2015, she had been promoted to chief of Intergovernmental affairs, reporting directly to her husband.

Barbara Alejandro's compensation grew from approximately \$150,000 to \$220,000 by 2020, with all raises and promotions approved solely by her husband. This ar-

rangement constitutes classic "self-dealing". Ted Alejandro directly benefited from each raise he awarded to his spouse, creating an inherent conflict of interest that may violate both ethical standards and legal requirements for public officials.

This complaint has identified potential violations of several California laws: Brown Act Violations (Government Code 54950 et seq.), systematic exclusion of the public from Task Force meetings, failure to post agendas 72 hours in advance, registration requirements that restrict public access, and lack of public comment opportunities.

This complaint alleges willful violations that constitute misdemeanors, with potential criminal charges for public officials. Courts may award attorney fees to successful plaintiffs. Some of these violations are gift of Public Funds (California Constitution Article XVI, Section 6),

use of San Bernardino County Superintendent of Schools employees to market Garnett's private consulting business, and revenue sharing arrangements between public agencies and private consultants, and excessive consulting rates without competitive bidding.

Article XVI, Section 6 of the State Constitution prohibits the state or any of its political subdivisions from making gifts to private parties. Alleged conflict of interest violations are as follows: Sherman Garnett Sr.'s failure to properly recuse himself from votes involving his son's contract, Gwen Dowdy-Rodgers' dual roles overseeing both San Bernardino County Superintendent of Schools compliance and a San Bernardino County Superintendent of Schools-affiliated entity, and Ted Alejandro's approval of raises and promotions for his spouse.

The systematic nature of these arrangements

may violate California's Political Reform Act, which requires disclosure of financial interests and prohibits public officials from participating in decisions that could financially benefit them or their families.

While exact figures are difficult to calculate the cost to taxpayers and students due to the lack of transparency, conservative estimates suggest these arrangements have cost taxpayers hundreds of thousands of dollars in excessive consulting fees, improper use of public resources, and administrative overhead. More importantly, these conflicts of interest undermine the fundamental mission of public education. When administrators are more concerned with rewarding friends and family than serving students, the entire system suffers.

This specific whistleblower is alleging Institutional Failure. The breadth of these violations raises serious questions about oversight

mechanisms within the office of the San Bernardino County Superintendent of Schools and the broader San Bernardino County government structure. The San Bernardino County Board of Education, charged with overseeing SBCSS operations, appears to have failed in its fundamental duty to ensure legal compliance and fiscal responsibility.

County Auditor Ensen Mason received complaints about these arrangements, but the scope of potential violations appears to extend far beyond what any single complaint could capture. This complaint had recommendations for reform

This investigation suggests several immediate reforms needed to restore public trust. Firstly, an independent investigation: The county district attorney should launch a criminal investigation into potential Brown Act violations and the gift of public funds.

was exacerbated, the *Sentinel* was told, when Cothran, Higgins and Lopez would not answer questions that were directly posed to them at the Thursday night, September 11 committee meeting about why local Republican incumbents were not being endorsed.

Those central committee members, speaking with the *Sentinel*, said they were concerned that a revelation of the details behind the endorsement arrangement could unmask "an outright quid pro quo or quid pro quos" that would capture the interest of the California Fair Political Practices Commission or perhaps the California Attorney General's Offices. "If something like that happens, this could result in fines or penalties for the central com-

mittee and the individuals involved. "Look," said one member of the central committee, "I have nothing against Tony [Strickland]. I admire him. I think the world of what he has done in promoting Republican candidates with his super PAC. Roger [Niello] is exactly what we need in Sacramento. I wish we had a dozen just like him. But neither one of them is in our county. Roger's district is more than 350 miles away. Our focus has to be on local Republicans. If we want to consider all of the incumbent Republican assembly members and senators, maybe invite them in for interviews and vote on whether to endorse them, there is no reason we can't do that. But our focus should be here in San Bernardino County and I don't get why we are concentrating our firepower for two people who aren't representing any of the voters where we live and ignoring the eight Republicans we have in the state legislature and the members of our party who have a chance to

beat the six Democrats from this county who are in Sacramento as we are speaking. When some of us asked why we are supporting these two particular candidates and aren't helping our county's standard bearers, we didn't get an answer."

The committee member said, "What it looks like is Phil [Cothran], who is a deal-maker, made some kind of handshake deal where we are to use the county party to give him [Strickland] \$100,000 to stay in office and what he will get back is some assistance from Strong America for some of Phil's hand-picked candidates. There is no indication of who those candidates are going to be. There is no assurance they will be candidates the whole central committee will get behind."

The central committee member noted that in the past, Cothran had supported certain Republican candidates over other Republican candidates during primary seasons and had also made deals where members of the Repub-

overcome, that being Proposition 20, passed by the state's voters in 2010, which took the drawing of the state's political maps out of the hands of politicians and gave that responsibility to a nonpartisan citizen redistricting commission. Proposition 20 had a provision in it which allows a majority of the California legislature to offer a substitute map to what the commission draws up if the map is submitted to voters statewide for approval.

That is what Newsom did, and on August 21, the California legislature, in both houses of which more than two-thirds of the members are Democrats, voted to place Proposition 50 on a special statewide ballot in November. Proposition 50 asks the voters to approve a redraft of the state's Congressional map. That map was redrawn by Newsom and it essentially alters twelve of the state's Congressional districts in such a way that in five of those where Republicans are now in place, the voter registration numbers that currently favor the GOP will be changed to advantage Democrats. Those five Republican members of Congress — Doug LaMalfa, the Republican incumbent in California's 1st Congressional District, incumbent Republican Repre-

sentative Kevin Kiley in the 3rd Congressional District, incumbent Republican Congressman David Valadao in the 22nd Congressional District, incumbent Republican Representative Ken Calvert in the 41st Congressional District and incumbent Representative Darrell Issa in the 48th Congressional District — will most likely be voted out and their Democratic opponents voted in with the November 2026 election.

California's Republicans were outraged and railed about how unfair it was.

Republican Assembly Leader James Gallagher lamented what Newsom was orchestrating. "No public hearings. No transparency. Complete secrecy," Gallagher said. "Gavin Newsom's Democrat allies are behind closed doors, rigging California's congressional districts so politicians can choose their own voters. These are rigged maps drawn in secret to give Democrat politicians more power. These maps shred the fair, transparent process voters demanded. The independent commission spent months gathering public input, holding 196 public meetings, hearing 3,870 verbal comments and collecting 32,410 written submissions before finalizing the current maps. Democrat politicians are throwing that work in the trash for a rigged scheme cooked up behind closed doors. This is a mockery of democracy. If they can neuter the commission here, they can neuter it anywhere. Californians

should choose their representatives, not the other way around."

Former California Republican Party Chairwoman Jessica Millan Patterson called what was going on a "political power grab"

District 23 State Senator Suzette Martinez Valladares, a Republican, on August 14 stated that she believed that the redistricting mid-decade would "disregard the voters' mandate for a fair and transparent process. Governor Newsom is moving full speed with his politically motivated plan to upend that process with biased lines drawn behind closed doors by politicians and political consultants."

19th District Senator Rosilicie Ochoa Bogh said, "Californians deserve a redistricting process that is fair, transparent, and free from political gamesmanship. Weakening or discarding the independent commission, even temporarily, betrays the trust voters placed in us and undermines the integrity of our democracy."

Assembly Joint Resolution 23 calls for the current California Legislature to consent to the formation of the new state and asks for Congress's consent, which is required under Article IV, Section 3, of the U.S. Constitution.

"The people of inland California have been overlooked for too long," Gallagher said.

The complaint sent to Ensen Mason alleges a broader pattern. The San Bernardino County case is not isolated. Across California, educational oversight bodies have been plagued by similar scandals involving conflicts of interest, nepotism, and misuse of public funds. However, the systematic nature and duration of the problems at the office of the San Bernardino County Superintendent of Schools appear particularly egregious according to the complaint.

an exodus from California was developer Jeff Burum, one of the most prolific donors to Republican politicians and Republican-affiliated political causes in San Bernardino County.

Claiming that San Bernardino County and its cities were not getting their fair share the tax money from Sacramento collected by the state, Burum convinced the San Bernardino County Board of Supervisors to place Measure EE, calling for San Bernardino County to secede from California, on the November 8, 2022 ballot.

On election day, at the county’s precincts and using mail-in ballots, the county’s voters passed Measure EE, calling for San Bernardino County to secede from California, with 212,615 or 50.62 percent of the county’s 420,054 voters in favor

of leaving the Golden State and 207,439 or 49.38 percent remaining as Californians.

Having achieved the consent of San Bernardino County’s voters to form their own state, one which would have encompassed 20,105 square miles or more territory than is contained in the states of New Jersey, Connecticut, Delaware and Rhode Island combined, San Bernardino County officials did not act upon that authority by beginning the deannexation process. After temporizing for more than nine months, in August 2023, the board of supervisors, at a cost of \$192,400, commissioned Blue Sky Consulting Group to do an analysis of what San Bernardino County becoming the 51st State of the Union would actually entail.

While Burum and to a

lesser extent the supervisors that supported him in getting Measure EE on the ballot and passed maintained that San Bernardino County was being given short shrift by the state’s Democrat Party-dominated leadership, the report showed that in actuality, San Bernardino County in the majority of cases has been receiving no less money on average than most other counties in the state and that with respect to a fair number of funding categories, it receives more and sometimes substantially more than other counties. 30 percent over the last four years, this company would not be here today. We have to move that price forward. The second thing we can do, which is what we’ve been doing, is accept the cost increases of the cost of goods, pass along those cost increases to the customers, [and] continue to do that. We’ve given up some items. But if this continues, it’s not going to play well for us. Over time, our sales will decline. We will have fewer customers. We’ll be selling fewer items, which will mean a reduction in hours and will mean layoffs. It’s inevitable if we don’t do something different. A third option is to say, ‘We’ll take the

cost increases on the cost of goods, but rather than passing it along to the customer, let’s hold our prices, let’s not pass it along. That means instead offset that cost increase with a cost-of-operations decrease.” Van Helden referenced labor, electricity, rent of the buildings the company occupies, and fuel as typical costs of operation.

The company was founded by Cleo and Leo Stater in Yucaipa in 1936, is now headquartered in San Bernardino and has has expanded to 171 stores to become the 26th largest grocery-store chain in the United States. Industry insiders suggested that the company is now on the brink of being sold or merged with another chain.

the state government more money for a large number of crucial undertakings than a majority of other counties, according to the statistics Blue Sky cited. In this way, the report severely undercut Burum’s premise that San Bernardino County and its taxpayers are being shortchanged on their “fair share” of state and federal revenue. Blue Sky documented, in an examination of the taxes paid by the county’s resi-

dents and businesses in comparison to those paid by their counterparts elsewhere in the state, that in category after category of spending by the state government, it is San Bernardino County and its residents who have been freeloading at the expense of taxpayers in other counties. In particular, according to Blue Sky, it was entities such as the liberal and Democratic-dominated Santa Clara, San Francisco, San Marin and San Mateo counties, with their average annual household incomes of \$180,000, \$148,000; \$158,000 and \$180,000,

which were subsidizing conservative and Republican-dominated San Bernardino County, with its annual average household income of \$50,000. “Across all sources, over the past three fiscal years, the county has received 9 percent more state funding per person than other counties statewide,” Blue Sky’s 33-page annotated executive summary of its report to the county stated. Blue Sky’s findings essentially shattered the San Bernardino County Board of Supervisors’ and Burum’s dream of having San Bernardino County break off from

California to form its own state as politically and economically unfeasible. As a consequence of the Blue Sky report, San Bernardino County officials have pretty much abandoned the secession effort.

San Bernardino County is the second most populous and economically developed of the 36 inland counties that would comprise the geographically largest of Gallagher’s two proposed states. This would appear to indicate that

tus, the government must have reasonable suspicion that the individual is illegally present in the United States,” Kavanaugh wrote. “Whether an officer has reasonable suspicion depends on the totality of the circumstances. Here, those circumstances include: that there is an extremely high number and percentage of illegal immigrants in the Los Angeles area;

that those individuals tend to gather in certain locations to seek daily work; that those individuals often work in certain kinds of jobs, such as day labor, landscaping, agriculture, and construction that do not require paperwork and are therefore especially attractive to illegal immigrants; and that many of those illegally in the Los Angeles area come from Mexico or Central America and do not speak much English. To be clear, apparent ethnicity alone cannot furnish reasonable sus-

picion; under this court’s case law regarding immigration stops, however, it can be a ‘relevant factor’ when considered along with other salient factors.” Kavanaugh continued, “Under this court’s precedents, not to mention commonsense, those circumstances taken together can constitute at least reasonable suspicion of illegal presence in the United States. Importantly, reasonable suspicion means only that immigration officers may briefly stop the indi-

vidual and inquire about immigration status. If the person is a U. S. citizen or otherwise lawfully in the United States, that individual will be free to go after the brief encounter. Only if the person is illegally in the United States may the stop lead to further immigration proceedings.” While the Supreme Court’s ruling immediately freed the Department of Immigration and Customs Enforcement to resume its operations utilizing the ethnicity, language use, location and

nardino County Central Committee has a business relationship with Strong America or any of the consultancies Strickland controls “that could get the [California] Fair Political Practices Commission involved,” the central committee member said. If the FPPC starts handing out fines, the central committee member said, “It will scare the hell out of the donors we have and inhibit out ability to raise money in the future. That we are consistently able to out-raise the Democrats in this county is or one big advantage. These kind of deals where members of our own party are questioning what we’re doing and why make me very nervous.” That Higgins, who was designated by Co-
